When the Castle Cup is handed over later it will not only set the seal on some rider's performance today and provide tangible proof of his status in the field of Moto Cross, but it will serve many times in the ensuing year to remind one and another of this occasion. What the trophy cannot convey, however, is the sum of human strain and energy, and the mechanical whip and stress expended and suffered by man and machine alike in filling the places behind the winner. The new line of engraving will add yet another name (or perhaps a repetition) to the formal record as inscribed on the shields, but it will be unable even to hint at the pattern of the race which produced the result it perpetuates. You and I—the spectators—alone will be able to fill in that story and recall, as we saw it, the ebb and flow of challenge, the races within the race, and the sudden and subtle shifts of fortune that produced the order of finishing.

In anticipation we hope the supporting races as well as the major event will produce close finishes to close racing, the whole spiced with that uncertainty which makes motor sport anything but a

foregone conclusion of victory for the best equipped or a dead-heat finish between riders of equal calibre on comparable machines as theory would predict. When today's programme is over we shall probably have seen yet more examples of the upsetting of theory by that capricious element which, from the days of the charioteer in the arena, has made racing what it is and a good race an experience to remember. So on behalf of the Ringwood Club I wish you all an enjoyable day of good races.

But that is not quite all, because from the privileged position of one who sees a bit of both sides of this event there is something I must add. It will not have escaped your notice that this meeting is now Trade Supported and the 500c.c. race carries points towards the A.C.U. Scrambles Star, so that the Hants Grand National has now climbed to new heights and at the same time has become a major problem of organisation. There was a time, twenty five years ago, when it could be managed by an energetic handful of members of the young Ringwood Club, and a few of them are still helping today! But how things have changed. So many people have now become involved that it is difficult to make acknowledgments, but beginning with the Club Officials who with the Committee and Secretary jointly initiate and see through to its conclusion this meeting which you and I enjoy each year, I should add the following; the riders who unfailingly support us, the A.C.U. and Centre Stewards, the Course Marshals from neighbouring clubs, the week-end labour force of our own members who prepared the course and will have to clear it all away when we have gone home, the programme sellers and parking marshals, the faithful St. John Ambulance Brigade, and any section of the public or public authorities whose work is in any way increased by our activities today, especially the Police. Their's today is an unenviable task which we can all do a little to ease by riding or driving away with patience and restraint and with that little extra courtesy which is a measure of mature roadmanship. And at the lowest level may we remind ourselves that Showing Off on the Road, can mean Sawing Off in the Hospital! So please, everyone, Be Careful.

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
