

1972 SPEEDWAY CHAMPIONSHIP OF THE WORLD

Rye House — known as the training track of many star riders — staged a Division One Preliminary Round of the Speedway Championship of the World, and included in the line-up was Newport's Ronnie Genz.

Of the better known riders also competing were Kings Lynn's new sensation Bob Humphrys, and Barry Crowson; Oxford's Rick Timmo and Norman Strachan, whilst Poole's representatives were Mike Cake and Frank Shuter, Swindon's James Bond, Exeter's Phil Woodcock, and Hackney's Dave Kennett.

Young Kennett was the star of the meeting with some magnificent riding to haul a 15 point maximum. Eight riders could qualify from this round (the other being held at the new non-league track Barrow, on the 27th April).

Qualifying from this round however, was: Dave Kennett 15 pts., Bob Humphrys, Kings Lynn 12 pts., Barry Crowson, Kings Lynn and Rick Timmo Oxford 11 pts., Alan Sage, Ipswich 10 pts., Ronnie Genz, Newport and Mike Cake, Poole 9 pts., Frank Shuter, Poole 8 pts., James Bond, Swindon 7 pts.

These eight riders now go forward to the first round proper and will be joined by the eight qualifiers from Barrow plus the two top scorers from the three Division Two riders' rounds at Canterbury, Peterborough and Workington.

Canterbury held their round last Saturday and the two qualifiers were Bob Young of Rayleigh who tied with 14 points against Malcolm Ballard of Eastbourne, but a run-off had to be held to decide who received the Sunday Mirror plaque, and it was the Rayleigh man who won the run-off.
