Dear Members,

We have now completed eight championship meetings, and you will see on the following pages that there are some very close placings. This is mostly due to the very competitive racing, and some of our newer members gaining experience as the Season has progressed, thereby obtaining better placings. I feel sure all parents will agree with me when I say how well the boys are riding, - sorry, and Tracey.

A more serious matter which needs mentioning is the deterioration in the standard of some of the marshalling. I have seen, and had reported to me, cases where marshals are content to watch the racing and not to ensure their section of the track is clear. There have been instances where riders have come off their machines and been trapped by a leg underneath unable to get up, while marshals have been stood looking in the opposite direction watching racing. This is NOT good enough, the marshal points are placed as strategically as is possible, firstly to warn other riders, with the yellow flag, that there is an obstruction on the course, and secondly where possible to go to the assistance of the riders in trouble. Without correct marshalling we cannot race.

A few words for riders. After the accident at Hillmarton in which Paul James No.28 Seniors was injured, the Chief Marshal, Mr. Foxwell, stood in the middle of the track waving a RED flag - which means STOP - yet I saw several boys ride past him. This is strictly against the rules and could cause a more serious accident. We do not use the red flag unnecessarily.

Another thing which needs mentioning is the speed at which some boys are riding through the pits and in the off course areas; I have had to speak to several members particularly in two cases to boys who I saw on a "wheelia;" through the pit. I understand other members of the Committee have admonished riders for high speeds off the course. I would remind you all, you can be banned from riding for the whole day for this, so remember you have been warned.

I am sure everyone is pleased to see Paul James is making a speedy recovery and we all wish him well.

The result of the ballot for B.S.M.A. or A.C.U. affiliation was 50 for B.S.M.A. and 1 for A.C.U. which is 98% in favour of B.S.M.A. We have now been accepted as a member club of the B.S.M.A. and although it is late in this Season, we can hope to take a more active part next Season.

Finally I would like to take this opportunity on behalf of the whole club to thank Mr. Smart No.6 and Mr. Stoneham No.37 for the excellent work they carried out on the approach road and entrance to the Foxham track.

RIDER REMINDER

At recent meetings the practice of riding aimlessly around the field or pits area, while not racing is increasing, this can be very unsafe or even dangerous.

If the Farmer or Landowner comes to watch our meeting it gives a bad impression when a dozen or so boys are doing wheelies etc. like a swarm of bees, and riders may be distracted by oncoming bikes moving outside but close to the tapes, also people walking or sat around the course are off their guard.

We have club rules to cover this but no one wishes to keep telling riders something which for their own benefit should be adhered to.

Bikes should go from pits to collecting area for the start at walking pace, and after racing back to the pits at walking pace (this is the speed poor old dads trudge back to the car at the end of the meetings, no bionic legs please).

To finish on a happier note, at least all riders were wearing helmets and most had gloves on.

So please, no joy riding and helmets, jerseys and gloves all the time you are riding and help to keep our scrambling as safe as possible.
