SPECTATOR SAFETY & BEHAVIOUR GUIDELINES

SPECTATORS ARE NOT PERMITTED IN THE FOLLOWING AREAS



PROHIBITED AREAS

No person or vehicle shall during a closure period enter or remain on any area of land specified as a Prohibited Area. The extent of the Prohibited Areas shall be clearly marked and indicated by notices bearing the words 'PROHIBITED AREA'.



RESTRICTED AREAS

No unauthorised person or vehicle shall during a closure period enter or remain on any land specified as a Restricted Area. The extent of the restricted areas shall be clearly marked and indicated by notices bearing the words 'RESTRICTED AREA'.

SPECTATORS ENTERING THESE AREAS MAY RESULT IN THE QUALIFYING OR RACES BEING STOPPED AND MAY ALSO FACE PROSECUTION

WARNING: MOTORSPORT IS DANGEROUS

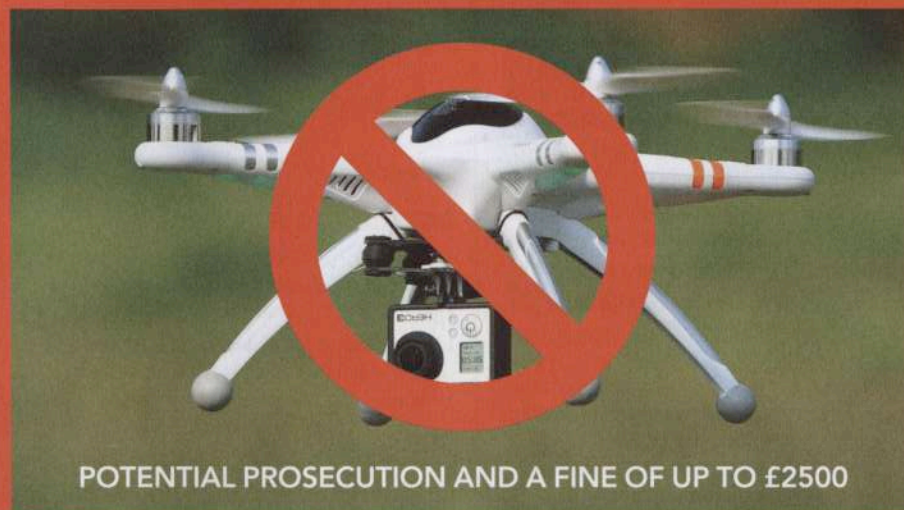
Motorcycle Road Racing is one of the greatest spectator sports in the world. Nowhere do you get as close to the action as you would sitting on a hedge on the Isle of Man surrounded by breathtaking scenery as the world's leading road racers pass you. Motorsport is dangerous and while the organisers recognise that you want to get as close to the action as possible you must follow the rules, listen to the marshals and keep your wits about you at all times. The bikes can reach speeds of up to 200mph and at no point can you go onto the track itself until the passing of the roads open car.

Every year the course is reviewed by leading motorsport figures and spectator viewing areas are altered according to the nature of motorsport. Changes in machinery mean that what has previously been safe may no longer be the case. As a result areas that you may have previously watched from may now be prohibited or restricted. You must respect the marshal's advice and look for an alternative viewing area. With a track stretching over 37 miles you are not short of alternatives!

SPECTATOR SAFETY & BEHAVIOUR GUIDELINES

RESPONSIBILITY OF SPECTATORS

Race spectators have a responsibility to themselves, the marshals and the riders to watch the races in a responsible manner. Any unruly spectators will be dealt with by the police and in order to do so the qualifying or race may have to be stopped. **THE SAFETY OF THE PUBLIC, MARSHALS AND RIDERS WILL NOT BE COMPROMISED.** Please enjoy the event and we look forward to welcoming you back on the Island for many years to come.



NO DRONE ZONE

RESTRICTED AIRSPACE DURING THE FESTIVAL OF MOTORCYCLING

The airspace above the Mountain course can get busy with emergency and filming activity by helicopters, both during and before and after racing or practising takes place. Drones can also pose a serious distraction and threat to riders. Race marshals will immediately report any drones to race control and the police. The unauthorised operation of a drone may result in the practice or race being halted.

The "no-fly" zone covers the area within the Mountain Course plus 1,000 metres outside the course during the times when the road closure is in force. Only authorised drones and aircraft are allowed to enter this airspace below 3,000 ft - that is approximately 1,000 feet above the height of Snaefell Mountain.

It gives me enormous pleasure, in my first year as Chairman of the Manx Motor Cycle Club, to welcome you to the 2018 Manx Grand Prix.

We wish you all - riders, families and supporters, all officials, Marshals and spectators, a safe and enjoyable time at this historic event.

Last year we enjoyed the excellent and close racing we have become accustomed to, with Mikey Evans winning the Junior and Senior Manx Grand Prix – only the third Manxman to do the "Double". We anticipate more exciting racing from this year's competitors, who have been carefully selected from the huge number of entries we receive. We are really sorry that we have had to disappoint so many riders. This year the MMCC have reintroduced a 3 lap Ultra-lightweight race for small capacity machines, to be run concurrently with the Lightweight 4 lap race. Entries for the Ultra-Lightweight have been fewer than desired, but we hope the class will grow in future years.

This year also celebrates the 40th anniversary of the Newcomers Manx Grand Prix. Many of the competitors in these races have gone on to become well known for their racing exploits at the MGP, TT and world championship events. This has become an established route for aspiring road racers.

Guest of Honour

An ex-war department BSA and a boyhood trip to the Isle of Man fired the ambitions of this year's Manx Motor Cycle Club Guest of Honour, 1968 Senior Race winner Frank Whiteway.

For a boy who grew up on a farm in Cumbria, with parents who thought motorcycles were the devil's creation, bikes, racing and the Isle of Man were all an extremely distant prospect. But after his uncle acquired the ancient 350cc side-valve BSA in the 1950s, his imagination was fired.

"I remember going with him to pick it up when it was delivered to the local station, all wrapped up in canvas sheeting," he said. "I think it just triggered a little spark in my mind that motorcycles could be fun. We lived on top of a hill and my friends and I used to take our bicycles to the top and ride down at full pelt to see what time we could do it in - no helmets or protective gear. It's unbelievable we never hurt ourselves"

Later, he remembers going with a schoolfriend's family to the Isle of Man and seeing Bob McIntyre racing. They both watched and said, "we've just got to do that one day", and from that day on, everything was aimed at going back to ride in the Manx.

In fact, his friend made it to the Island first to compete on a Norton in 1963, but the following year was Frank's turn. "I was working for Eddie Crooks' shop in Barrow at the time. Eddie had won the Manx in 1959 so he was supportive. I was his workshop manager and really keen to have a go."



In 1964, he competed on a Tiger Cub - fast enough to learn the course but not quick enough to get into trouble, he said. He remembers doing endless laps, until the engine packed up. Eddie agreed to support him the next year with a Greeves Silverstone production racer.

"It had brilliant speed and power but a weak gearbox. In fact the crank broke on the first lap of the race on the Mountain Mile" he said. "All that work, time and effort, all for nothing. I was on the point of giving up." Then in 1966 along came an imported Suzuki T250 Super Six.

"That was a beautiful bike. Not super fast, but capable of about 90mph. It never missed a beat and I won 11th replica. In the early days it was just fun, but of course by 1967 things had become a bit more serious," Frank commented.

"We got the first of the Suzuki TR250 production racers and I got the fastest practice lap on one at over 90mph." Victory eluded him that year as he had to make a fuel stop on the three-lap race whereas the winner did not. Victory did finally come in 1968.

After his Manx win, 1969 and 1970 were TT years where he

scored a second place in the 1969 Production race and he was also named "best newcomer" that year. "They got a message to us just as we were putting the van on the boat and I had to rush back to the Villa Marina to collect the trophy," he remarked.

In 1970, the win came in the five-lap 500cc Production race. "I just romped home, it turned out to be quite an easy win" he said. The 1970 event claimed several riders' lives, including those of some of his friends, so Frank decided to retire. "I had won a Manx and a TT so I thought it was time to give up," he said.

Frank remains good friends with Eddie Crookes' son Martin, who still runs the same shop in Barrow. He's a keen golfer and is also involved with the Vintage Japanese Motorcycle Club. At 77, he still has several bikes, including a Suzuki Beamish 325 trials bike, a ZX750R Kawasaki and a 1968 T250 Suzuki. For 25 years he lectured engineering before taking early retirement.

Of his years competing in the Island he has mainly fond memories and just a few terrifying ones. "I did fall off at Governor's Bridge one year but I remounted quickly and carried on finishing fifth. I thought I had got away without being noticed then a photograph appeared in one of the magazines of me landing on my head." commented Frank.

Frank still comes over to the Isle of Man from time to time with his wife Dorothy and enjoys an occasional ride around the course. "The Manx Grand Prix is just a marvellous event and long may it continue," he remarked.

MANX GRAND PRIX RIDER'S ASSOCIATION

The 'MGPR' was founded at the Golden Jubilee Manx in 1973 by a group of former riders to foster friendship between MGP riders, past and present.

The association has changed a little in recent times in as much as it no longer hosts a boozy rider's party for competitors as it did in the early days. Attitudes to drinking at events have changed since those days, although the party was timed to give a day to recover, assuming there were no weather delays.

There was also a 'season starter' usually held in March, somewhere in the UK, to bring people together on a social level before the serious business of racing was under way for the year.

I think that costs, the internet and social attitudes have put paid to the traditional ways of keeping in touch with the membership nowadays.

That's not to say that we are not achieving the aims of the original founding fathers of the association. We tend to communicate on our MGPR Facebook page and limit our social events to the Jurby Festival MGPR parade and luncheon in our marquee on the day. We also meet up at our AGM at the 38th Milestone behind the Grandstand on the Thursday evening of race week at 7.30pm.

We make a donation to ensure that riders keep themselves hydrated during racing and practice by funding the free hydration packs which riders find so important to their well being.

The association also makes a presentation to the rider who through

sportsmanship and endeavour, best exemplifies the 'Spirit of the Manx'. Not necessarily the winner, the rider is nominated by the members of the association. The award is sponsored by Celtic Gold of Peel who are very generous in their support. In 2017 the winner was Ron Soar, a long time MGP rider and father of 2015 Senior MGP Winner Andy Soar, who was sadly killed during the 2016 Senior TT. Ron rode the MGP in Andy's memory and was clearly overwhelmed that such an honour should be bestowed upon him by his fellow riders.

We also hold a rider's draw, open to MGPR members who are competing

at this year's races. The prizes are, a return ticket for a van and two people for next year's MGP provided by the IoM Steam Packet and a pair of Metzeler Race tyres provided by Jason Griffiths Motorcycles. So, hopefully our association has evolved into something which the original members would be proud to be associated with. DECADES APART

Sixty years separate the first and most recent locally born riders to achieve Senior/Junior doubles in the Manx Grand Prix. At the 2018 Manx Grand Prix, Mikey Evans achieved the rare feat in what was only his second attempt at the Manx.

He was barely one year old when Brian Venables achieved a similar double in 1994, also racing for Martin Bullock. Before that you have to turn back the clock to 1957 when Alan Holmes became the first Manxman to achieve a historic double in the MGP.

Back in 1957, "Bon" Holmes, son of a Castletown baker, rode Manx Nortons for Manchester dealer and sponsor, Reg Dearden. Having led the previous year's Junior Race until the magenta failed with one lap to go, Holmes had no such issues in 1957 and won by more than two and a half

minutes from Ellis Boyce. Two days later he became the first local to complete the famous double when winning the Senior at a record pace by 2m 15s from Ernie Washer.

That double earned Holmes works Norton rides for the 1958 TT alongside Australian Keith Campbell. Sadly the 350 machine broke a conrod on lap two and a small retaining clip came off the needle in the carburettor on the 500 when briefly holding onto second place behind the MV of John Surtees in the Senior.

Alan's racing career came to an abrupt end four months later when he crashed at Oulton Park fracturing his skull. Now living in a Residential Home in Douglas, 88 year old Alan keeps a keen interest in all things Manx.

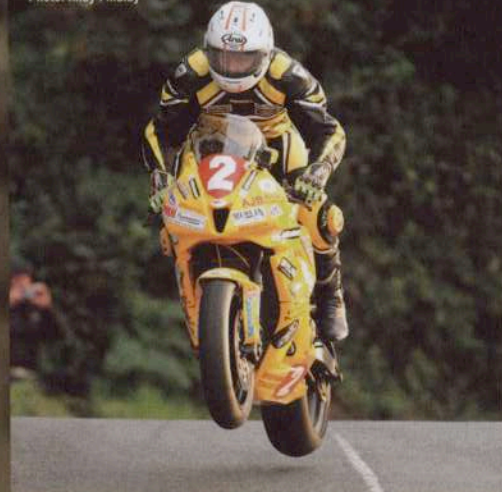

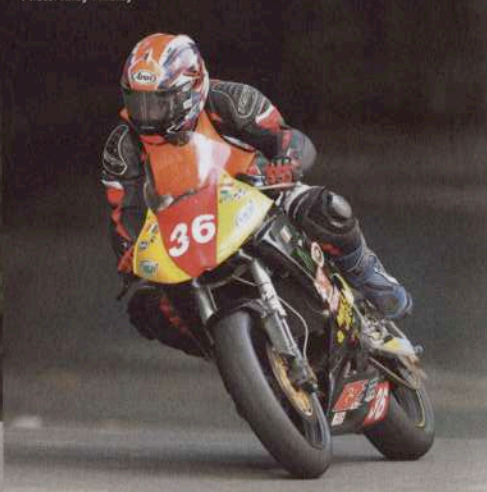

KEEP CALM

Whilst we have absolutely no wish to stop any of you enjoying yourselves, remember our Island is busy with commuters, farm traffic, pedestrians and cyclists going about their daily business and excessive speed or reckless riding or driving is not appropriate. Our message to you is harness your adrenaline!

We hope you have a wonderful experience; the weather is kind and the racing exhilarating. We only ask that you respect our roads, don't take risks, keep calm and stay safe.

ROAD SAFETY

• RIDE SAFE AND TO THE CONDITIONS

It is your responsibility to ride within your capabilities and at a speed suitable for the road conditions. Lift your vision, use your mirrors and think what may be around the next bend. Remember there might be some early leaf-fall causing the roads to become slippery.

• STAY BRIGHT AND STAY SEEN

Keep visible by wearing bright and reflective clothing or accessories, remember to switch on your headlights even in dim conditions. Towards the end of summer there will be longer shadows especially early morning and evenings.

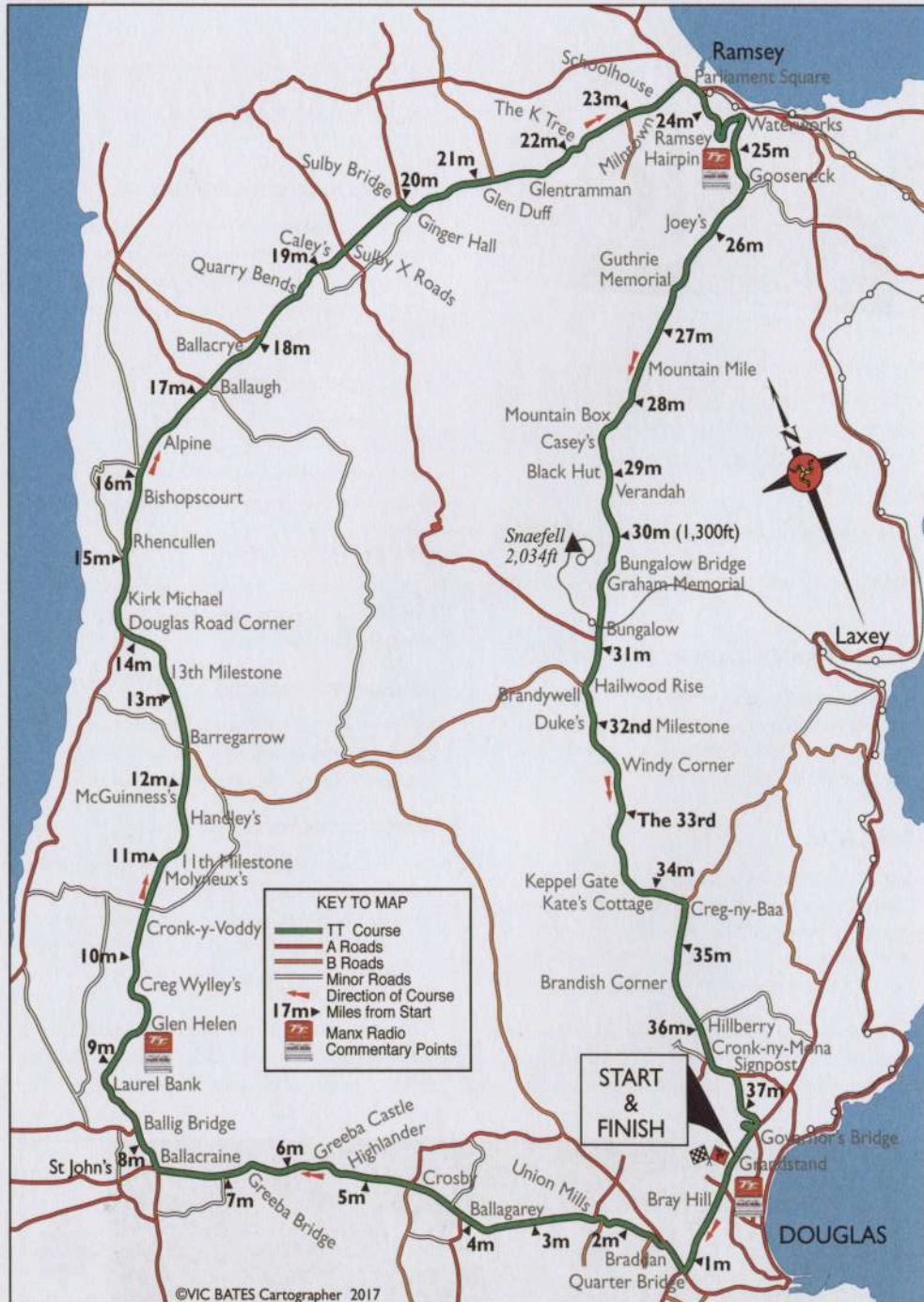
