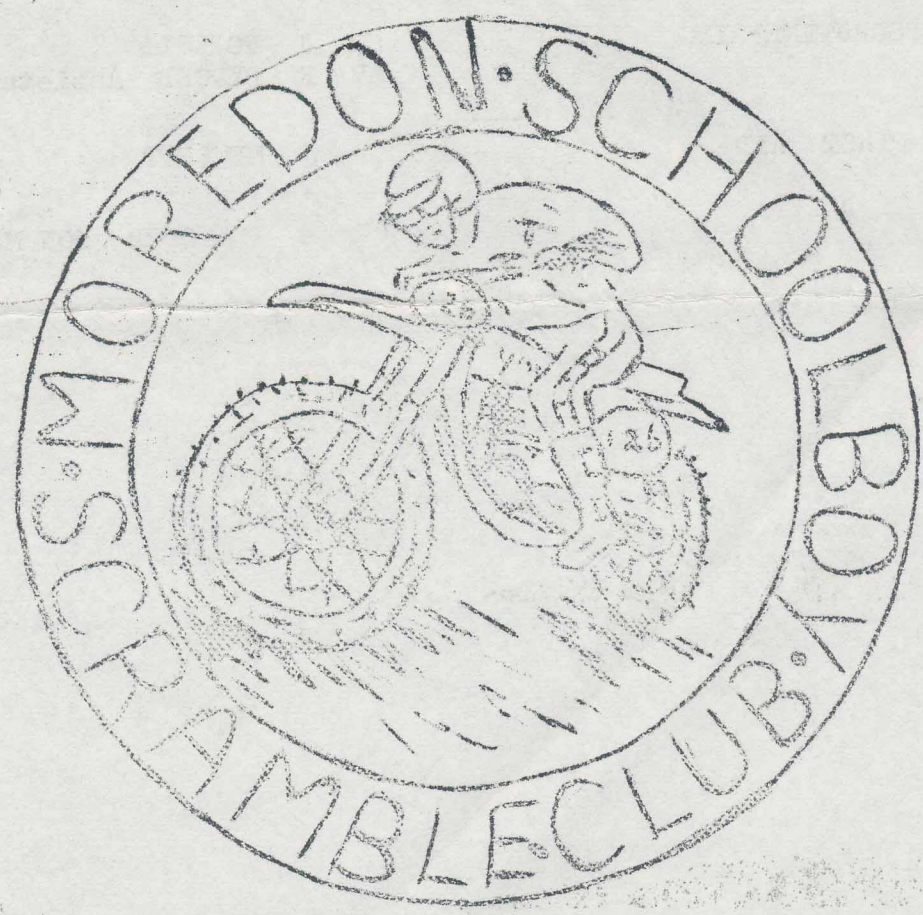

MARSHALLING

For the benefit of our new members, and also to remind some of our old members that it is the rule of the club that each riding member must have a responsible adult present at each meeting. The main reason being that the meeting must have safety marshalls positioned around the course to assist in the safe running of the meeting. Since the maximum membership of 80 riders is anticipated, take out the committee and members who help to put up the courses on the Sat before the meeting, it must be realised that parents can be expected to marshall in either the first or second half of each meeting. The members of the committee all have specific jobs during the whole meeting ie, Starter, Lap Scoring, Clerk of Course, etc and therefore not allocated the duties of marshal.

If possible two marshalls are allocated to each point, but it may happen that you will be on your own. The marshalls are responsible for the course from his/her point, to the next marshalling point, and the object is to warn riders of any hazard in your section. Should any rider stop, dismount, or fall off, the Yellow Flag must be held out immediately, and must stay out until the course is clear. If a second marshal is present he may assist in clearing the track but the first priority is to warn other riders.

The Red Flag is used to stop the race and is initiated by either the starter or Chief Marshal.

The Blue Flag is used to indicate that First Aid assistance is required and when used is held above the head.

If it is necessary to work on your sons bike, and you are on your own please get someone to relieve you at the marshalling point, and ensure that they are briefed on what to do. If this is not possible, do not leave your position until the completion of the race and then advise the Chief Marshal who will endeavour to find a replacement.

At the end of the race the Yellow Flags are used to signify to the Chief Marshal that the section you are covering is clear, if however there is still a rider on the course or it is necessary to repair the tapes the Red Flag should be raised. Only when all the marshalls have indicated by means of the Yellow Flags, that the sections are clear will the Chief Marshal permit the next race to start. This being done by the means of a Green Flag, indicating to the Starter that the course is clear.

RIDERS

At this point I think it appropriate that riders are also reminded of what the Flags mean to them.

RED FLAG, Stop and do not pass the Flag, return to starting area.

YELLOW FLAG, Hazard ahead exercise caution, No overtaking in that section.

YELLOW WITH BLACK DIAGONALS, Last Lap.

BLACK AND WHITE CHEQUERED, End of Race.

Failure to obey the Flags will result in disqualification and any other punishment as decided by the Committee.
