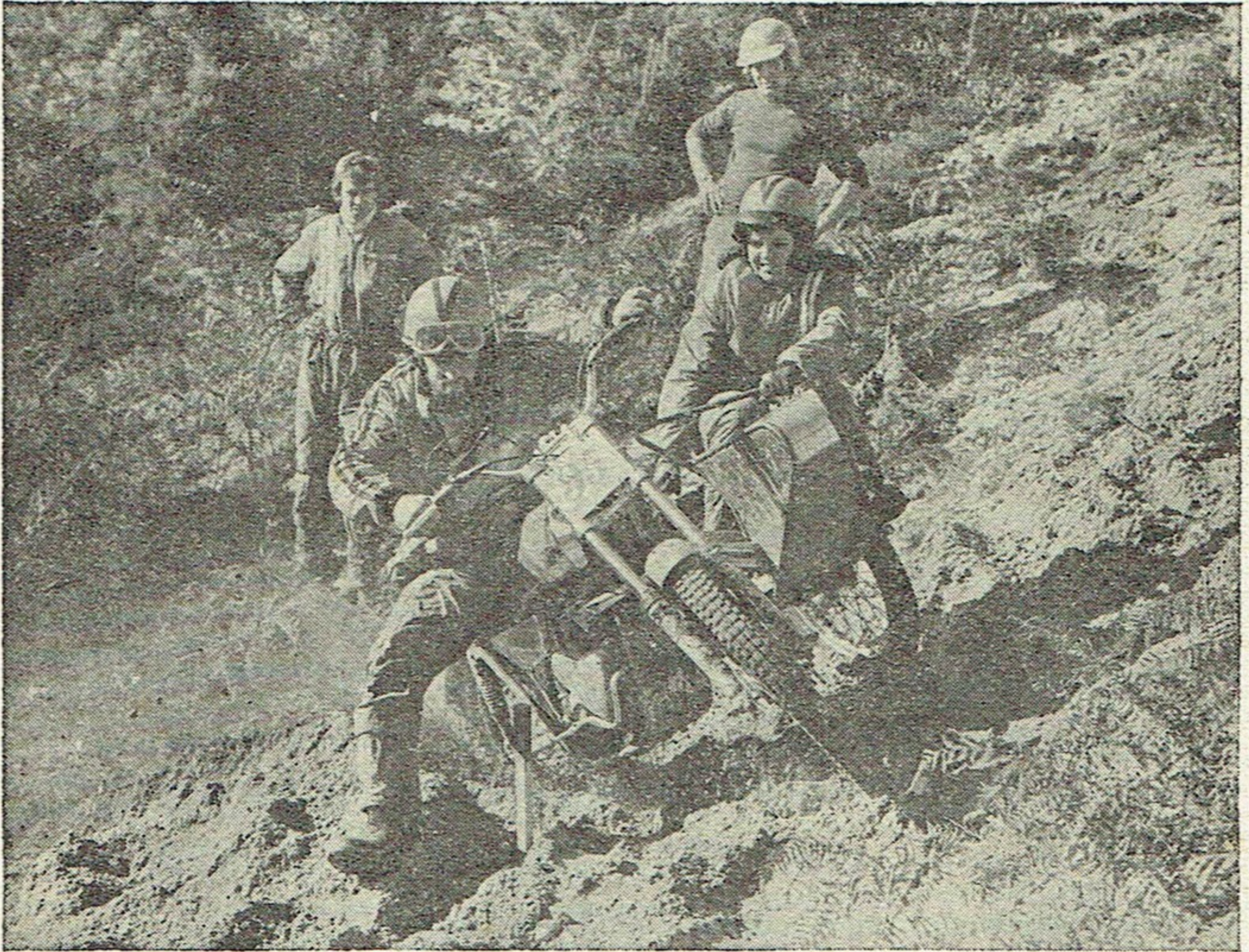

The Annual General Meeting was opened by Vice-President G. Hodges, with 16 Officers present, with 27 Clubs, represented by 70 Delegates with a host of camp followers. The Minutes of the last Annual General Meeting were adopted, after "Uncle Blackmore Jim" pointed out the Sunday Annual General Meeting advantages.

"Scrooge" Gale explained the Centre Auditors' Balance Sheet which was adopted with typographical modifications.

The election of Officers brought our very popular Neville to be our New President. Congratulations Neville, you will truly follow the only two previous and worthy Presidents, the late Joe Caslake and the late "Squire" Farquharson of Blackmore Vale. The Vice-Presidents remain the same, except that John Bussell steps into Neville Goss's Vice-President's shoes.

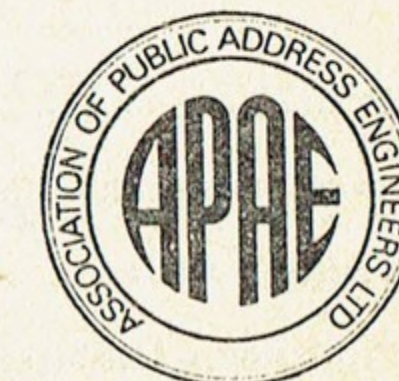

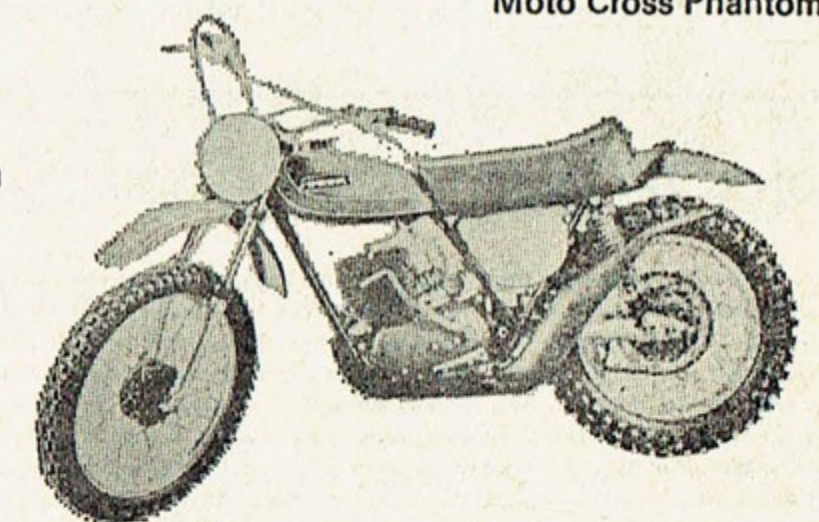

- Jurisdiction:** This event will be open to all registered drivers riding solo machines who are members of clubs in the Southern and South Eastern Centres and will be held under the G.C.Rs. and the S.Rs. for Trials of the Supplementary Regulations.
- Entries:** Will be limited to the first 150 received. Entries must be sent on the form provided to the Secretary of the Meeting accompanied by the correct remittance and TWO S.A.Es. to reach the not before 7th February and not later than 15th March, 1976. Riding numbers will be allocated by ballot for the first 50 received, the remainder in strict order of arrival. Intermediates will be classed as Experts for this Trial.
- Entry Fees:** Individual Entry Fee—£1.25. Club team comprising three drivers—45p.
- Course:** Start and Finish will be at Charity Farm, Selborne, Hampshire (signed at East Tisted on A.32 Alton—Fareham and at B.3006 junction on A.325 at Greatham). The course is entirely on private land and will consist of two laps of about 4½ miles. Observed section boundaries will be defined with white marker cards and/or tape. The first driver will leave the start at 12.00 noon, the remainder at half minute intervals. THE TIME ALLOWED TO COMPLETE EACH LAP WILL BE AS FOLLOWS: 1st LAP—Two hours, 15 minutes THEN ONE POINT PENALTY FOR EACH MINUTE LATE UP TO MAXIMUM OF 15, AFTER WHICH THE DRIVER WILL BE EXCLUDED. 2nd LAP—Two hours THEN PENALTIES AS FOR LAP ONE. 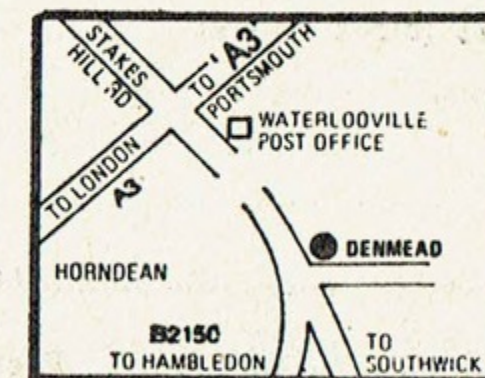

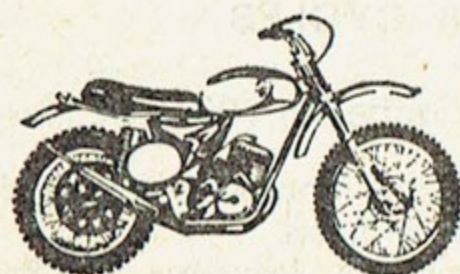

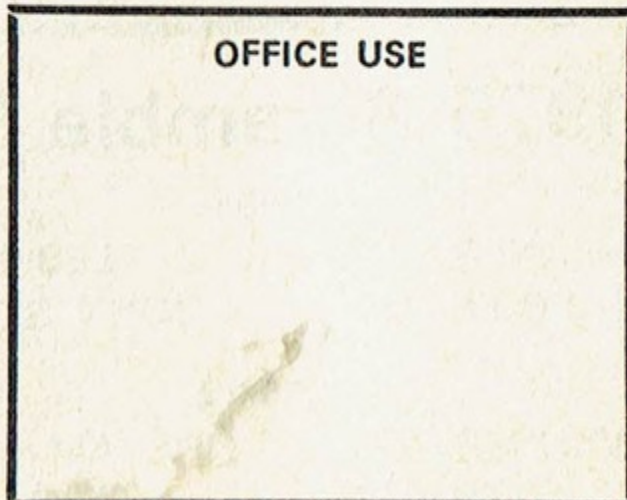
