



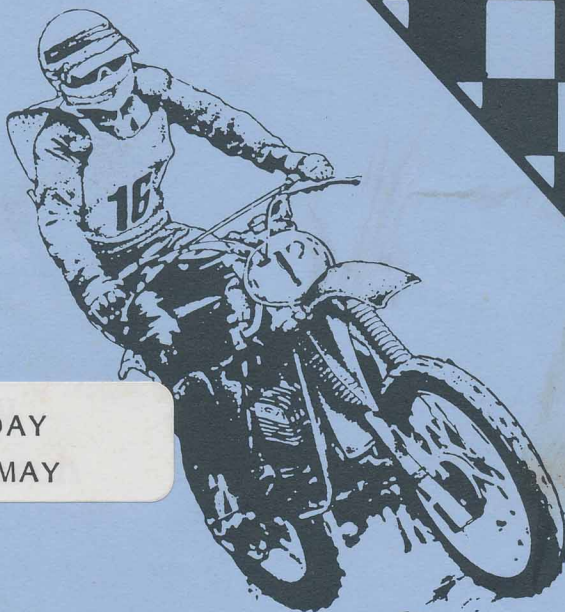

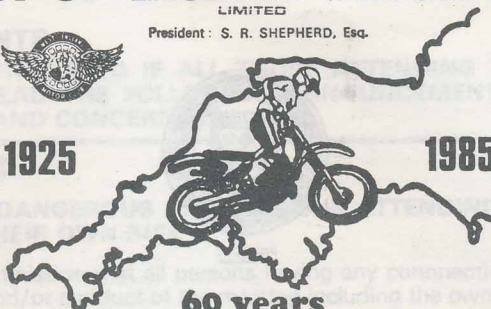

Foreword

Welcome to Whiteway Barton for the Forty-fourth Patchquick Motocross. 1985 is a somewhat special year for the West of England Motor Club as it celebrates its Diamond Jubilee having been formed in Exeter on the 1st February, 1925. It is fitting that Stan Shepherd, one of the founder members of the Club, and President for a number of years should be presenting the Club's "pride and joy" today.

Just who will win the sport's largest Trophy today? Favourite must be Dave Thorpe (Honda) winner of no fewer than eight Patchquick races from nine starts on this track. The current British 500 c.c. Champion was runner-up in last year's meeting after a second leg crash dropped him down the field from first to fourth.

One of the contenders must be last year's victor, Jeremy Whatley, who gave Suzuki their first win in the competition. Now riding a Kawasaki, Whatley, will be out to hold onto the Patchquick title for a further year.

Similarly mounted, Dave Watson, has been a consistent performer on the Whiteway track. Watson has never won the meeting although he came close way back in 1980 when he and Vic Allan tied on overall points. Victory went to Allan who was 21.8 seconds quicker than the Gloucester based Irishman in the three races.

Like Thorpe, Bristolian, Neil Hudson (Honda) has two previous Patchquick victories under his belt. The last on a Yamaha back in 1981 at the very muddy meeting at Rocombe. Later that year Hudson went on to clinch the World 250 c.c. Championship and just twelve months later Neil raced to his first British title win. Incidentally Hudson's 1976 Patchquick win was his very first National victory.

Other leading contenders include Willie Simpson back on Husqvarna this year after a season on Suzuki which netted him fifth in the British 500 c.c. Championships. Simpson represents perhaps the strongest challenge to prevent another win by a Japanese manufacturer. Andy Nicholls, winner of the British 250 c.c. Grand Prix at Newbury last June, and would no doubt like to get the 1985 off to a good start with a win for his new employers, Yamaha. Team-mate, Roger Harvey, the oldest man in the race can never be discounted nor can hard-riding, Brett Steele, who was prematurely sidelined in last year's event by a practice injury. Perry Leask and Steve Beamish (both Suzuki) have never put in their best performances and will be looking to improve on them. Watch too Paul Hunt who rode the 125 Cagiva very well last season.

For the local spectator this year three "locals" get an opportunity to take on the might of British Motocross. I suppose only one can be really described as "local" and that is Liskeard's Ian Bettison, winner of the South Devon Motocross last year. Both Cameron Knox (Honda) and David Drake (Yamaha) are "imports" from Scotland and the West Midlands respectively. None the less we wish them all good luck today.

To all the spectators we hope that you will enjoy your day's sport. If the quality of racing is half as good as that of the past three years you won't go home disappointed.

To all the competitors thank you for supporting the Club today with your entry. We hope you will enjoy your day in Devon with us and that you will have a successful and safe day's racing.

An event like this one needs the help of many people before it can ever take place. It is not possible to name each and every one of you but "thank you" to everyone who has contributed in some way to the promotion of this meeting.

Finally, may I remind you of the very next Motocross meeting in the South-Western Centre. That is on Easter Monday here at Whiteway Barton. First race for the Newton Abbot Motors Ford Trophy is at 2.30 p.m.

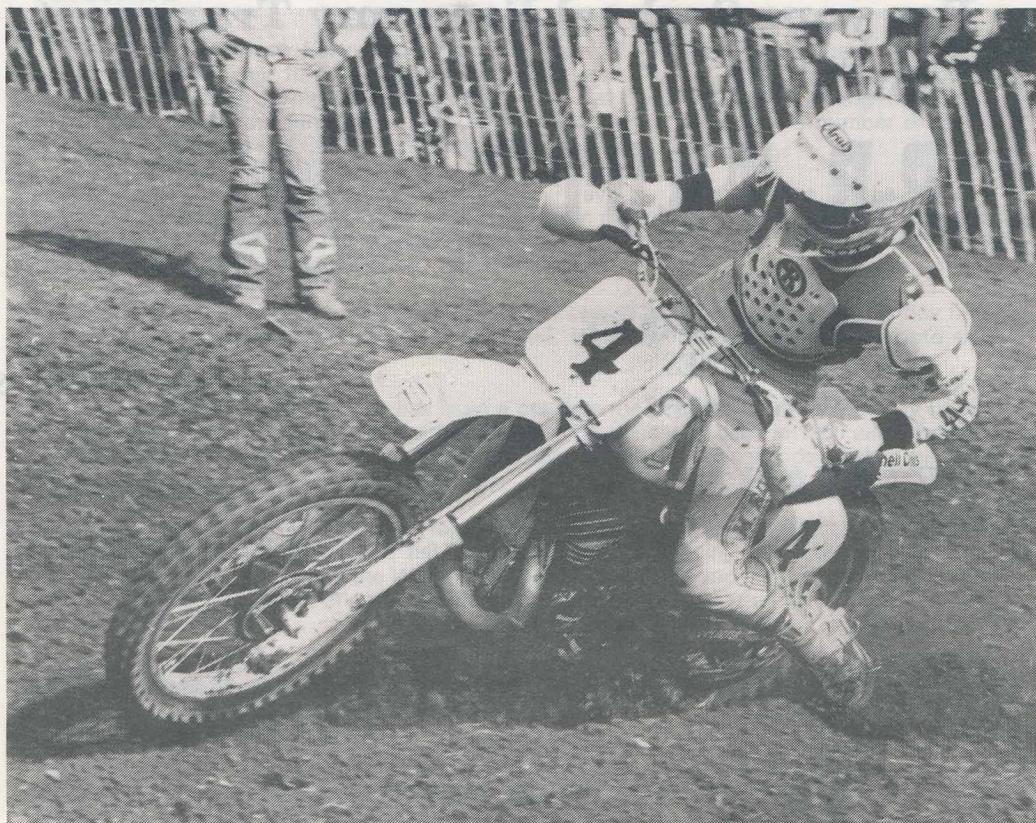

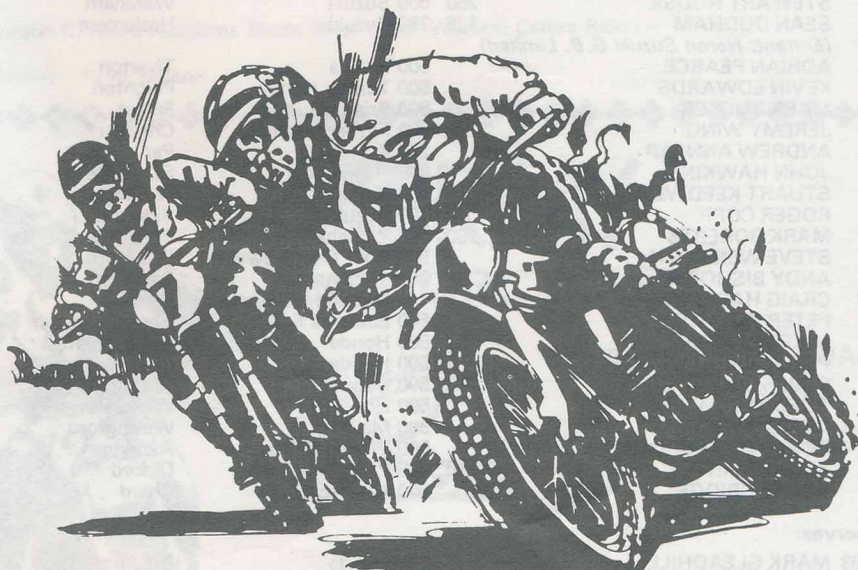
