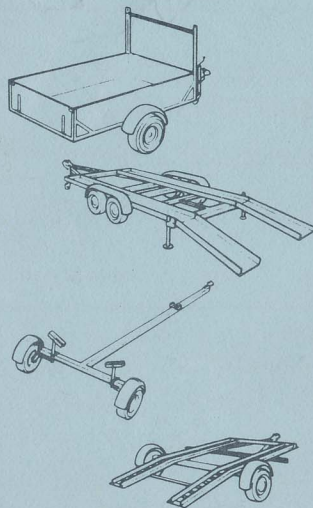

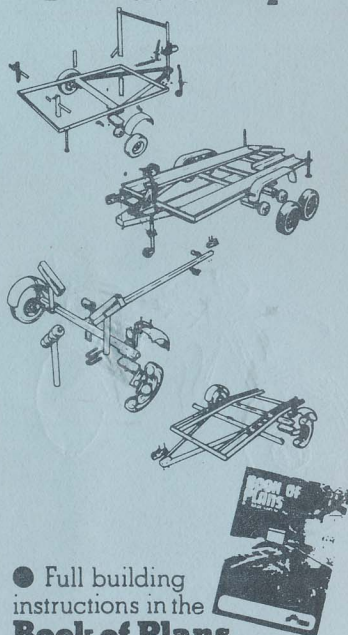

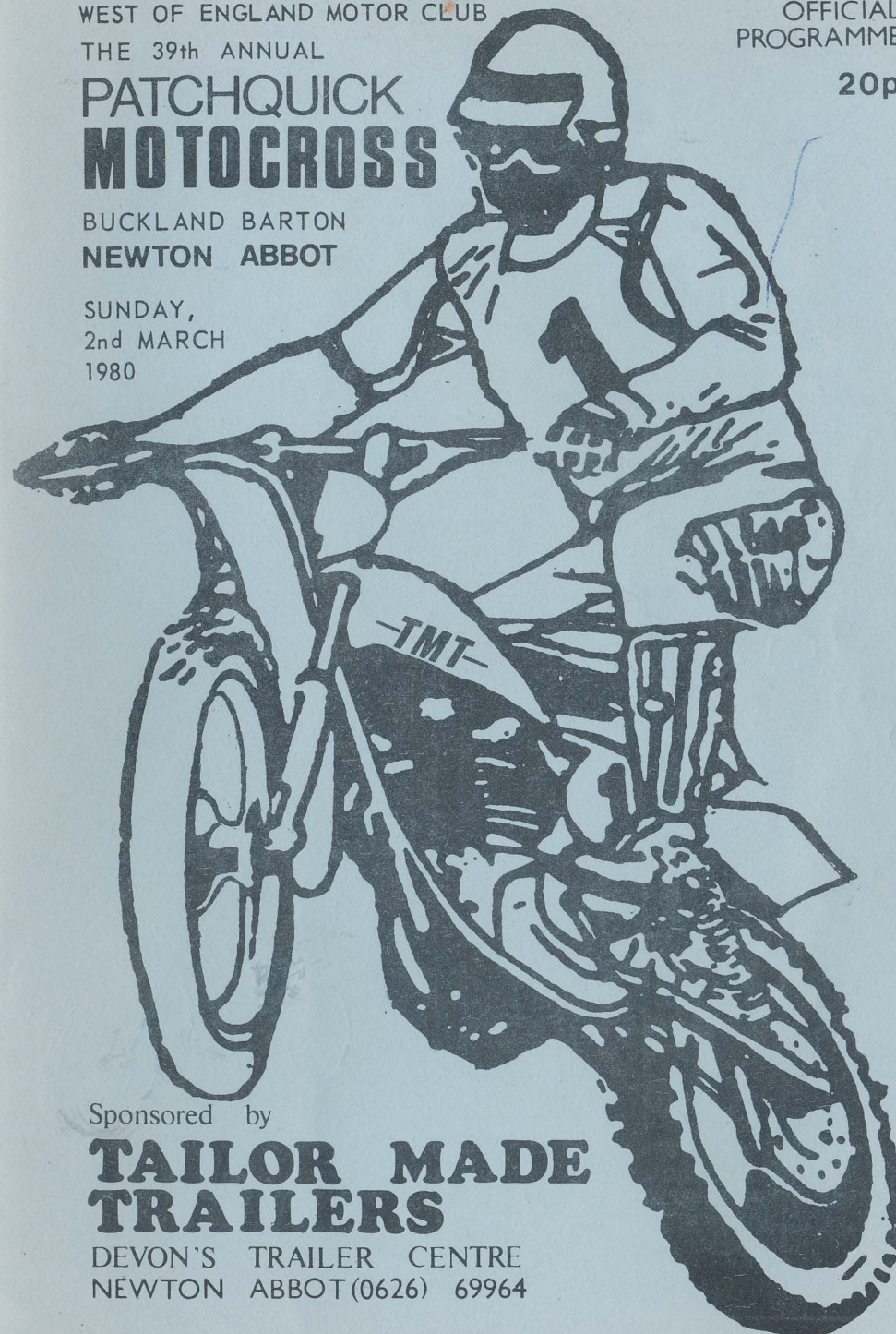

A GLANCE AT TODAY'S EVENT

Welcome to the 39th Patchquick Scramble, the first really important meeting of the Year, staged for the first time on this excellent new circuit here at Buckland Barton and sponsored by the local company — Tailor Made Trailers — to whom the organisers are indebted in many ways.

Apart from last year's winner, Graham Noyce, who is not completely fit following a close season cartilage operation, and Neil Hudson, who unfortunately has an International engagement in France, the entry includes many of the top thirty-five riders in the British Isles, who, in a few weeks will be contesting the British Championships, and who knows, you and I might well be watching this year's Champion in action here today.

Delving for a moment into the past, the Patchquick, to my mind, has always been a prestigious event, and one that everyone wants to win.

Local stars, Tom Whitton and Freddie Hawken dominated the event from its inception in 1934 until war clouds gathered over Europe. Barnstaple star Rob Ray, who later achieved fame with Ariel, took over where they left off when the event was resumed in 1946.

Nine years later I was privileged to attend the 1955 event, held at Wallaford Down, Buckfastleigh, to see Jeff Smith, who later won two World titles for B.S.A. beat a star-studded field with lots of Inner Tube peering through a four inch split in his front tyre, mind you, it was almost as bad when he began the race, but this is just one instance of the determination portrayed by the class of riders here today.

I know that the organisers are hoping that John Tribble - winner of the 1960 event, and who campaigned a big "beefy" Gold Star for many years with more than moderate success, will present the magnificent trophy to today's winner.

Who will win? Well with such a close field, including two past winners, one would be guessing, but '77 winner Bob Wright makes no secret of the fact that he would like to get the Trophy back on his sideboard for another year, but he knows that it's going to be a hard fight. Andy Robertson is the other past winner having won the event on a Husqvarna at Thorns Cross some 12 years ago in 1968.

Lets just have a look at some of their rivals.

Dave Thorpe is certainly one to watch. He won the '79 British Support race Championship by a wide margin on the exceedingly quick Uni-Track Kawasaki and is destined for the very top in the not too-distant future.

Vaughan Semmens who spearheads Maico's assault on the forthcoming World 250 c.c. Championship, needs no introduction. Like former British Champion Vic Allan and the forceful Dave Tomasik, he is at home on any type of going.

Montesa's close season signing, Peter Mathia, who finished well up on last year's Championship on the 360 Cotton EMX, has spent most of the Winter "down under" and is no doubt looking forward to scoring his first win on home soil for his new employers.

Roger Harvey is still as unpredictable as ever, but he's usually around at the finish, where it matters most.

Local hopes rest firmly on the shoulders of Scotsman, Cameron Knox, now exiled in Torbay, and former World 125 c.c. campaigner, Lew Delve, who was

pipped in the National Benzole series at this circuit when it was first used last October.

Besides the main event there is also the South Devon supporting Motocross, which is packed with tomorrow's champions, and if you have a few minutes to spare before the starting gate rolls, why not have a browse at the excellent T.M.T. products marketed by our sponsors. Motocross needs their support and they need yours.

Lastly a date for your diary. British Motocross Championships (Round 2) at Higher Rocombe, near Torquay, on Easter Sunday, April 6th - another W.E.M.C. promotion.

RULES & RESULTS MOTOCROSS:

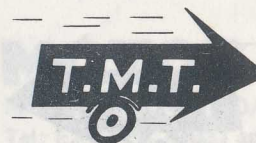
Points will be awarded to the finishers in each race - Winner 1 pt; 2nd 2 pts; etc. Ties will be decided viz:

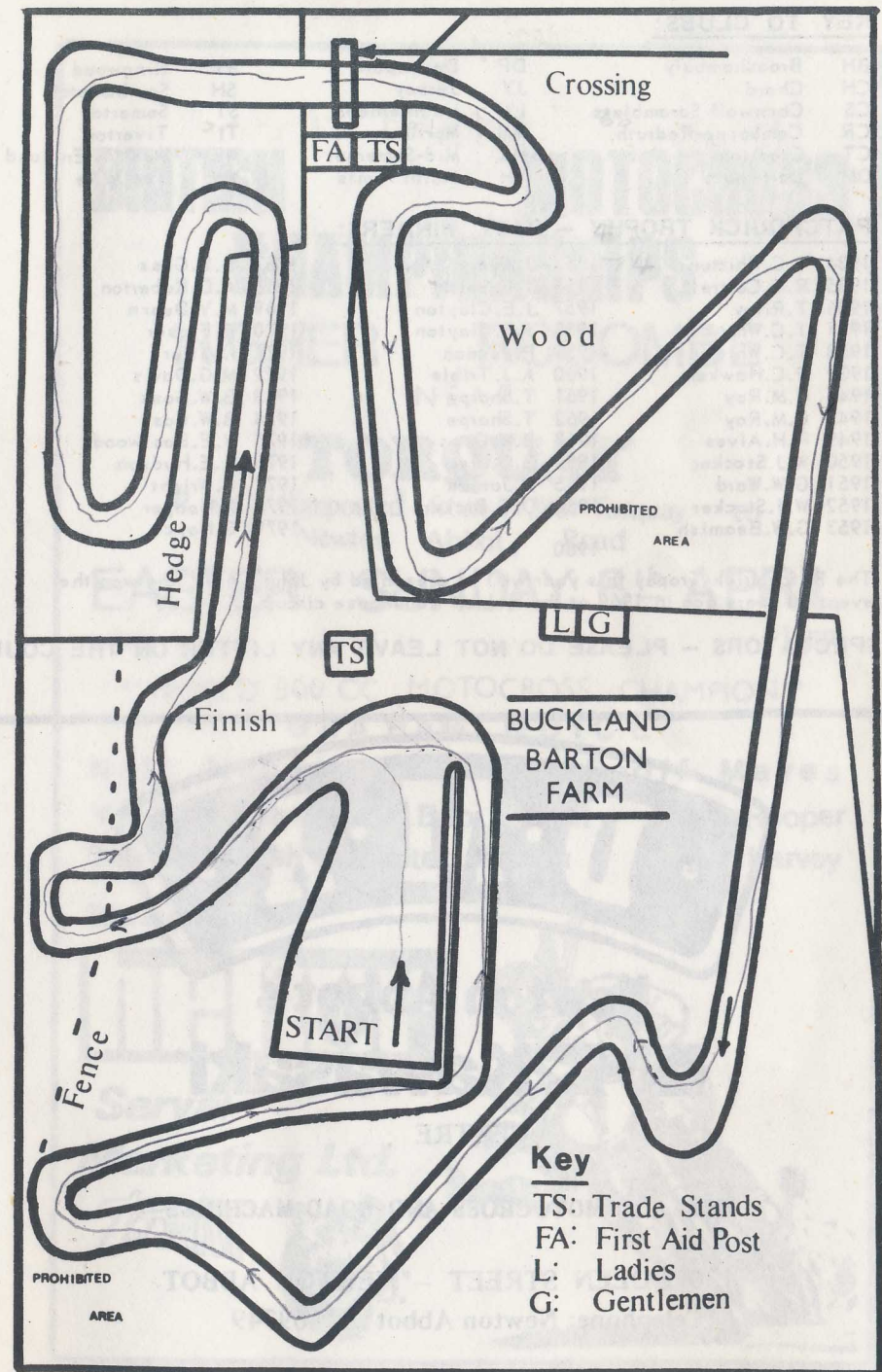

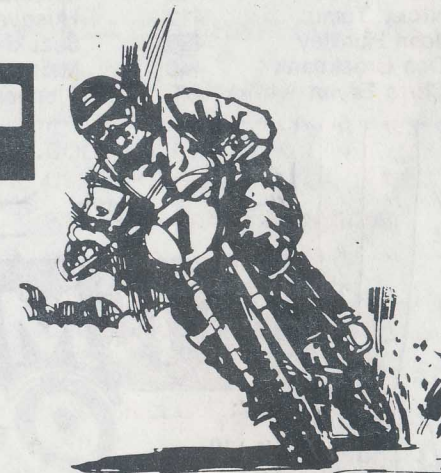

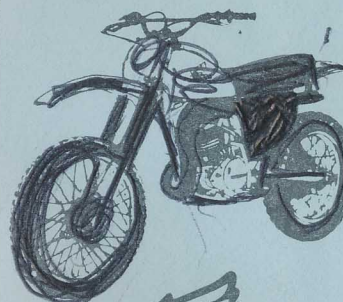
