





A WHOLE PACKOF ACES



PHEW! What a summer and what a great racing season so far. The temperature is in the 90s as these notes are being written, and Barry Sheene has just won the Dutch T.T.—his fourth in a row in the current series. If he goes on at this rate he'll have the title in his pocket by half distance and be able to concentrate on riding where he can add jam to his bread and butter. Talking to Chris Carter on B.B.C. Radio after the Dutch, Barry explained how that little excursion left him out of pocket so he will be out to pick up a bit of spare cash here to-day.

With the numerous meetings here during the season this is the only one over the long 2.71-mile circuit so nobody has had a chance to have a crack at Mick Grant's outright lap record of 104.45 m.p.h. Mick had a great day last year when he won the 'Race of Aces' from Barry Ditchburn and created a lap record of 103.13 into the bargain. Later he pushed this up to the new 104-plus figure in the 750 c.c. race.

What of to-day? There is an enormous amount of talent in the 40 invited riders for the main event, in fact 'A whole pack of Aces' and one thing, Mick Grant will not be daunted by Barry's reputation and current brilliant form, despite his setbacks at the T.T. and later at Mallory Park. He will be trying desperately to win this one again and you can be sure someone is bound to be pushed to a new record. However, these two may not have it all their own way for amongst the other aces to have their say will be such riders as Barry Ditchburn, Steve Parrish, John Williams and John Newbold, while Steve Manship came back with a fine victory at Croft after a bit of a lean period. Mick Patrick and young Chris Revett are course specialists and should not be far off the leading group but our very welcome Continental visitors may find this field a bit too hot for them. The 'Race of Aces' will certainly be a battle of the giants with Barry undoubtedly an odds-on favourite. There is a pretty well identical line-up for the later 750 c.c. race, which could be run to a similar pattern. Let us hope that they are all still around.

Barry's lead over Steve Parrish in the Shellsport Championship is a mere four points with six rounds gone. With only four to go after to-day he will want to improve on this to regain the title which he lost to Steve Manship last year, while a win for John Williams will bring him

right into the picture. These three, a revitalised Steve Manship, Paul Smart, Mick Grant, Barry

Ditchburn, Tony Rutter and John Newbold add up to another great scrap.

The top five contenders are all listed for the third round of the hotly contested Motor Cycle Mechanics Production Race Series and this bunch could dominate the race. Martin Sharpe heads the table with Tony Holland, Rob Prior, Tony Smith and Tom Pemberton all within striking distance. There are, however, several newcomers on the scene who may make their presence felt. The interest in this series, with some £4,000 prize money, is stepping up with each successive round.

Austin Hockley, Adrian Godden, Cliff Carr and Neil Tuxworth look the pick of the 250 c.c. field but the 350 c.c. event has a much more open look about it. Mick Patrick, Tony Rutter, Grahame Hobbs, Austin Hockley, Steve Manship and Neil Tuxworth should all have a hand in

setting the pace and perhaps the Continental boys will find this more to their liking.

So to the biggest prize money event of the day, the fifth round of the Motor Cycle International Sidecar Championship. With what is certainly the best three-wheeler line-up of the season, a couple of five lap heats will be necessary which should not stop most of the top

contenders making their way to the final.

Dick Greasley has a clear lead of 26 points from Trevor Ireson so, whatever to-day's result, he will remain at the top. At the time of writing no entry had been received from third place man Mac Hobson—let us hope that it was just delayed for his presence would bound to be felt. Current title holder George O'Dell is so far adrift that he has little chance of repeating his 1975 performance. Anyway, he is a real contender for today's race and so too are Jeff Gawley, John Barker and Andy Jackson, who have been showing some fine form in recent weeks. Others who will add fire to this cauldron are Steve Sinnott, Roy Hanks, Roger Aldous, Bill Hodgkins, John Ring, Peter Williams, Tony Wakefield and Graham Milton. Adding a bit of colour to the scene will be Japanese champion Masato Kumano and Gustav Pape of Holland who was third in the recent Dutch Sidecar T.T. It is their first visit to the circuit and we hope to see them up amongst the regulars.

Motor Cycle Mechanic's Production Saloon Championship

WELCOME to the third round of the Motor Cycle Mechanics Championship, it promises to be one of the most interesting rounds in the series.

In contrast to the short distance, flat-out sprints of the previous two races at Brands and Mallory, today's race has been extended to 20 laps (56 miles) as a test of the stamina of bikes and riders.

Martin Sharpe, current leader of the championship with 20 points is not here today with the big Gus Kuhn BMW, so Tony Holland (830 Norton Commando) with 16 points, Rob Prior (500 Kawasaki) 14 points and Tony Smith (830 Norton Commando) 12 points, will all be doing their level best to put as many points as they can between themselves and Sharpe before the fourth round at Oulton on August 30.

For production racers and fans alike, MCM's brand new championship heralds a major move forward in the development of a branch of the sport which up to now has taken a back seat at the circuits. The new series, which carries over £4,000 in prize money, is this year being run under the current ACU production racing rules with four modifications. The five year age limit rule on machines is waived. Fairings can't be used unless fitted as standard or listed as an optional extra. Street legal lighting must be fitted (except where it conflicts with track safety regulations), the fitting of big bore kits is banned.

To keep interest high and to add to the excitement, a handicapping system featuring a staggered start will be used.

Cash prizes offered in the series are the highest ever offered in production racing. In total, Motor Cycle Mechanics is putting up a cash prize fund of £2,300.

Several major companies in the motorcycle industry have also come into the championship with cash prizes and bonuses. To stimulate dealer interest in the championship, Honda, Suzuki, Kawasaki, Yamaha and Benelli have all put up £200 for the highest placed machine in the series of their manufacture entered by a dealer. Other firms offering cash prizes include Mick Walker, Duckhams, AGV, Cobra Luggage and Hondastyle clothing.



"Motor Cycle" International Sidecar Championship 104 • 45 mph.

This is the third year of the "Motor Cycle" International Sidecar Championship which, in 1975, was the closest fought of all the British road racing championships. It was decided only at the final round and then only by the fastest lap. That was set by George O'Dell with passenger Alan Gosling, who snatched the title from British Champion Mac Hobson and passenger Gordon Russell.

After such a successful series, it is natural that the format should be unchanged for 1976, with eight rounds, all at Motor Circuit Developments circuits.

The only difference is an increase in the prize fund, so that the winner of each round will get at least £125. The total fund has gone up to £3,738, making it the most lucrative sidecar championship in the world.

The series winner will get £500, with £250 for the runners-up, £100 for third and £75, £50 and £25 for the fourth to sixth outfits. Scoring is on world championship lines with 15-12-10-8-6-5-4-3-2-1 for the first 10 but with the addition of five points for the fastest lap at each circuit. All points scored will count towards the final total.

Double points will be awarded for both places and the fastest lap at the final round, at Brands Hatch on October 31.

Qualifying rounds are: April 16, Brands Hatch; April 19, Oulton Park; May 31, Brands Hatch; June 13, Mallory Park; July 11, Snetterton; August 30, Oulton Park; September 12, Mallory Park; October 31, Brands Hatch.





Notes for the meeting.

This was to be my last meeting as a Marshal. I was then off to work and college in parts of the country away from road race circuits.

The meeting was a good one to go out on marshalling at Riches Corner. The short circuit was used, i.e. the new straight, later named the Revett Straight after the sponsors – who were my local, Ipswich bike dealer.

The meeting incorporated the new Motorcycle Mechanics Production Series which provided a long overdue structure for production racing. The race had a handicap system for the different classes which led to Tom Pemberton (500 Kawasaki) winning the race from Pete 'PK' Davies (1000 Laverda). This race provided some excitement for us marshals when Malcolm Wheeler (863 Ducati) entered Riches on the first lap at a strange angle and crashed on the exit. The throttle had stuck open and he received a broken collar bone as a result.

In the ShellSport 500cc race we were treated to the rare site of Dave Croxford riding Percy Tait's Suzuki RG500. Percy had worked for Suzuki to improve the handling of the new RG500. The Cosworth-engined Norton Challenge was due to make an appearance at the meeting but was not raced. I'm fairly sure that this was Dave Croxford's last race appearance and Norton folded soon after.

In the 'Race of Aces' Barry Sheene was going well before crashing at Sears Corner having had a disk pad drop out of his brakes at Riches. I don't remember him having any injury and the run-off was fairly soft soil at Sears — usually used for growing a good crop of carrots! He probably withdrew from the rest of the meeting as this was the year that he was on his way to winning the first of his two 500cc world championships. Mick Grant (750 Kawasaki) went on to win the race at an average speed of 102.31 mph ahead of Steve Parrish (500 Suzuki) and Paul Smart (500 Suzuki). Barry Sheene and Florian Burki were attributed with a joint new lap record of 1m33.2s 104.67mph.

Dick Greasley / Cliff Holland (700 Chell Yamaha) won the sidecar final with a new fastest lap of 1m41.6s, 96.02 mph.

The Junior 350cc race was won by Tony Rutter (348 Yamaha) with a new lap record for 2nd placed Graham Hobbs.

Mick Grant rounded off a good day by winning the final event of the meeting from his Kawasaki team-mate Barry Ditchburn in second place with Roger Nicholls (700 Yamaha) third.
