


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THE TROPHIES

The Mellano (Hutchinson) Trophy, to be held for one year with memento for retention, will be awarded to the driver whose average race speed exceeds the existing lap record by the greatest margin, or if no driver exceeds his class lap record to the driver whose average race speed is nearer to the class record than those of drivers in other classes. The competition for this trophy will be arranged to cover the whole meeting and should any driver be competing in more than one capacity class, solo or sidecar, then his best performance only will be considered. (Current holder: J. M. Redman).

The Daily Express Trophy (presented by the Daily Express), to be won outright. Will be awarded to the winner of the Daily Express 500 c.c. Trophy Race and the B.M.C.R.C. 500 c.c. Championship Race. (Current holder: D. W. Minter).

The A.M.C Challenge Trophy (presented by Associated Motor Cycles Ltd.), to be held for one year with memento for retention, will be awarded to the winner of the Daily Express 500 c.c. Trophy Race and the B.M.C.R.C. 500 c.c. Championship Race. (Current holder: D. W. Minter).

The Avon Trophy (presented by the Avon India Rubber Co. Ltd.), to be held for one





Today at Silverstone the British Motor Cycle Racing Club will be staging its 32nd International "Hutchinson 100" Road Race Meeting. Affectionately known as the "Hutch" it will be staged once again over the 2.927 miles Silverstone Grand Prix circuit, and will be sponsored by the "Daily Express."

Among the 170 entry are some of the worlds greatest riders, all battling for the most prized trophy in British Motor Cycle Racing—the Mellano trophy which was presented to the Club by the Hutchinson Tyre Co. in 1925.

Today may bring a new phase in the history of the "Hutch," only once before has it been won by one rider on three occasions—Cecil Sandford in 1953, '56 and '57. Riding today is current 250 and 350 c.c. world champion, Southern Rhodesian, Jim Redman, M.B.E., leader of the Japanese "Honda" team. Redman won the Mellano trophy in 1962, and last year on 250 c.c. Honda 'fours,' and he will be racing today to make it a first-time hat-trick on the 350 c.c. Honda 'four'—the machine which brought him the 350 c.c. world championship last year.

However, it is no foregone conclusion that Redman will achieve his goal. The entry for every class at this meeting is as good as any meeting ever staged in this country.

For the first time today there will be a 50 c.c. race—unfortunately for the riders in this category, the Mellano trophy cannot go to any of them as the regulations to win it deal directly with the existing class record and obviously no record yet exists for these machines.

Heading them however, will be two of the strongest worlds contenders from the West German Kreidler factory—Hans Georg Anscheidt and Luigi Taveri. The 50 c.c. race will be staged over 6 laps and it will be very interesting to see how these twelve-speed lightweights progress.

The first class where the Mellano trophy stands vulnerable is the 125 c.c. To win the Mellano trophy a driver must win his race at a speed which comes

closest to, or exceeds by the greatest margin, the existing class lap record. The 125 c.c. lap record has stood to Mike Hailwood, riding an Italian Ducati, since 1960, who went round in 0.8 secs., a speed of 87.22 miles per hour.

It is difficult to imagine, even though it is four years later, that anybody could average a higher speed than this, but amongst the riders in today's race is Alan Shepherd who will be racing a works M.Z. two stroke from East Germany. Challenging him will be the Japanese works Hondas, ridden by the 1961 world champion, Luigi Taveri, Tommy Robb and Ralph Bryans from Northern Ireland. And they will be backed by Southern Rhodesian, Bruce Beale, a rider who is being sponsored privately on Hondas this year by Jim Redman. With them too will be Derek Minter riding Fron Purslow's private Honda.

In recent years the 250 c.c. category has highlighted international racing—particularly the world championships and today's race is no less significant, for it is in this class that we have the largest selection of different machines. Outstanding amongst them once again is Alan Shepherd, who will be riding yet another works M.Z. and he will be opposed by Robb, Bryans, Taveri and Beale, on their quarter litre Hondas but the race will be quarter litre Hondas, but the race will be no foregone conclusion in their favour as the opposition against them will be far stronger in this class today than it has been for a long time, for quite a number of machines racing are new for the 1964 season. For the first time here at Silverstone will be Phil Read on his works Yamaha twin and the 250 Spanish works Bultaco's to be ridden by New Zealander, Ginger Malloy and Ken Martin. These 'bikes replace the 196 c.c. racers which have done so well during the past couple of years and now promise to be far more competitive and reliable with the addition of water cooling. Third place finisher in the I.o.M. T.T. last year is Bill Smith from Chester, who will be racing Reg Dearden's ex-works Italian

Mondial—which was formerly raced and owned by Mike Hailwood and originally in 1957 by Tarquinio Provini. There will also be, and most welcomed, a strong force of British machines, the success of which remains to be seen. Leading them will be Derek Minter with a Cotton and John Hartle with the new Royal Enfield—the two riders who are the current absolute motor cycle lap record holders of this course at 100.51 m.p.h. (which they set up on 500 c.c. Nortons in 1961). The engines of these 250 machines are in fact identical, being single cylinder Villiers 'Starmaker' two strokes. John Hartle will be alone on the Royal Enfield, which is a prototype production racer, but Minter will be backed by last years Junior Manx Grand Prix winner Peter Darvill on another Cotton.

Matched against these machines particularly will be the Greeves racers of Joe Dunphy, Dave Simmonds and Reg Everett, and will be a battle worth watching, for the Thundersley Greeves factory has dropped Villiers engines in favour of their own product and the success of this venture can only be estimated on results.

Both bigger classes, the 350 and 500 c.c. events, contain all the British talent and most of the foreign as well. Mike Hailwood, John Hartle, Derek Minter, Phil Read, Joe Dunphy, Paddy Driver, Jack Findlay, Dan Shorey, Tony Godfrey, Lewis Young, Peter Bettison, Griff Jenkins, John Cooper and Mike Duff are but some of the stars.

So far as the 350 c.c. class is involved Jim Redman and his Honda 'four' have no opposition unless Tom Kirby's 350 c.c. special is completed in time and hopefully appears on the starting line.

This machine is a private project inspired by this enthusiastic Hornchurch dealer, which he hopes will be Britain's answer to any foreign 350 c.c. menace. He has certainly backed a worthy pilot to ride it. If it comes to the starting line, Mike Hailwood will be in the saddle.


The 500 c.c. class will bring the appearance of another remarkable machine, but not one that is futuristic. Canadian Mike Duff will be riding one of the memorable A.J.S. Porucpine twins, the first time one of these machines has been raced since 1954. The Porcupine is now owned by Tom Arter of Barham, Kent, who has been responsible for putting this machine back into racing trim. It will be interesting to see how the Porcupine compares with present day machinery.

It must be remembered of course that Mike Hailwood's machine for the 500 race also stems from a ten year vintage and it would be interesting to know, in theory, which of the two is the oldest machine in the race.

There is also a strong foreign entry in this class, Ernst Weiss, Swiss champion; Ernst Hiller, ex-works B.M.W. rider from Germany; Roland Foell from Switzerland; Jan Nielson from Denmark; Garry Dickson from New Zealand; Walter Schiemann from Germany; Ken King from Canada; Bo Granath from Sweden; Gyula Marsovszky from Switzerland, a Hungarian refugee; Hans Svennson and Jack Lindh from Sweden.

The Sidecar entry looks like that for the T.T. leading the list is Florian Camathias from Switzerland, who has entered an unspecified machine—the origin of which we are left to guess at for the moment. Florian, runner up in so many world championships will be competing against Max Deubel, current world champion from Germany; Georg Auerbacher from Germany; Fritz Scheidegger from Switzerland; Otto Kolle from Switzerland; Barry Thompson from Australia; Tony Schmitz from Germany; Ray Pollard from South Africa; Edgar Strub from Switzerland; and from our own shores 'Pip' Harris, Jackie Beeton, Chis Vincent, Charlie Freeman, Owen Greenwood, Bill Boddice, Colin Seeley, Alan Birch and Mick Rowell.

Truly a magnificent world class entry second to none.
