Wimborne, and introduced races for schoolboys. On Sunday the Ringwood Schoolboy Scramble Club held its third club championship meeting at Matchams Park, once again the dusty conditions made the going very tough, Matchams is notorious and one of the most



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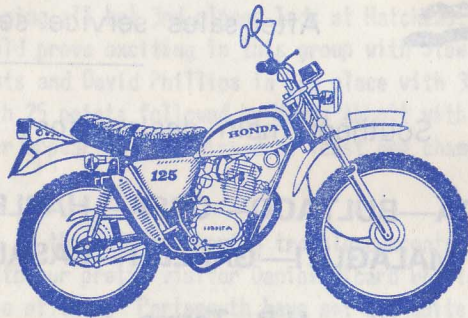

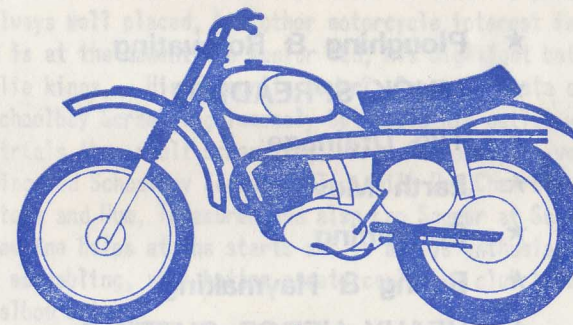
