

Apologies were received from Messrs. Kendell and Smith, of whom, we were informed, the latter would be along later, to do his stuff.

Mr. Mitchell (you'd never believe how he gets on to me) read the minutes, which were accepted, and Vice-Chairman Ron Baines took the chair.

Arising (1) Centre Scramble Championships organised by the Weymouth Club, accounts submitted, but it was agreed to wait until next month, when we hope the club will be represented at Wimbourne, to give them our official thanks.

- (2) National Grass Track Championships awards, won by the Southern Centre team, had been received from the A.-C.U. George Allan said the centre was not represented at the last G.T. sub-committee, but, at the next meeting, November 27th, if the G.T. committee (S.C.) could not be represented by a member, Mr. Browning would be willing to go.
- (3) Farnham Royal trial discussed last time, police consent had been obtained.
- (4) Secretary Ryall said some applications for Temporary Course Certificates (T.C.C.) had been returned, as they had not been accompanied by the old Temporary Track Certificate (T.T.C.). Oh well, M.A.I. (marvellous, ain't it?).

BOARD COMMENTARY—continued

Mr. Mitchell read a report on the last Competitions Committee, arising from which there was a discussion about the large number of non starters among the Novice class, which deprived others who would ride from getting a chance. It was an offence for an entrant not to start and fail to give a satisfactory explanation. More on this matter elsewhere. Allied to this problem was the complaint laid by the Farnham club against the South Newbury club, which had been fully investigated by the Comps Committee and a report sent to Farnham, who had apparently accepted it

The keeping of a register of courses used by clubs, whether they had applied for the new T.C.C's. or not, by the Secretary, was agreed to.

Les Smith had arrived, and he now took over the Chair, just in time for the Roll Call. Officers present, a full house—Messrs. Caslake, Smith, Allan, Baines, Goss, Hodges, Jones, Mason, Ryall, Mitchell. Clubs—Alton, Andover, Basingstoke, Bishops Waltham, Blackmore Vale, C.S.M.A. Southampton (surprise, surprise), Gosport, Mortimer, Reading Ace, Ringwood, Southampton, Southampton Vikings, South Newbury, Sturminster Newton, Waterlooville, Winchester, X.H.G. Tigers.

Transfer of Swindon M.C.C. to the Southern Centre was agreed. George Allan said he was privileged to speak to this motion, and the Newbury Club representative spoke of the sportsmanship of the members of the Swindon club, and also welcomed them.

After the recess, the Calendar for 1961 was considered and approved, with the addition of two Grass Track dates for Andover, whose attendance at the dates meeting had been frustrated by floods. George Hodges received approval to publish his now famous pocket edition of the Calendar.

Arising from the dates there was a Notice of Motion from the West Area regarding a committee to deal with events applying for T.V. coverage.

Progress Report—Team Trial to be organised in the West Area, no offers as yet, Trial Sub-committee to look into.

Next meeting of the Board, agreed to Wimbourne, on December 1st. Correspondence. Letter from Stag, asking approval for trial in the Bracknell area, December 4th and January 29th agreed.

Letter from North Berks, requesting support for their O.T.C. Trial, October 29th, to be promoted to Spec. Res. It was pointed out that A.-C.U. Ruling states that any new applicant for higher status must submit the Stewards' reports for the last three events, and that an A.-C.U. observer must have been invited to the last event.

Letter from North Hants (that man Hall again) Scramble on 4th Sundays in January and February owing to course problems, would like to run on the 3rd Sundays. As they would not interfere with any other scramble, approval was given.

Any other business. Query regarding Grass Track Riders' Status. Mike Lane was recorder, it was not known whether his records were up to date.

T.V. Scramble, January 1st, 1961. Neville Goss states that Winchester course had been first choice, but was not suitable; so probable course would be that of the Weymouth club, approval was given for the Secretary to issue the necessary permit.

Charlie and his Dinner, Friday, January 13th (there's a combination) South Newbury also thanked the Newbury club for the use of their track, in place of the Midgham track, which had been lost to them.

Letter from Petersfield about a competitor who had entered events as a member of their club; he was not a member, never had been a member. Referred to Comps Committee.

Complaint from Alton about the use of Southern Centre territory by South Eastern clubs, in the Kingsley-Broxhead area, twice a month, throughout the year, causing annoyance to local residents who were blaming the Alton club. Also interfering with events organised by the club, by two trials being held in the same area on the same day. It was pointed out that W.D. property in that area was administered by a committee of the S.E. Centre, and the War Office did not care how many times it was used, as long as they collected the lolly.

Meeting closed at 10.25 p.m. with thanks to the Southampton club for their hospitality.



ACCEPTANCE OF ENTRIES

"Sorry, Entry list over-subscribed and your entry is returned herewith". How our Novice scramblers came to hate that phrase during the 1960 season.

A big moan was that some riders never received the Regulations early enough to allow their entries to have a fair chance of acceptance. In the worst cases, entry lists were filled even before regulations were published in the "Gazette".

The cure for the problem does, of course, rest entirely with the promoters, but the Centre Competitions Committee encourages the use of an opening date for acceptance of entries.

Each set of Regulations should state both a closing date and an opening date, which is at least 7 days after publication of the Regulations.

The Comps Committee interprete the use of an opening date this way:—

Following the issue of the Regulations, entries will be collected but no action will be taken until the declared "opening date". On this date acceptance of entries will be made and the riders notified. In the event of the entry list being over-subscribed on the opening date, then the Committee recommend a ballot to decide the places to be filled.

The Committee deplore the practice of not accepting entries until the opening date, as this creates the ridiculous situation of riders trying to anticipate the vagaries of the G.P.O. in order to ensure that their entries are delivered exactly on the opening date.

A word of warning to the riders is: Always read the regulations carefully as the Clubs promoting the event may choose to apply the opening date in a different form to this recommendation.

1. ANNOUNCEMENT: The South Reading Motor Cycle Club as a Constituent Club of the S.E. Centre of the A.-C.U. will hold on Sunday, 1st January, 1961, a Regional Restricted Trial for Motorcycles with or without sidecars, but having one driven wheel only.

2. JURISDICTION: The event will be open to all registered members of the constituent clubs of the Southern Centre, South Eastern Centre, and will be held under the G.C.R.'s. of

the A.-C.U. and these Supplementary Regulations.

3. ENTRIES: Will be accepted forthwith and must be sent on the printed Entry Form provided with the correct remittance to H. L. Shepherd, "Oakridge," Arbor Lane, Winnersh, Berks, to reach him not later than FIRST POST, MONDAY, 17th DECEMBER, 1960. A ballot will be taken for the first 50 solo numbers.

The remaining numbers will be allocated in the order the entries are received. Solo entries will be limited to the first 150; sidecar entries will be limited to the first 30. The promoters reserve the right to refuse any entry without assigning a reason.

Entry fees will only be returnable if the event is abandoned, or postponed for more than

(i) Best performance by a driver entering as a Southern Centre club member—Plaque.

(j) Best performance by a driver entering as a S. Reading Club Member—Mrs. Salmon Cup and Replica.

Note: All challenge cup winners will receive a replica. Awards (a) to (f) and (j) are challenge cups to be held for one year. No awards will be made to any other drivers than those set out above nor to any driver who has not completed the course in accordance with the regulations and conditions laid down.

With the exception of the team award, no driver may win more than one award. Awards (c) to (f) are subject to a minimum of six entries.

8. MARKING: Marks will be lost:—

1 Mark for a dab in an observed section or sub-section.

3 Marks for footing in an observed section or sub-section.

5 Marks for stopping in an observed section or sub-section.

5 Marks for missing an observed section or sub-section.

A dab will be deemed to have occurred if any part of the driver or passenger comes into contact with the ground once in any observed section or sub-section. Footing will be deemed to have occurred if any part of the driver or passenger comes into contact with the ground more than once in any observed section or sub-section. A stop will be deemed to have occurred if the machine ceases to move in a forward direction in relation to the course or if the driver or passenger dismounts or receives outside assistance, or if one or more wheels crosses or breaks a tape defining the course or strikes a boundary card. A competitor stopping in a sub-section must restart within the boundaries of the same sub-section.

9. **DESCRIPTION:** The Trial will start from California in England at 10.01 a.m. The course will be about 25 - 30 miles in length in the Aborfield Mortimer area and will be of a sporting nature. The first sidecar will leave the start at 10.01 a.m., the remainder at one-minute intervals. The first solo will leave the start at 10.31 a.m., the remainder at minute intervals. Any driver not coming to the start when called will be penalised 5 marks. Drivers more than 30 minutes late at the start will be deemed non-starters.

There will be no time checks during the Trial, but the course must be covered at approximate speed of 15 m.p.h. A back marker will start 30 minutes after the last driver. Any driver passed by him will be deemed to have retired. In the event of official delay, the back marker will make the necessary allowance.

10. TIES: A special test will be used to decide ties:

From line 'A' with engine running, proceed to and stop between line 'B' and 'C' stop engine, select neutral; restart engine and proceed to and cross line 'D'—fastest time from 'A' to 'D' to count. In the event of the special test failing to decide a tie the order of merit shall be:—

- (a) The driver completing the greatest number of sections or sub-sections "Clean."
- (b) The driver who travels furthest round the course before losing marks, and if still equal loses less when first penalised.
- (c) If the two machines are in different capacity classes the driver of the small capacity class machine.

11. VEHICLES:

- (a) Must comply with the legal requirements for the use on the road.
- (b) Non-skid appliances and sidecar wheel drive are prohibited.
- (c) Only tyres which conform to the A.-C.U. Specification and are included in the list of "approved" tyres published by the A.-C.U. may be used or permitted. The treads must not be cut or altered in any way.
- (d) Sidecars must have an adequate body having a seat with a back of not less than 12" (twelve inches) high.
- 12. DRIVERS MUST BE FULLY INSURED against Third Party Risks while riding in the competition.
- 13. COMPETITION NUMBERS will be issued at the start. Each driver will be required to sign on at start 30 minutes before his starting time, and off at the finish of the trial. Any driver failing to sign on or off will be excluded.

Each competitor will receive a programme by Friday, 30th December, 1960.

- 14. ROUTEMARKING will be carried out in the usual manner with RED (turn right) BLUE (turn left) and WHITE (straight on) Direction Cards; no route card will be issued. The onus of finding the route rests entirely with the driver.
- 15. PROTESTS: These shall be made in writing in accordance with the G.C.R.'s. of the A.-C.U., accompanied by a fee of 10/- to the clerk of the course, within five days of the publication of the provisional results.
- 16. POSTPONEMENTS: The promoters reserve the right to postpone or abandon the trial subject to the provisions of the G.C.R.'s. of the A.-C.U.
