



## WELCOME, THE UNSPOILED AMATEURS

Silverstone becomes the most important motorsport venue in Britain today for all Silverstone becomes the most important the exceptional competitors who will be racing in this last stage of the Marlboro-

For them, it is the ultimate challenge, the final phase of a season of speed that has powered through circuits at Snetterton, Thruxton, Donington Park, Cadwell Park

And if there were medals to be awarded for courage, determination, a will-to-win when the odds seem loaded against you, then there would be a long line of

There is a sound reason why they call this encounter "The Clubmans Wembley". It's His, and Hers, long-awaited day. Win or lose, there is still the big chance to get out there, on Britain's fastest circuit, and try to prove yourself. To have a go, and whether you finish a race or whether you don't, to be able to say: "I've raced over

Some of those 400 riders, who set off on the Road to Silverstone in the opening round at Snetterton last March, have not been able to reach this last leg. There have

been injuries, broken machinery, lack of cash.

But Kent's 22-year-old Stuart Melen sparked off his first success in the competitive 250 Production category at the Norfolk circuit, and went on to claim further victories at Thruxton, Donington and Lydden. Busy lad. He has combined his 250 bid with a double challenge in the 350 Production class.

Melen has already won the 250 crown, now he goes for the 350 title against his

No. 1 opponent Andy Muggleton of Leicester.

Another outstanding prospect is Yorkshire's 19-year-old Steve Patrickson, winner of the Marlboro-Dunlop-Express 125 championship here last season. This year Patrickson, a former British Junior 50 cc champion, who scored 56 wins in 1983, has

concentrated on the 250 Open series. Here he races against Sheffield's talented 26year-old Dave Quarmby, fifth in the 250 final last year. Dave's major objective is to win his first Marlboro championship.

If you are looking for an example of that precious stuff called self-motivation, then David Leach, a 21-year-old welder from Halifax could be your man. David scored his

fifth Clubmans championship win, and with it the 350 title, at Mallory Park.

After practising for the Manx Grand Prix on the Isle of Man, Dave pushed his Yamaha to the Manx ferry at Douglas and journeyed to Liverpool, where he set out for Mallory in a friend's van. He was determined to wrap up the 350 series before the final round. Last year he won the 350 final at Silverstone, but finished fourth in the championship.

Following his victory at Mallory Dave returned to the Manx to compete in the

Junior and Lightweight races. If at first you don't succeed...

It is not only those at the top of the championship tables who help to keep these talent-seeking races in top gear. Like Laura Brightman, a 24-year-old landscape gardener from Bedford, who must deserve a special place in the record book.

Laura not only races solo in the 350 Production class, she also competes as a passenger with Dave Arch in the Daily Express Sidecar Championship. And it becomes a real family battle when Laura races against her brother Duncan, another

350 Production challenger.

Please note, also, the husband and wife team of Geoff and Lynn Gregg, from Leicester. They earned a Centurion Helmets award at Oulton Park for finishing second in the Daily Express Sidecar Championship behind the Kent-based series

winners, Gary Thomas and Richard Hall.

The battle of the "chairs", which includes a welcome £500 cheque from the Daily Express, has included brave Tony Calvey from Surrey, and his little passenger Eddie Scott, a naval architect from Ayrshire. Calvey has been striving to get another 750 Yamaha engine in time for Silverstone, after his power unit had ceased during testing. Tony had his left leg amputated after a bad motorcycle accident nine years ago. It cost him two years in hospital. He races without his artificial replacement.

The Clubmans sidecar class has produced flag-wavers like Keith Cousins and Mick Barton, who went on to become respective European champions in 1983 and 1982. And Steve Webster, third at West Germany's Nurburgring World Championship

meeting last May.

Helping today's Clubmans riders to become our Stars of Tomorrow is what this series is all about. They are an important part of the future of the sport. The attempt to strengthen these grass roots started six years ago, when Marlboro, the Daily Express and the Auto-Cycle Union combined to launch this new Clubmans series.

They never expected it to be a press-button start, which would produce ready-made world-beaters. On two wheels and four, getting a place among the works-supported teams is a mighty big task for any starlet. You need to be a Pools winner, as well as being a proven race winner.

So, what has the Marlboro-Dunlop-Express series crusade achieved so far? I put that question to Peter De Ritter, the Auto-Cycle Union's diligent Road Race Manager, who covers a wide area of motorcycle racing, both in this country and abroad.

He observes not only the British riders who compete at Grand Prix level, but also

those you will see here today, making up the nursery end of the sport.

It is part of Peter's job to confirm which British riders will start in our Marlboro British Grand Prix at Silverstone. Some have an automatic acceptance through the position they have achieved on the Grading List of the sport's governing body, the Federation International Motocycliste.

Should any of these graded riders be unable to enter the British Grand Prix, Peter selects another graded substitute. So, he understands the National and International

scene. Says Peter.

"The Marlboro-Dunlop-Express Championship is like a mini grand prix series within the United Kingdom. For the Clubman racer – and there are more than 4,000



"The championship acts as a sort of racing scholarship, which gives the Clubman a chance to extend his field of competition. He can race on nine different circuits, travelling over a wide radius, from Scotland, Ireland, Wales, the Isle of Man and throughout England.

"It can be a valuable preparation for those who will choose to go on and join the professionals of the Grand Prix Circus, who cover thousands of miles each year.

"There is also an admirable Olympic spirit about the Clubmans efforts. They race for the love of the sport. For most of them it is a constant struggle against the ever-increasing costs of machinery, spares and travel. So, the financial rewards, which the Championship offers, are a great help to many shoe-string budgets."

After today's Final, a panel of judges will select the solo rider who is considered to

have made the most meritorious performance throughout the competition.

He is awarded the title of Marlboro-Dunlop-Express Champion of Champions, and a new 250 cc racing Yamaha, worth around £5,000.

Another splendid incentive for the prospective champion is the additional prize of a

Dunlop race tyre contract for the 1985 season, worth up to £3,000.

This is Dunlop's generous way of celebrating the success of Eddie Lawson, who has won the World 500 Road Racing title on their tyres. A forward-thinking decision that will be applauded by all motorcycle enthusiasts.

Yet another important addition to the Clubmans championship has been the active support of Centurion Helmets. They have been keen observers at every round of the series, where they have donated their Marlboro liveried Firebird helmets to the outstanding riders in both solo and sidecar classes.

Fourth in last year's series having contested only half of the rounds, this very talented rider has an equally important facet to his character - his single minded deter-




