

# By 'Sturmvogel'

In my book, there is no place for mushy sentiment at Mallory Park BP Vintage Race of the Year meetings. Nostalgia and keen admiration however, are on, for it is those who are obviously so closely in tune with such an engaging thing as the racing motor cycle who permit us to enjoy for a few hours the very sight and sound of such a glorious device, in action.

That it is possible to organise such a specialised event under sometimes doubtful Leicestershire skies, and where every soul present is rated as a completely

dedicated enthusiast, is all unique.

Elsewhere in this programme, will be seen the names of those who can rightly possess the unofficial title of First Gentleman of motor cycle sport. Mark, indeed digest the name Woods, Stanley to any enthusiast around 50 or over, winner of ten TTs, and yet whose racing style, so relaxed, prompted racegoers to suggest that he appeared as if he were just dropping down to the nearest pillar box to post a letter. From the Ivan Rhodes stable of potent Velocettes, to be ridden in the actual races by former Hall Green chief Bertie Goodman and son Simon, Stanley will be seen during one of several parades of 'Racing Greats', on the ex works '495', of the type he raced so magnificently during the latter half of the Thirties. If the temporarily indisposed Ivan has found time to instal the famous unit in it's correct spring frame, the picture could not be more complete.

In company with Stanley will be four times World sidecar Champion Eric Oliver, suitably entangled in all the tubes and connections that constitute a Norton racing outfit, while former MGP and Lightweight TT winner Maurice Cann skips along on his famous 1935 350 Norton. Yes, the one with the trim yellow sprint tank, virtually unbeatable at Crystal Palace and Donington in pre-war days. Now the property of Alan Evans, this famous machine is not just gazed upon on a Sunday morning, it is used to very good effect in all Post Vintage road races, and will be raced by

Alan here today.

Several Midlands based birds, have whispered into my ever eager ear that Freddie Frith will be about, although at the time of writing I note that he is not officially listed to ride. It is obviously hoped that this master of style, is going to show that the years have done little to lessen his smooth and yet tigerish approach to road racing. The name of J. O. Cragg, never achieved such a place in the motor cycle Hall of Fame as Freddie, although the name will bring back memories to those enthusiasts who flocked to meetings during the early post-war period. Here was one Moto-Guzzi rider who consistently appeared in the huge fields of Lightweight machines, which were set on more than one occasion to race a genuine 100 miles before that next cigarette. For your pleasure, 250 Guzzi mounted Mr. Cragg will appear again today.

Noting that there will be two sidecar and threewheeler races today, in which the mighty Mick Broom (490 Norton s/c) will pit his skill against the hairy Morgans, one would imagine that Clive Lones, out of circulation for many years, will be loaned an 'M' chassis job for his part in the Grand Parade. We will remember Clive's brilliant performances at Brooklands, and indeed his post-war activities with


500 c.c. racing cars.

The combination of leaping, bucketing vee-twins, and a rider who placed an unlimited overtime clause on an adequate pair of muscles, would just about sum up Ginger Wood's racing career. Ginger is to ride a New Imp today. Will it be one of those glorious 500 c.c. twins, or a fleet quarter litre job . . . In the words of H. H. Asquith, we must 'wait and see'.

A surprise for our younger spectators, who will associate television personality Jon Pertwee, solely with doing deeds in space and time. Not so, gentlemen, I

hasten to add, for Mr. Pertwee was at one time a grass track rider of no mean ability. So look out for number 31 in the Grand Parade.

Mention the name Cecil Sandford to that ever growing band of post-war period enthusiasts, and the talk will be of how the Gloucestershire farmer worked miracles with the Arthur Taylor tuned MOV Velo, and later rode Mk. VIIIs, MV, Mondial and DKW devices. Cecil will be on parade today, Velo mounted, a comparative youngster to eighty years young Angus Maitland, riding one of his own Trump JAP machines. Variety being the very spice of living, the John Griffith inspired Veteran and Belt-Driven Sporting Machine Parade is very much part of today's goings-on, with Nortons, Rudges, TT Triumphs, Douglas, Zenith, P and M, and many others. With 52 entries received, this must be a sure indication that this special event is growing annually in popularity.

And so to the actual racing programme today. One of the most hotly contested battles will be between riders of the calibre of Mick Broom and Chris Williams, both mounted on potent Triumph twins from the Geeson brothers' stable, while London-based John Wilkinson, ever faithful to his fine Nortons, will be expected to split the pair at the first opportunity. It will also be very interesting to see how Bertie Goodman fairs with the mighty 500 Velocette in Event 3, starting at 2 p.m. For Lightweight honours we have Mervyn Stratford with his fleet 250 Rudge, in company with his strongest adversary, Peter Welch on a sister machine.

From sunny St. Leonards on Sea, enthusiast par excellence David Treen has now placed his 1939 Sports BMW, the one with the hairpin valve springs, in the department of exotica. David was running in the BMW, at Silverstone a month or two ago, and we trust that everything is to his satisfaction for the racing today.

Give more than just a passing thought for the type of men who form the very backbone of charactered motor cycle sport. Willie Wilshere for instance, turning out as ever with his faithful 500 c.c. Rudge, and former Donington and MGP rider Nigel Seymour Smith, who, I am prepared to bet, will be bringing his Sunbeam and Manx Norton on the capacious float of his 1,000 Vincent, from Gloucestershire. The sidecar and threewheeler races I have briefly mentioned a little earlier, but would strongly suggest that all eyes should be on the track when Bill Tuer and passenger John Hesketh start their Ernst von Delius stuff, to ensure that the 995 c.c. Morgan, will not be taken by Mick Broom on his Norton outfit without a fight.






