### **Around the Centre**

Every time I seem to write these lines about someone or a particular point, by the time the next episode comes around the position has either completely reversed or the fellow concerned has a queer turn and starts riding like a complete idiot. Nevertheless the beauty about a monthly saga is not to have to be first with the news, and in line with the comics, completely inaccurate, but the opportunity to give the new deal a while to sort itself out and then kick the chair out as is often necessary. Sometimes however we come across some good news which in a country bent on backward motion makes a refreshing change and I suppose something along these lines must be the return to the Ossa Camp of Geoff Chandler. It will be recalled that the ex every camp rider, did in fact have a brief spell on one under the Driver/Gollner/Whitlock banner, to fill in while the experimental Rickman was being hashed or hushed, one or the other anyway. The sum result then was two national successes, hitherto unrepeated, although a championship win on the Mont was achieved. Just whether his new I.S.D.T. lease of life will be detrimental to the balance stuff remains to be seen, but if nothing else he has become the first Centre rider to be picked to represent the old Uny Jay in the international for a long time and that in itself is a fine achievement.

Now and again a sequence of events highlights just what a load of mugs we are when led by the hand of someone of high standing. If I thought for a moment that Sammy Miller was asked to fill in a few years by Honda, immediately after he left Ariels or whoever was employing him in the Birmingham area at that time, then we could accept that we had all been taken in the biggest possible way. I realise he could not have marketed H.T.5 replicas in sufficient numbers, but to sell the Spanish Two Stroke to even the Spaniards, in what must be thousands and thousands, when all along a much modified Enfield Crusader engine

would have done must rate as the major eye wink of the century. Just think in a years time if replicas of the Honda are available, how impossible it will be to talk strokers to Ralph Venables, in fact it wouldn't surprise me to learn he is behind it all. Anyway back we must go again eventually I suppose, for it is not like Sam to back losers, even if we finally end up on fivehundreds.

There has been much talk about starting methods at race meetings, and invariably the system has matched the talk. One type that has yet to be tried was witnessed at close range recently, and I would therefore like to digress and describe the Launch Start. The scene of the demo, had P.J in pole position at a red light junction with one of the new mood motorcycle moped runners alongside awaiting the off, each intent on being first away. My fellow competitor was in fact a neatly turned out office type, with brief case etc. lashed to the rear mudguard and helmet placed in such a way that the learner plates were a foregone conclusion. His machine was one of those clutchless types and was poised on the stand with the countdown well under way. At amber brolly almighy heaved with both feet and thus we have the launch type start. The wobble our friend got into could be, I am sure, perfected without the mass dabbing session he embarked upon, though to be fair the bollards he wrapped himself around as his final parting, would not be part of any normal course.

The Welsh Two Day event has always been a popular flog with centre people, and this year was no exception. Penny Page swept aside the female opposition to make best performance in that class and Ivor Thick and Dave Tomlins were well up the Silver lists, indeed very creditable performances. The Hants Police expended their duty frustrations so well that both Dave Strong and Derek Jones were not very far off Gold Standard. And so we come to those illustrious demon Welsh hillside racers, Geoff Chandler who was fifth in the solos and George Greenland and Bob Colein second and fifth in the threewheeler class. To set off against the clock into the unknown takes some bravery as well as a degree of fruit cake, but to sit in a mobile orange box while some comedian rings out the carrots does not do anything but bring a sense of horror to mind. Really must be getting old. Talking of sidecars I see Colin Longfellow is now regularly competing in trials in this form, having already won his Novice Premier at Horsham recently assisted by Colin Edwards. To the latter gentleman I would suggest he be most careful at any water sections.

The fivehundred at Doddington turned out to be a doddle for the title chasers and a doodle for the home sorti. With Vic Allan set to be the first ever double British title holder, and he not eligible for anything but prestige, it was not really surprising that the spectators had so little to shout about, which was a shame after the Portsmouth meeting when we all found our so long dormant voices. On the home front, the Centre Solo Titles went to adjoining centre people, but John Turner was by far the quickest sidecar, thus reaping his just reward, though I did hear the fastest person all day was John Mould in an effort to get to work on time.

### BOARD COMMENTARY

The Board met on 4th July, 1974, at Southampton Headquarters by the Club's kind invitation. Thank you, Southampton. We remembered the late Vic Kendall (late Secretary - Weymouth) with a silent vigil minute. Our other George (Hodges) again deputised for Joe Caslake who was gaining strength slowly, but was home. Our other Senior Officer, Peter Ryall, is still very ill. "We had our differences Peter, but WE ALL do wish you well again, and our thoughts are with you and your wife and family."

Our Headmaster then called the Register, revealing that Board Meetings are a tonic for invalids as our late Chairman, Arthur Lambert and his Lady were present, together with 12 Officers, 52 Delegates, representing 25 Clubs. The Continent (Isle of Wight) represented by our Southern Centre George (Allen).

White Horse suggests a grand total of those present would be an appreciation of those who attend as non-delegates.

Apologies were called for with the names of Messrs. Caslake, Ryall, Goss, Hall, Mellors and Clubs, Sturminster Newton, Aldermaston and Sarum.

Vice-President George Hodges presented Scrutineers Arm bands to the successful and unselfish graduates, as per July Gazette. Competition Chairman, Tony Bellinger, reminded them, in the kindest way, of their duties and limitations, assuring them of Competition Committee and Centre Board full support. All were present less those on a club working party.

Minutes were read by one and only Mrs. Steele (How do you put up with us?) and approved subject to slight substitution in status.

George, having done his royal stint, handed our Premier Brett (Imagine Roy at No. 10) for matters arising. The South-West Sports Council acknowledged our letter with statement of difficulties with their Constitution hinder our suggestion, but will try. Their next meeting is at Torquay, 26/27th October and "just a minute Mr. Chairman, F. J. R. will attend, if possible. Confirmation ah August Board".

Winchester's King Alfred Pip was aggrieved, and the Premier took him to smoke the peace pipe with the Keeper of Tower of London Rendell, re. missing footstool. Report at next session of Parliament.

National Rally was expounded by its Champion, George Allen, who said there was a bigger entry, with the later start, as he had forcast. Tony Bellinger said **London** were dragging their heels with information, but George Allen assured him information was in post, and some Clubs stated that they had received their instructions in the last 24 hours. Maybe the Post Office Mule Train is lost in Ringwood Forest, Tony.

School Marm **Broad** then took the floor (not literally) and read the correspondence. Primary case ruling revert to 1973 Regulations. No reflection on Centre Scrutineers Wimborne and/or **Sir Viv. Debben. Mr. Grass Track** proposed rescinding of Centre Ruling, which was carried.

Literature for Silverstone British Grand Prix was available at Top Table.

Ken Heanes asked for International Six Days Trial support and we are to donate £25. Mr. Steward (the late Brian Steward's son) had proffered an opposite class trophy, and six subsequent replicas for St. Pauls Trophy. Approved by our

X.H.G. applied for Closed to Club Grass Track Permit for Saturday, 3rd August. Approved, with Harry Bone Centre Steward. Wimborne have changed 4th August Grass Track Championship venue to Horton, NOT Manor Farm, Little Canford, Wimborne.

How about purchasing a Wrestling Ring? Well we could have made good use of it. Contestants - Bishops Waltham (less Harry and Vera) and Jem May and Eastern Area Clubs. All settled during the interval. Bishops Waltham will not prejudice other Eastern Area Clubs opportunities to retaining and/or acquiring venues. Thanks to Roy, Roger and Tony, who have offered Bishops Waltham a venue. Tony Bellinger, Competition Committee's offered us their perusal of the Minutes of 17th June.

Winchester reported Grass Track Championships progressing well. Advertising available, help required on day.

Southern Echo newspaper was given bad publicity to School Scrambling. Delegate will make approach.

Gosport's Grass Track 18th August Meeting has been cancelled.

The Board Meeting finished officially at 22.45 hrs. but chat chat was still going until midnight.


