'Motorcycle Mechanics' Production Championship

With competition fierce enough to match the blazing weather of the first three rounds the big-money *MCM* Production Championship is well under way at this, the half-way mark. The fight for £4000 prize fund is likely to get hotter still though, as today's fourth round could see any of the first seven or eight riders scoop enough points to challenge the lead.

Unhappily, Martin Sharpe's recent injuries look like excluding him from the series but have strengthened Tom Pemberton's lead and Tom will be riding as hard as he knows to keep it that way. But while the big bikes are blasting through the field there are quite a few 500s and 250s which are capable of slipping through the handicap to take the flag first.

A major step forward in top-line production racing, the series offers the highest prizes this country has seen for the PR class. *Motorcycle Mechanics* has a cash prize fund of £2300 plus additional prize and bonus money from Benelli, Honda, Kawasaki, Suzuki and Yamaha. Other companies offering cash awards include Mick Walker, Duckhams, AGV, Cobra Luggage and Hondastyle Clothing.

The series is run under current ACU regulations with the exceptions that big-bore kits are not allowed and fairings may only be used if they are listed by the manufacturer. Street legal lighting must be retained except where it clashes with track safety regulations and the five-year rule has been waived. To keep riders and spectators on their toes each round is run under a handicap system with just one winner - the first past the flag - no matter what the capacity. First man home picks up 12 points, then 10, 8, 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2, and 1 for the next nine finishers.

'Motor Cycle News' Superbikes Championship

Following the success of previous championships, two extra rounds have been added this year and the total prize, bonus and contingency money, for the ten-race series has reached an incredible £15,000. This includes a special £100 awarded by BP at each meeting to the rider setting up the fastest lap.

The championship is scored like a Grand Prix - 15, 12, 10, 8, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2, 1 - with five bonus points to the rider setting the fastest lap at each round. If the fastest lap is shared, each rider receives five points. Double points will be awarded at the final round at Brands Hatch on October 30/31, which will be televised live on ITV's World of Sport programme.

'Motor Cycle' International Sidecar Championship

This is the third year of the "Motor Cycle" International Sidecar Championship which, in 1975, was the closest fought of all the British road racing championships. It was decided only at the final round and then only by the fastest lap. That was set by George O'Dell with passenger Alan Gosling, who snatched the title from British Champion Mac Hobson and passenger Gordon Russell.

After such a successful series, it is natural that the format should be unchanged for 1976, with eight rounds, all at Motor Circuit Developments circuits.

The only difference is an increase in the prize fund, so that the winner of each round will get at least £125. The total fund has gone up to £3,738, making it the most lucrative sidecar championship in the world.

The series winner will get £500, with £250 for the runners-up, £100 for third and £75, £50 and £25 for the fourth to sixth outfits. Scoring is on world championship lines with 15-12-10-8-6-5-4-3-2-1 for the first 10 but with the addition of five points for the fastest lap at each circuit. All points scored will count towards the final total.

Double points will be awarded for both places and the fastest lap at the final round, at Brands Hatch on October 31.

Remaining qualifying rounds are: September 12, Mallory Park; October 31, Brands Hatch.


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CHAMPIONSHIP DAY

Without a doubt one of the proudest mums in Britain at the present time is Iris Sheene who was quietly having a cup of tea and a chat at Brands Hatch while the new World Champion was winning his third Hutchinson 100. Having watched the rather ragged start with Barry having a bit of leeway to make up Iris took time off to relax, and then back to hear the cheers as super son was once again first past the flag. It is convincing that on top of the worry, and there certainly is some, that the sereneness of mum and the expertese and quiet guidance of pop has played a great part in Barry's success. Secretary of the meeting Jack Thomas has spent a lot of time and effort bringing together this first class entry which includes not only the best solo riders in the country but a great line-up of three-wheeler exponents, fighting for points in the Motor Cycle International Sidecar Championship.

Many of to-days riders will have been fighting out the final rounds of the British Championship at Snetterton

yesterday which would have resulted in Steve Parrish or Geoff Barry winning the solo title and Dick Greasley the sidecar, however, in summing up this afternoons chances it is the Brands form that will have to be considered, for at the time of writing Silverstone has yet to come and anyway, that circuit is so different from any other in the country. It's a bit quicker too!!

The big solo event is, of course, the 6th round of the Motor Cycle News Superbike Championship which most people now recognise as the top title of the home competitions. Here, with five rounds to go Barry leads Mick by 22 points and when you realise that a win plus fastest lap brings in 20 points, there is very little in it. Barry desparately wants to regain this title while Mick is equally determined to hang on to itthis should be a facinating race. Barry Ditchburn just 7 points behind is still in the hunt and with a fair sprinkling of bonus money the talented pack will be out to scuttle these three if humanly possible, but with mechanically trouble free rides we can see little change at the top of the table.

Steve Manship collected the Shellsport Championship last year but this time Super Sheene is well in the driving seat having won five of the eight rounds putting him 20 points in front of second placeman Steve Parrish who is followed by John Williams and Phil Read—the question is will he be able to hang on to this second spot. If Phil and John ride in all of the remaining rounds it could be a very close finish.

Martin Sharpe took a nasty toss at Brands and misses the 4th round of the Motor Cycle Mechanics Production Race Series so let us start off by wishing him a speedy and complete recovery. Tom Pemberton currently tops the table and should again be concerned in the finish while Tony Holland, Rob Prior and Tony Smith could all move up at the expense of the unlucky Martin. These riders certainly look the pick of to-day's line-up. Tony Rutter has become a bit of a 250 cc and 350 cc race specialist and has excellent chances to prove this again but he will face some spirited opposition in these events from such riders as Cliff Carr, Peter Ellis, Graham Hobbs, Austin Hockley, Steve Manship and Clive Offer to name but a few. These two remaining solo events are bound to

provide keen and exciting racing to add spice to the big ones.

It is with no disrespect that the three-wheeler brigade always come at the end of the programme notes, it's mainly to keep the thing in sequence, but their talents are no less respected. In fact it is more often than not that they provide the highlights of a programme with spectacular and close racing. With the composition of heats not available at the time of writing we must assume that all of the leaders in the Motor Cycle International Sidecar Championship table will make their way through to the final—what a scrap this will be.

Dick Greasley has a commanding lead in the Championship with 80 points to the 44 of Trevor Ireson in second place and with some consistant riding in the final rounds should have no difficulty in collecting the title. The battle will be for second place with Mac Hobson 12 points in arrears of Trevor challenging for this position. However, with George O'Dell showing such great form at Brands he is bound to be having a say in to-day's result but there is no way that he can retain the Championship title that he won in 1975. Others who may be concerned in the shake-up at the finish are John Barker and the ever improving Andy Jackson. The following pages look good for a fine afternoon's racing—we hope you enjoy it and don't forget it's the end of the holiday weekend and there will be a lot of traffic on the road—Take it easy.

Motor Cycle News Superbike Championship

Welcome to the Oulton Park round of the Motor Cycle News Superbike Championship for what promises to be one of the most exciting clashes of this year's series.

At the half way stage in the champion-ship World 500 champion Barry Sheene leads Mick Grant, last year's Superbike champion, by 22 points. However Sheene, despite his commanding lead, is searching for more horsepower and could well make his debut on an 850 three cylinder Suzuki to combat the power of the Kawasakis and Yamahas. Mick Grant, in second spot, is waiting to pounce on any slip by Sheene or his machine and he was quick to point out after the last round at Brands Hatch that Sheene only has to fail to finish once and he is right back in contention. Grant is also full of confidence following his tremendous victory in the second leg of the Silverstone John Player Grand Prix on his Kawasaki.

Barry Ditchburn, Grant's Kawasaki team-mate, occupies third spot in the table and despite a season of ill fortune Ditchburn illustrated he is still a force to be reckoned with when he shared the

fastest lap with Grant at the last round at Brands Hatch.


Dave Potter, the top privateer in the series, has ridden the Ted Broad Yamaha up into fourth place three points in front of John Williams who will be determined to shake off the effects of his recent Finish Grand Prix crash and show his many fans at his local track how well he can go.

British champion Roger Marshall has scored consistently for his sixth placing while Stan Woods, who is eight points adrift in seventh spot, scored an impressive fifth place at the last round.

British championship contender Geoff Barry and former Ontario and Imola winner Paul Smart share eighth place but the real dark horse of this afternoon's meeting could be Ron Haslam who is tenth.

Surely nobody who witnessed Haslam's last appearance at Oulton Park, in the Anglo American series, will forget his magnificent riding which gained a fifth and second placings in the two legs. If he can recapture that form he could really upset the applecart out at the front.

Other riders sure to be battling for points include seven times world champion Phil Read, Castrol award winner Steve Parrish, John Newbold, Tony Rutter, Steve Manship, Cliff Carr, Charlie Williams and John Cowie.


