

Dunlop, OBE, MBE will long be remembered by bikers worldwide and his many friends for his record breaking achievements on the famous Isle of Man TT Course.

However, many of those people may well not be aware that family man Joey was a caring person who undertook

a number of lone and dangerous missions to the former Eastern European Countries in a van loaded with gifts and provisions for young children who were being deprived of life's essentials.

It was in recognition of these personal charitable undertakings as well as his 26 TT race victories and five TT Formula One world titles that he was twice honoured by Her Majesty the Queen, firstly with an MBE in 1986 and with an OBE ten years later.

At the end of the Millennium year a group of ardent Joey fans decided to approach his wife, Linda, to seek her agreement to raise funds to construct a facility that would be of benefit to the community and also be a fitting memorial in recognition of the varied achievements of the person affectionately known as 'Yer Maun'

It was during the initial discussions with Linda and Honda's Bob McMillan that it was revealed that Joey would have liked to have constructed a facility to benefit people, especially children, with a disability.

Once this group of admirers had been given the green light by the Dunlop family, fund raising plans were instigated and the Joey Dunlop Foundation was established, initially to raise funds to install a lift in the TT grandstand to make access possible to the main viewing gallery for the disabled.

The second undertaking was to provide much needed accommodation for the physically challenged and their families, and with a view to working alongside other charitable organisations both on and off the Isle of Man.

With the support of Linda Dunlop (Patron), Jason Griffith (Founder President), Richard 'Milky' Quayle (President), Bob McMillan and John Harris, representing Honda, and many other supporters nearly £300k has now been raised from various fund raising events.

These have included the sale of motorcycle clothing, badges and stickers and more recently the introduction by the Foundation of an annual tombola boasting a Honda motorcycle as first prize.

Funds have also been boosted by way of collection boxes in public houses throughout the island and sundry donations, in the main from off Isle of Man residents.

Apart from a sizeable contribution from Arai Helmets, all funds have been raised by the Foundation committee members who have worked long hours, especially during the summer months, and are now looking for much needed extra support from Joey Dunlop fans throughout the world.

In 2005 a property was purchased in Victoria Road, Douglas, near St Ninian's Park, and once demolished it will become the site for a holiday complex of five units that will provide specialised facilities for the disabled.

Construction of Joey's Holiday Lodge was due to commence in May this year with completion by May 2007.

The accommodation will be available to both local and non Isle of Man residents, with ex-TT and Manx Grand Prix riders and their families having priority during the race periods.

The TT Festival is an important event for motorcyclists' worldwide and an essential period of fund raising for the Foundation.

To this end TT Riders liaison officers Richard 'Milky' Quayle and Paul Phillips will be hosting a TT Chat Show at the Villa Marina in Douglas on June 3, with all proceeds going directly to the Joey Dunlop Foundation.

Also, throughout the TT Festival, Foundation members will be on hand to serve a wide range of refreshments at the Mike Hailwood Centre, to the rear of the Grandstand, and give visitors the opportunity to purchase items from the JDF clothing range. Committee members will be attending various motorcycle events and if you see them at the Blackford's Pre-TT Classic Road Races and the Steam Packet National Solo Road Races held on the Billown Course, Castletown, please ask them how the project is proceeding and maybe purchase one or two tombola tickets - this will give you a chance to win one of three Honda motorcycles in the most exciting raffle ever organised by the Foundation.

The appeal from the dedicated members of the Joey Dunlop Foundation is clear.

'Please support us to ensure the much needed holiday accommodation for the disabled is operational in the centenary year of the TT races.'

Once completed, the Holiday Lodge will become a lasting memorial to **Joey Dunlop - The King of the Roads.**





It happened last year!...



he 2005 races saw a new main sponsor arrive, Blackford Financial Services, who have pledged their support for a number of years, which is very much appreciated by the Southern '100' Club.

As the opening event of the '50th Anniversary year', the Pre-TT Classic provided some exciting racing, no more

so than when Huddersfield's Bill Swallow won his 12th Pre-TT Classic race, being made to work every yard of the way.

Riding a 350cc Aermacchi owned by Dick Linton, he took victory by a bikes length from Derek Whalley aboard a 350cc 7R AJS. The six-lap Single Cylinder race, which opened the meeting, was run in dry but very windy conditions, and gave the crowd a thrilling 25 mile joust.

Swallow headed the field until the fifth lap when Whalley overtook coming out of Church Bends. But as they came up on back markers going into Iron Gate for the final time, Swallow blasted back into the lead and held on to the chequered flag.

Both riders concurred that there was little between the two very different machines' performance and heartily agreed they had thoroughly enjoyed the race-long dice.

Quite some way behind, battling alone, came newcomer Luke Notton on another 350 AJS.

In the 250cc class run concurrently there was a rare Greeves one-two-three, with victory going to Paul Coward, after three previous attempts at winning had ended in retirement, he took victory on the Silverstone model manufactured in 1965. Runner-up by five seconds was David Spencer and third Mervyn Stratford.

Blackpool's Roy Richardson repeated his 2000 win by taking Martin Bullock's T20 Suzuki twin to victory in the Lightweight Classic race. He eventually won by 25 seconds, but that far from told the full story. Wallasey's Mike Hose pushed him extremely hard for the first half of the nine laps, but slipped back when his Ariel Arrow twin developed gearbox trouble and he ran wide a few times attempting to change down. The pair scampered away from the rest of the field, pulling 10 seconds out even on the first lap. Kirkconnel's Bill Wark and Kendal's Tom Jackson slugged it out for third, but it all ended in tears when Tom tweaked the Super Six just a mite too hard exiting Cross Four Ways on the last lap. Down on his ear he went and Wark was left wondering how he'd managed to miss colliding with him, crossing the line to take third.

Lap and race records went by the board as Chris Palmer and Roy Richardson battled out the Senior Classic. Palmer was having his first ride on the Fred Walmsley Manx Norton, while Richardson had a 450cc Honda twin from the stable of Martin Bullock. Palmer took the advantage off the line, although Richardson stuck with him like glue, but at Cross Four Ways on the sixth of the nine laps, he came into the right-hander too fast and almost stood the Honda on its nose, almost dropping the plot. It was all Palmer needed and he pinched back the lap record his rival had just taken from Bob Heath, leaving it at 2 minutes 45.159 seconds, an average speed of 92.638mph. Richardson recovered to come home second with Carnforth's Alan Oversby having a lonely ride on his Craven Manx Norton to take third.

Hillman Imp engine-powered three wheelers finished one-two in the six-lap sidecar race. Once again the ex-works flat twin BMW failed to deliver sufficient power to overcome the more modern outfits.

Stuart Digby and Paul Thomas were harried by course newcomers Eddy Wright and Neil Wheatley on the first lap, but settled for a steady drive to second as the temperature of the water began to climb.

Klaus Enders's veteran former passenger, Ralf Englehardt thrilled the crowds with his right hand chair with Winfried Viecenz as passenger and was happy enough with the final place on the podium.


Roy Richardson's 61-year-old father Peter made it a family double when he won the 350cc class of the solo Support race by some 50-seconds from newcomer John Leech and last year's victor Elle Forrest third.

Brian Nichol of Dalkeith near Edinburgh took the 500cc honours from Harold Bromiley and Ron Brown.

Wallasey's Mike Hose smashed his own lap and race records en route to victory in the Junior race. Astride local sponsor John Turner's 350 Drixton Honda, Hose admitted he became a bit complacent in the latter stages of the nine-lapper enabling Bill Swallow to close down the gap. He upped his pace on the final circuit with a new lap record to see off the Yorkshireman's determined challenge. Newcomer Luke Notton took another place on the podium, edging out Steve Elliott by the narrowest of margins at the line.

Castletown's Chris Palmer rounded off his first ever Classic meeting with further success on the Walmsley Norton in the combined Post-Classic / Superbike race, the final of the meeting.

Guy Martin set the early pace on the ex-Alec George Trident, but retired at Ballabeg on the opening lap when the triple let go rather expensively. Paul Coward was elbow to elbow with Palmer down the bypass on lap two; as the Island resident used his superior course knowledge to edge clear of the Yorkshireman. Coward's Post Classic TZ350 Yamaha eventually seized at Cross Four Ways on lap four, letting Decca Kelly through for a surprise win after what had been a sluggish getaway for him. Up front, Alan Oversby piled on the coals in the latter stages, setting the fastest lap of the race in the process, but Palmer still had almost two seconds in hand at the chequered cloth. Swallow, who had a bit of a moment at Ballakaighan, was third, ahead of Kelly and Chris McGahan on the first of the triples.

Following a nostalgic look at pre-race activities, a classic confrontation ensues in the 1950 Senior TT - a classic confrontation between the established Norton works riders Artie Bell, Harold Daniell and Johnnie Lockett and team 'newcomer' Geoff Duke.

After a runaway first Isle of Man win in the previous year's Clubmans event, Duke was up against formidable opposition in his first Senior TT, not only from his experienced team mates but also from Les Graham (AJS Porcupine) Reg Armstrong (Velocette) Harold Daniell (Norton) and Bob Foster (Velocette).

So with the first ever one-piece leather zipped up tight, head on tank and both wheels powering through some memorable drifts, Geoff Duke set about casting the mould of an historic racing career.


