Scrambling at the Cross-Roads

We at Mortimer are pleased to welcome you to the Bargepole Scramble for 1965 which is the opening event of the season for us here at Padworth Park. We hold this meeting amid a very unsettled background in Scrambling here in Britain. It is at first sight a very strange paradox that as more money is available for people to spend on sport and recreation that many of the accepted forms of community sport should be in financial danger. For such is the state of scrambling today. We have many more riders on machines that are much more sophisticated than their predecessors and certainly many more times as expensive. The costs of promoting an event rise out of all proportion to the income from you the paying spectator. This is, we know, an oft repeated excuse for this or that increase in price. The simple fact is that attendances at scrambles have declined over the last few years and entry prices have remained very stable.

In an endeavour to retain the interest of the spectators many clubs have of late taken to the practice of paying the leading riders of the day to attend a particular event. Whether this money is paid in the form of starting money, advertising rights or travelling expenses the riders are still employed. It is easy to see the next step of those riders who are paid. Some, but let us be quite clear not all, demand more payment next time and as this demand is met by concerned promoters, so rise the riders sense of value and so on. Those riders who have not been paid resent the presence of those who have, who, by virtue of their greater skill, stand a higher chance of taking the leading places and thus most prize monies. The result, then, is that these riders who are not payed decline to attend those circuits that do pay riders. This is obviously your loss as spectators. Instead of a large and varied entry the meeting tends to consist of a few top riders plus a very small number of others. You may say that a few top riders will give all the close racing that is required. Unfortunately this is not so. Consider any trade supported event in the near past. Each and every one has received the best possible entry in name but the sad truth is that the vast majority resulted in a procession. One rider on a given day is just that little bit better than usual and no one else can stay with him. This is continued down through the field and so a procession results. The reliability of the present machines is so high, the vast majority of riders ride the same sophisticated machine with similar power units, that the degree between success at a meeting and merely being placed is so very small. If you, the public, wish to see only the top riders at every meeting, then the number of meetings that can be organised are very limited. Those events that do not receive trade support (no Sunday event may be considered for trade support) can only be promoted in one way—employed riders. We will have the system that is used in Europe. A promoter will pay and therefore employ all the riders and the public have to pay for it. Many scrambles in France with an entry smaller than that here today will charge an entry of 5nf (6/10d.) per person with programmes at 2nf (2/8d.) for about 8-10 pages and get a crowd of 10,000. These events are by no means the big Grand Prix rounds but merely local scrambles like our own. No wonder that they can attract our top riders abroad so easily. The Continental clubs also have one ace that we in Britain are denied—they have no millstone hanging around their necks as we have in the form of the Lords Day Observance Society. That a few persons with outmoded ideas should be enabled to force their views onto the vast majority of people by the use of obsolete laws. which remain on the Statute book merely through the apathy of successive governments is the major obstacle to the growth of scrambles.

Scrambling can never hold our top riders in open competition with the European promoters. We at Mortimer had, with the greatest reluctance, to cancel the scramble due to be run here last month. This was a National event, the permit was issued, the money was available to promote the event but the date clashed with no less than seven continental events, two of which were Grand Prix (World Championship rounds). Clearly we could not have attracted the entry worthy of a National event and more important we could not charge you, the public, to watch such inferior racing.
