

Grogg heading for a second title — by Peter Howdle of Motor Cycle News today's seventh round of the FIM's sidecar-cross championship is the only international motor cycling grand prix to be staged by Great Britain in 1973. And if it lives up to last year's precedent, the action will be terrific.

Sponsored by the Courage brewery, who have the distinction of refreshing customers at the only pub at the entrance to a moto cross circuit in the UK, the Newbury classic has attracted the top contonders for the title

attracted the top contenders for the title.

Robert Grogg, a 24 year-old Swiss truck driver who won the championship last year, after being forced to quit here when his passenger was hurt, appears to be heading for his second title on his all-British Norton-Wasp sidecar outfit.

Lorenz Haller, a farmer of 29, is his most dangerous rival, even if he does exceed his quota in the Fox and Hounds as he did last year! Also from Switzerland, he races a four-cylinder Honda in one of the Wasp frames which, with the exception of a few Russian and home-brewed plots, dominate this rugged sport.

John Elliott, 31, has more than justified the sponsorship of Wasp contructor Robin Rhind-Tutt. He is currently third in the title hunt and has high hopes of a home victory with an engine prepared by the Norton factory.

The predominance of Wasp chassis is offset by a variety of power units. Ex-champion Rikus Lubbers, the Dutchman who won here in 1972, has switched from Norton to Yamaha.

Alois de Kort, from Belgium, has a unique technique for steering his screaming Kawasaki three-cylinder two-stroke. When he comes to right hand corners, he grabs the twistgrip with both hands and heaves his outfit round.

Teddy Stromberg, of Sweden, is another Kawasaki convert. To tame the fierce acceleration of his engine, he has an electron front wheel fitted with a disc brake.

Although the Russians and their Ural outfits are not here, Gunther Steenbock, of West Germany, brings a BMW flat twin to the line.

Appropriately, since chief organiser Dave Joyce is sales manager of AJS, a member of the Norton-Villiers group, all four British challengers have Norton engines.

John Turner, the reigning British champion, renews his feud with Nick Thompson, who is currently 13th in the European title contest.


Kim Logan, spectacular winner of the second round of the British championship, completes a hopeful home squad.

Unlike the 250 c.c. and 500 c.c. world moto cross contests, in which championship points are now awarded to the first ten in each race, the sidecar series is based on an overall result, obtained by the addition of places and settling ties on time.

Failure of the FIM to make this clear at the start of the season caused considerable confusion. Several organisers adopted the new solo method, and forgot about the traditional arithmetic of moto cross. When the misunderstanding was clarified, Sweden was unable to work out a full overall result. Their timekeepers had only kept tabs on the top ten in each race. This was enough to make Elliott second overall, with a total time 14 seconds faster than Broer Dirks who, in turn, was two seconds faster than Lubbers. A problem arose when it was found that three more riders tied on moto cross points. By the addition of places, Karl-Ake Mansson (5th and 15th), Jan Ten Thye (11th and 9th) and Anatoly Sibertsev (8th and 12th) all totalled 20 points.

With insufficient times to resolve the triple tie, the Swedish federation awarded two championship points (normally given for eight place overall) to each of the three men. The accompanying table (Page 11) shows the current championship positions. To bring the chart up to date, you simply add the championship points scored today, with 15 to the winner, followed by 12, 10, 8, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2, 1.

Have a good time. And don't forget to quench your thirst! You might even find the winner in the bar!


