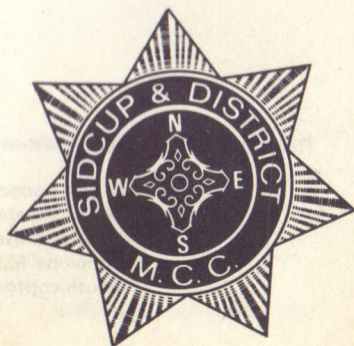

LOFTY LUCAS

Our man at the mike today as always at Sidcup events is R. F. "Lofty" Lucas. Born 41 years ago at Dagenham, Essex, Lofty now lives and works in Chelmsford. He travels not only to our meetings but to a rapidly growing demand to hear his voice as far afield as the Southern Centre. I think we have all come to respect his immense knowledge of the riders, their bikes and jobs, which is only gained by the constant restocking of his particulars file. It seems to make the meeting more interesting when the commentator is genuinely interested and just as excited about the race as ourselves, it certainly makes a change from the morbid voices that waft around certain meetings — no names mentioned.

Lofty became interested in two wheels originally as a pedal cyclist covering some 15,000 to 20,000 miles a year on a bike. In fact he rode to work in the City every day from Romford. His interest in motorcycling stems from spectating, never actually having ridden a bike regularly, he is a fanatic supporter of the sport. He has been the Scramble Secretary of the Chelmsford Club for the past three years, and is in fact the originator of the successful "Chelmsford" Style Scramble Meetings where the riders help to run the event by marshalling when they are not riding.

Lofty did his National Service as a Corporal in the Royal Army Medical Corps at Sandhurst. He spent many (so he tells me) boring hours in charge of stretcher parties at Twesledown. Before we all jump to the wrong conclusion, the stretchers were for the Army Point to Point riders who used Twesledown for their horse racing.

Lofty, of course, is also a Policeman, he spent 15 years on the beat and was in fact decorated twice for acts above the call of duty. He is now the Coroner's Officer for the Chelmsford Police Division, which is more of a 8.30 to 6 p.m. job. He handles in excess of 400 deaths reported during the year, dealing at times with distraught widows and bereaved parents of young kiddies, his job is perhaps one that calls for a great amount of tact and compassion.

Lofty is married with two teenage daughters and of course "Randy" his black Labrador dog that has become as familiar at meetings as his Green Classic Car. I hear also on the grapevine that he expects to become a Grandfather at any minute.

We wish all the Lucas's the very best because without their support behind the scenes Lofty would not be able to come to meetings and where would meetings be without our Voice at the Mike — LOFTY LUCAS.

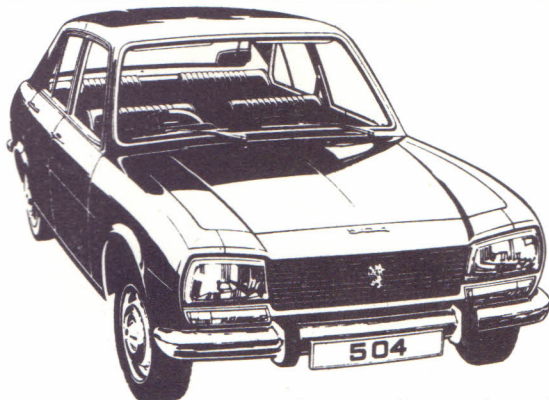
