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Round 4 British Moto-Cross Championship

Foreword by Alex Hodgkinson (Trials and Motocross News)

You can't keep a good man down for long and when that man is the champion of the world, even injury doesn't seem to keep him from the winner's rostrum.

After a devastating start to the season Graham Noyce, Britain's first world motocross champion for 14 years, suffered a double setback at Easter when mechanical problems caused him to loose his British championship lead on the Sunday and then on Bank Holiday Monday he dislocated his shoulder in Holland and was out of action for three weeks, missing the first two Grands Prix in the defence of his world crown.

His comeback ride was at the last round of the home championship, held in Essex, and most people expected Graham to settle for a few points to keep himself in touch with the championship leaders as he was still far from fit.

Graham is made of sterner stuff however and, despite a rare defeat at the hands of 17 year old Dave Thorpe in the first race, the champion emerged as the overall winner on the day to regain the championship lead. Today's track, here at Corsham, was the scene of Graham's first ever British championship win and a fully fit Graham must be as hot a favourite for success today as he was the underdog five years ago.

The challenge of the new young pretender, Dave Thorpe, cannot be discounted after his disappointment at failing to score in the last race, a fate which also befell the local hero Neil Hudson from Pensford. The latter will hopefully have resolved all of the contract problems which have surrounded him this year.

Last year's number three Geoff Mayes has quite a lot of ground to make up if he is to equal or better last year's placing while consistent rides from Welshman Andy Roberton have taken him closer to Geoff in the points table.

Competition for leaderboard placings has never been so fierce but amongst the favourites must be Pete Mathia, who should be mounted on a works Montesa today for the first time, and the Beamish Suzuki squad, who are today's sponsors.

Mathia looked set to win in Essex until he crashed and the Suzuki's of Dave Watson, Billy Aldridge and Jonathan Wright all made the top six; the return of team leader Steve Beamish after injury should further strengthen their challenge.

In the Serval-Tonelli sponsored qualifying championship Neil Hudson's younger brother Gary will be hoping his track knowledge and local support can help him to extend his lead again after a poor third round but any mistake or misfortune could see his lead whittled away by third round winner Don Brockbank, the best of last year's schoolboys Adrian Willmott or European amateur champion Gary Evans.



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

A TRIBUTE TO GRAHAM



Graham was ten years old when he had his first competitive ride in a Schoolboy Scramble with the Reading Schoolboys Club on a BSA Bantam and this machine stood him in good stead and helped develop his riding ability. The progress of this promising and able young rider developed all the time and he joined one of the largest of the Schoolboy Clubs — the Ringwood Club and there can be no doubt that his progress, skill and natural ability benefited from this move for it provided him with strong competition at the time he needed it and confirmation of this was apparent when he won the National Schoolboys Scramble Championship amongst some forty or more other trophies — all before he was 16 years old.

After his 16th birthday he put the schoolboy class behind him and moved up into the Junior A.C.U. event. But it was not all riding for Graham for he went to work for Don and Derek Rickham at New Milton during the week. Weekends, however, saw him riding in Junior Events throughout the Southern Centre with such determination and skill that he was up-graded to Expert status inside six months. He had by now graduated to a 250 Rickman Metisse sponsored by Harold Wakefield and it was on this machine that he began his Expert career.

A 250 has certain limits and this was appreciated and recognised by the Rickman brothers and they put a 460 Husqvarna engine into a Rickman frame for Graham to ride and this venture was fully justified in the light of Graham's successes through the rest of 1974.

1975 saw him accept support from the Bryan Goss Maico team and ride the big capacity machine in all the British Championship Rounds. It was on May 18th at the Maybug Trophy Meeting at this circuit that he won his first major award — the 500cc Maybug Trophy — against a field of top British riders.

Success followed success in that year and he went to the final round of the British Championship at West Stowe in Suffolk with every chance of winning and becoming the youngest ever British Champion but fate decreed otherwise, he won the first leg but crashed in the second breaking his left collarbone and had to be content with a third place behind Vic Eastwood and Vic Allan. It was in the same year that Graham began his 500cc World Championship challenge

with a fine ride in the British round at Hawkestone Park followed by a ride in the West German in which he finished third overall.

1976 saw Graham finish a superb season with a 4th place in the 500cc World Championship table and winning the British Championship for the first time. Though he retained the British title in 1977 his final World Championship position was a disappointing 8th after a frustrating International season.

For 1978 he moved from Maico to Honda gaining his third successive British Championship and finishing 7th in the World Championship.

It was last year when everything seemed to click and after his memorable and emotional overall win in the British round at Farleigh Castle in July, he went on to become the first British rider to win the World 500cc Championship for 14 years, clinching the title at Namur in Belgium on Sunday August 15th. In spite of the immense pressures upon him that led to the tremendous achievement he won his 4th successive British Championship!!

Riding for Britain at the Motor Cross Des Nations in September he injured his left knee quite badly and recovery was slow but sure and he had to train and exercise exceptionally hard to enable the leg to regain its strength and to keep himself in the top physical condition the sport demands.

So on to 1980 and at the opening British Championship round at Hawkestone he notched two firsts, at the second round at Rocombe he got a first and then crashed in the second leg giving the Championship lead to Neil Hudson. But at Halstead at the third round he stormed back after injury to his right shoulder had kept him out of the saddle for a few weeks and regained top place in the Championship table. That period when he was unable to ride coincided with the first two rounds of the World Championship which of course was a setback in his defence of World title, but to everyone's pleasure he came back at the French round on May 4th with a fine ride to finish 3rd overall and gain 18 valuable Championship points. In Sweden on May 11th he collected 6 points for a 5th place in the first race, retiring in the second having been hit in the face by

Best wishes to Graham for the 1980 World and British Championships.

In Finland on Sunday, Graham finished 1st and 4th and was overall winner of the Finnish Grand Prix.

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

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


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
