

Superstars in four Superb Championship

Rounds by BOB SNELLING

Spectators who braved the damp conditions at Brands Hatch earlier in the month were treated to some of the most exciting solo racing of the season. With perhaps one exception, all of the riders who put on that brilliant show are here to-day for what promises to be a superb A.C.U. International Trophy Meeting supported by the Daily Express, Motor Cycle News, The Motor Cycle, Shell and Rothmans.

In welcoming you to this, the last but one motor cycle race meeting of the season, our thanks should go to all those who are in any way connected with the organisation of this and other events that have taken place during the year. One often reads of complaints from spectators about one circuit or another, but we should all realise that more than 90% of the organisation is carried out by voluntary labour and the casual 10% is often very hard to find. Spare a thought about this before dashing into print about some trivial matter.

So to the racing and the event which carries the largest prize money of the day, the fifth round of the Motor Cycle News Superbike Championship. Barry Sheene's great win in the previous round takes him to a clear 33 points ahead of brother-inlaw Paul Smart, so there is no hope at all of him being knocked off the top of the table to-day. The big interest must be on who is going to be in second place. Paul (37), Stan Woods (32), Peter Williams (31), Barry Scully (20) and Pat Mahoney (18) are in that order and will all be out to close the gap. The John Player Nortons of Peter Williams and Dave Croxford were going so well at the Hutchinson 100 meeting that they may push the Suzukis to some new records. Keeping with the solo events, Barry Sheene, who is having a busy season at home and abroad and taking a few knocks for his trouble, also tops the ShellSPORT 500 c.c. Championship table. He had a 13 point lead over Stan Woods before yesterday's meeting at Snetterton. Bill Smith, Tony Rutter and Dave Potter can do little more than move up in the table. There will, however, be some opposition from Barry Ditchburn, Phil Carpenter, John Williams, Charlie Williams, Irish challenger Ray McCullough and a rider very much in form, John Newbold.

In the Rothmans 350 c.c. Championship Tony Rutter was 10 points ahead of Steve Manship, again before Snetterton, but Newbold, Mick Grant and John Williams all finished in front of him at Brands so this could be another thriller. Particularly if Barry Sheene turns out on a 350 c.c. Suzuki as appears in the preliminary list.

South African Kork Ballington and Swiss star Gyula Marsovsky add the overseas flavour to the 250 c.c. race and could be well up with Grant, Rutter, Williams and Co. at the finish.

There have been some great sidecar races during the season and in addition one or two very dull affairs. To-day, however with over 50 entries it is necessary to have two heats and a final for the sixth round of the Motor Cycle International Championship. There should be no dull racing this time for the list includes all of the top riders in the table, Bill Currie (52 points), Dennis Keen (23), Gerry Boret (20), Dave Kruse (18), Dave Lawrence and Peter Williams (17). They will certainly be out to reduce Bill's runaway lead. So too will former British Champion Chris Vincent, Mac Hobson, George O'Dell and Les Langridge. If all of these riders survive the heats without any problems it should be quite a final.

Take care on the way home, for you still have to see the Rothmans 'Race of the Year' at Mallory Park on 15th September and the Evening News 'Powerbike International at Brands Hatch on 27th October. Thats the day when all of these championships are finally decided.

MOTOR CYCLE NEWS 'Superbike' Championship

Barry Sheene's phenomenal record of scoring maximum points in the last three rounds of the 'Motor Cycle News' Superbike championship is likely to come under its heaviest attack so far today.

Suzuki riders still occupy the first three places in the points standings after four rounds, but Peter Williams' second place at the last round at Brands Hatch on the John Player Norton hauled himself closer to the top three, and he'll be out to improve on that today.

Another rider who blasted into the reckoning at Brands Hatch was Mick Grant on the "works" Kawasaki 3. Northerner Mick is battling for fitness following a 120 m.p.h. tumble at Silverstone, but now that the Kawasaki is going well he'll be a real force to be reckoned with.

Also bidding to break the Suzuki domination - Paul Smart holds second place in the series and Stan Woods third - will be Barry Ditchburn, whose Yamaha 700 has been completely re-built by sponsor Ted Broad. He beat both Woods and Smart at Silverstone, so watch for fireworks today.

The championship is scored in world style - 15, 12, 10, 8, 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2, 1 - with five bonus points to the rider setting the fastest lap, at each round.

Points scored in all rounds count, with the last round, at Brands Hatch on October 27, counting double points and double prize money.

Leading scorers after four rounds: Barry Sheene 70, Paul Smart 37, Stan Woods 32, Peter Williams 31, Barry Scully 20, Pat Mahoney 18, Korkie Ballington, Derek Chatterton and Mick Grant 10.

Bonus awards of £35, £20, £10 and £5 will be paid to the first four men across the line at quarter, half and three-quarter distance. In addition there is a £15 mystery prize, kept secret until after the start of the race.

Norton Villiers Triumph again back the fastest lap award with a £25 prize. Today's round is being backed by Elf, who also sponsor world 500 c.c. champion Phil Read.

ROTHMANS 350 cc Championship

Rothmans of Pall Mall are this year sponsoring a new ten round championship for 350 cc solo motorcycles. Points will be awarded on the basis of 10-8-6-4-2-1 to the first six riders with an extra 10 points for the fastest lap in the final round at Brands Hatch on October 27th. There is also a round at Mallory Park on September 15th.

The overall winner will receive £200 and the runner-up £100. Next four places will receive £50, £40, £30 and £20 and an extra £10 will be paid for the fastest lap at the final round.

ShellSPORT 500 cc Championship

For the 1974 season, the ShellSPORT 500 cc Motorcycle Championship has had its prize fund doubled to £500. The series created tremendous excitment in 1973 and resulted in a popular win for Barry Sheene.

There are 11 rounds in all, at national or international meetings at Brands Hatch, Mallory Park, Oulton Park and Snetterton. Points in the championship are awarded for the first six places—8-6-4-3-2-1.

The 1974 champion will receive £250 and the riders in the next four places £150, £50, £30 and £20.

MOTOR CYCLE International Sidecar Championship

"Motor Cycle" and Motor Circuit Developments are sponsoring a £2,000 International Sidecar Championship for 1974. Prize money for the end-of-the-year championship winner and placement totals £1,000, made up of £500 for the outright winner, £250 for second, £100 for third, £75 for fourth, £50 for fifth and £25 for sixth place.

An additional £1,000 will be provided to boost the prize fund for each of the eight championship rounds, all of which take place on M.C.D. circuits.

Riders score points on world championship lines - 15 for a win, 12 for second, 10 for third and 8, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2, 1 down to 10th place. Unlike the world championships, every point will count. In addition, the rider setting fastest lap will get five extra points. For the final round, the points will be doubled.






