BEFORE THE NEXT RACE

If you are scanning this page to fill in a few minutes before the next event here at Matchams the chances are you are a keen follower of the sport with us on yet another Good Friday to see perhaps your tenth Hants Grand National since the war. If so, we have met before, and we welcome you again as an old friend.

On the other hand you may be a newcomer to motor-cycling, giving us this opportunity of introducing you to a branch of the sporting side. Naturally we are glad to do so because we are always pleased to make new friends, and whether you have left a sparkling new machine in the car-park and self-consciously tucked your new white helmet under your arm, or whether you came on a very second-hand mount, matters not to us so long as it got you here safely and gets you home the same, and you enjoy the part in between. And just how you enjoy this "part in between" is very much our responsibility and concern because we realise that your enjoyment and the impression you carry away will depend to a large extent upon how we do our job.

The first part of that job—all the preliminary organisation, the clerical work, and the course preparation—has been going on for a long time, and our immediate job is to welcome you here and to wish one and all a grand afternoon's sport. And that wish goes for competitors and officials as much as for the rest of us, because we must remember the course officials are giving us their time and the benefit of their long experience, while the greater proportion of the competitors are here in the full knowledge that they cannot hope for more than a spectator's view of the prize money. They are riding, in the truest sense, for sport; for the love of it; for the chance of beating old so-and-so who pipped them last time out; and perhaps, in the case of the younger ones and the newcomers, to test themselves in actual competition and see if they've got what it takes to make a name in Scrambling.

This is not to say those whose name and prestige is already secure have not had to survive the same schooling and go through the Novice Mill. Of course they have, and they have reached the top the hard way so that now they can ride (against yet fiercer competition!) with their sights on the principal award, and look back on the days when they had little to fortify them but sheer determination and perhaps some faith in the slogan: "Today's Novice is Tomorrow's Star". How true *that* is, they have helped to prove.

Turning for a moment to this Scramble, the older hands will remember it in pre-war years when the course was not far from the present one, but on the other side of the Hurn road. In those days Scrambling was essentially an English sport having a definite season which opened, here in the South, with our own Hants Grand National on Good Friday. The post-war years, however, have seen Scrambling hoisted so much in popularity, and the season so extended that Scramble dates now occur right through the Sporting Calendar. Nor is it any longer an essentially English sport for under the name of Moto-Cross it has swept across the Continent from Scandinavia

to the South of France. The set-up has changed too. A Scramble is no longer five or six laps of a pocket trials course, comfortably steered by a relaxed organisation. A major Scramble today requires planning and co-ordination approaching the standards of slick commercialised sport, while the racing itself, fed by the supply of ever more potent and efficient machinery, has become the most fiercely contested racing at speeds which are truly frightening.

Remember that as you watch today, and remember, too, the true nature of this spare-time occupation! It is just about the most punishing, searching, frame and muscle pulping test that man and machine can face. Its English name of Scrambling is fairly expressive, but seriously under-rates it; the Continental term of Moto Cross goes no farther; and so it is the name the Americans give to their nearest equivalent that gets nearest the mark. Theirs is not so much a race as a long-timed trial, and they call it an Enduro. But label it how you will, to finish a Scramble in good health and fair repair, without being lapped, scrapped or snapped, or have the leaders of the next race close behind saying "Excuse me!", you've got to have what it takes, and then some.

And now the riders will be coming to the line for the next race, so settle down to enjoy the Scramble.

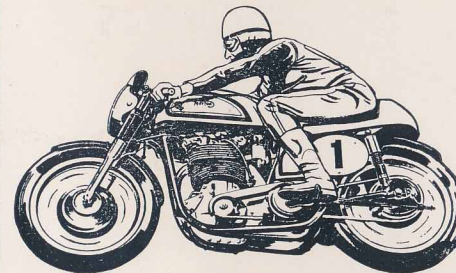
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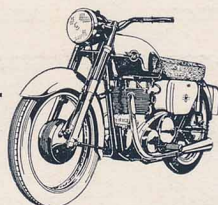
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
