



# A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE "BATTLES OF NEWBURY"

In 1643, during the Civil War, the Earl of Essex, having relieved Gloucester, was marching the Parliamentary army via Hungerford towards Reading. The Royalists under King Charles, with Prince Rupert in charge of the cavalry, after a forced march, engaged them on the western outskirts of our town. A very bloody, but nevertheless inconclusive, battle, which commenced at 7 a.m. on September 20th, was the outcome and, after running short of ammunition, the King withdrew his forces to Oxford. Present day reminders of this encounter are the Falkland memorial and the name of the battle ground: Wash Common, reputed to have been named that day because the ground was awash with blood.

Just over one year later, on October 27th to be precise, the King and his forces were engaged in the second Battle of Newbury, as they returned from Cornwall. Although soundly defeated by the Earl of Manchester, the Royalists were allowed to escape, much to the annoyance of Oliver Cromwell. This time we can observe a very fine memorial: the nearby Donnington Castle, visible from the top of our circuit. Unfortunately only the Gatehouse still stands. Until recently, thanks to the attentions of vandals, this was in a very sorry state for many years. However, having been extensively restored, by the Ministry of Public Buildings and Works, it is now a protected ancient monument, well worth a visit some time. Details of the plan of battle that day are none too clear, but with a little imagination, one can visualise our scrambles circuit making an ideal base camp for one of the opposing armies, even if it was never the scene of mortal combat. Hence its suitability as a site for the current series of "Battles of Newbury."

Three centuries and more were to pass before enthusiastic Motor Club secretary, Dave Joyce (known as Berkshire's own "Mr. Moto-cross") decided it was time the title was brought into use again to designate an annual series of contests. Although we all hoped no blood would be spilled, club members have tried to make these as colourful and long-to-be-remembered as their illustrious forerunners. The first scramble to bear the name took place about two miles North West of where you now stand, on Mr. Marshall's farm at Winterbourne. On March 11th A.D. 1962, the victor, although claiming no royal blood, but surely a Prince amongst riders, was Ken Heanes, from Fleet, better known today as one of Britain's best six-days trialists. Mounted on his usual trusty triumph charger, to me Ken looked every inch a Royalist.

March 10th next year saw a shift of battlefield to Hartshill copse, about four miles to the east, by kind permission of trials enthusiast Ron Amey. This time the very popular Vic Eastwood was the winner, riding a fiery steed from Plumstead. Surely a good Parliamentarian!

Again at Cold Ash in 1964, and young Roger Snoad came out on top after some very close in-fighting amongst the scrubland. A light-weight mount from Thundersley carried him to victory. Number two to the Roundheads?

Next year our big break-through came. Squire Fairhurst, since elected club President, gave permission for us to use the "Fox and Hounds" course for the first time — a very popular move with both contestants and spectators alike. Especially the latter, as now they could view the fighting much more closely and there was ample room for their own 'horses' to 'graze'. This time Joe Johnson, from Oxford, proved top dog, using a mount with the French sounding name of "Metisse". So a foreign mercenary at last comes to the fore!

The two leg Moto-cross for 500c.c. machines in 1966 made that dour but determined Yorkshire fighter, Arthur Lampkin (B.S.A. Victor) the winner. The "Laughing Cavalier" in disguise? I wonder?

In 1967 we offered a larger sack of gold than ever before for a similar contest in this country. Past winners Eastwood and Snoad bid again for top honours, but had to concede victory, as had many other strong contenders, to the redoubtable Alan Clough riding a Swedish Husqvarna. So now a Norseman is triumphant at the Battle of Newbury!

The following year, no less than three previous title holders came to the line, but this time Clough and Snoad were no match for the Birmingham bred four strokes of Eastwood and John Banks. In fact one could say that Victor was the victor on his (B.S.A.) Victor! The only double winner so far.

Last year an entirely new sporting course was carved out of Mr. Fairhurst's property, extending the circuit northwards and including another spectacular pit. Prize money remained at its usual high level, despite further pieces of eight being offered to induce the Belgian Champion, Marcel Wiertz, and that highly rated Swede, Jan Johansson to take part. Clough and Snoad returned for yet another try. However once again the potent B.S.A's of Keith Hickman, yet another Oxfordian, and that master tactitian, Jeff Smith (since honoured with an M.B.E.) triumphed, in that order, with the Swedish mercenary third. Another Royalist coup.

And so we arrive at March 8th, 1970. This time "Clerk of Battle", Dave Joyce has really excelled himself by mustering a magnificent field, including the 250c.c. Champion of the World, none other than the mercurial Belgian, Joel Robert (Suzuki). Also Swedish champion, Bengt Arne Bonn, riding an A.J.S. from Andover. Coming from nearer home we have the British 500c.c. champion, John Banks (B.S.A.) and the native 250c.c. champion, "Wild" Wade (Greeves). Then there is Scots champion, Jimmy Aird, besides last year's victor Keith Hickman, mounted respectively on C.Z. and works B.S.A. machines. Could this be the year of victory for a foreigner for the first time, the first win in this country for a Japanese mount, or will Big John from Suffolk yet again take his big 'valver' to victory? These are questions you will be able to answer as soon as I will, so take up your favourite positions, battle is about to be joined. But I am sure of one thing — this should be the most closely fought contest we have yet seen at Newbury.

I wonder if you have ever thought that we should erect our own Donnington Castles and Falkland Memorials in commemoration of the "Battles" of the 60s? Well, we have — I ask you but to take a look at the homes for the less fortunate members of the younger generation run by the "Church of England" Children's Society. Their nearest is at Cold Ash, fairly near our past scrambles course. Similarly observe the "Mary Hare Grammar School for the Deaf", which is the large block of buildings you can see just across the main Oxford road from our present circuit. Much of the profits from our past meetings (we hold two other large scrambles per annum besides the "Battle of Newbury") has gone to support these admirable organisations.

Our grateful thanks are due to the well known monthly magazine "Motor Cyclist Illustrated" for sponsoring our meeting here todays. Also to those firms who have taken advertising space in this souvenir programme, given cash in return for the display of banners or otherwise provided prizes.

Thank you for your support, Mr. and Mrs. Spectator, long may it continue. Enjoy an excellent day's sport amid the lovely Berkshire countryside and mind how you go on the way home.




