

MOTOR CYCLE NEWS

SIDECARS defy engineering logic. Sidecar drivers are extroverts who get a kick out of wrestling these curious contraptions. And sidecar passengers are devils for punishment who must either be very brave or solid ivory from the neck up!

Get a crowd of them to race on rough ground and you have one of the most entertaining and spectacular forms of motor cycle madness under the sun. The game is sidecar cross. And it takes superb teamwork between driver and passenger to do it well.

When the Federation Internationale Motocycliste decided to encourage these conjurers on three wheels, last year, they introduced a 750 c.c. European Moto Cross Sidecar Championship, with rounds in different countries.

But British interest was luke warm. Our curiosity was excited by the courageous sorties of Nick Thompson, and his partner Dave Beavis, who finished second to a Dutch crew in the FIM's cinderella series.

Continental crowds applauded the innovation. And Holland cheered a national hero when Rikus Lubbers became the first to win the new title. But a British round? Oh no! The Auto Cycle Union didn't want to know.

Now, thanks to the initiative and enthusiasm of Newbury and District Motor Club, we are about to witness the explosion of the myth that British organisers, and the ACU, are a bunch of stick-in-the-muds.

Sidecar cross is here! The Newbury club celebrates its 50th anniversary by staging its very first international meeting and the first British round of a booming championship.

A landmark in the club's history of successful promotions, which include the Battle of Newbury and the Berkshire Moto Cross, today's event has even greater significance for Britain's bike industry.

The professional dedication of Continental competitors may have overpowered our chaps, as in the 250 c.c. and 500 c.c. solo World Moto Cross Championships, but sidecar cross is the sole remaining branch of motor cycle sport in which British machines still reign supreme.

The 750 c.c. twin cylinder Norton Commando engine has become the dominant power pack. And the Wasp frame, which Mike Guilford helps to design and manufacture, has a virtual monopoly in the chassis business.

Today's British "grand prix," backed by the most generous prize money in the series, brings many new faces to the Fox and Hounds circuit, where bulldozers have been busy for this gala occasion.

Twelve tough foreign crews confront five of Britain's best exponents. Only the Russians, who withdrew after contesting early rounds, are missing from the top ten in the championship points.

Ton Van Heugten, a Dutch carpet maker from a large family of motor cycle fanatics, leads after six rounds. But he has yet to chalk up a win, his consistant run of second and third placings being marred by a crash in Denmark.

Robert Grogg is the Swiss who threatens to sweep Holland's magic carpet. With two wins, and a second, he is already tipped as the favourite for the 1972 championship.

New names, new faces, new machines. Watch out for the potent Kawasaki raced by Belgium's Alois De Kort. It develops so much power that it has been known to rip the sprocket off the rear hub!

Most exciting outfit is Nick Thompson's three-cylinder Triumph which made its debut here, earlier this year. Though he has not enjoyed the best of luck, abroad, he'll be out to win.

Mike Guilford, the only driver who has scored in every round to date, is currently sixth in the series after a flying stone knocked the wind out of his sails in France.


