

The Mellano (Hutchinson) Trophy, to be held for one year with memento for retention, will be awarded to the driver whose average race speed exceeds the existing class lap record by the greatest margin, or, if no driver exceeds his class lap record, to the driver whose average race speed is nearer to the class lap record than those of the drivers in other classes. The competition for this trophy will be arranged to cover the whole meeting, and should any driver be competing in more than one capacity class, solo or sidecar, then his best performance only will be considered.

The A.M.C. Challenge Trophy (presented by Associated Motor Cycles Ltd.), to be held for one year with memento for retention, will be awarded to the winner of the 1,000 c.c. B.M.C.R.C. Championship race.

The Avon Trophy (presented by the Avon India Rubber Co., Ltd.), to be held for one year with replica for retention, will be awarded to the winner of the 350 c.c. B.M.C.R.C. Championship race.

The Dunlop Trophy (presented by the Dunlop Rubber Co., Ltd.), to be held for one year with memento for retention, will be awarded to the winner of the 250 c.c. Championship race.

The George Reynolds Memorial Trophy, to be held for one year with memento for retention, will be awarded to the driver making the fastest lap of the day.

The Dennis Lashmar Challenge Trophy, to be held for one year with memento for retention, will be awarded to the driver of a three-wheeler making the fastest lap of the day in that category.

The Carburol Cup (presented by United Lubricants Ltd.), will be awarded to the driver of the first British machine to finish in the 250 c.c. Championship race.

The Rickard Trophy. (presented by K. Rickard, Esq.) to be held for one year with replica for retention, will be awarded for the best performance by a private owner who is not in receipt of any Manufacturer's or other Trade support and who is also a member of B.M.C.R.C.

The Comerford Cup (presented by A. E. T. Comerford, Esq.), to be held for one year with memento for retention, will be awarded to the B.M.C.R.C. member making the best performance at today's meeting and who has not won a first place or handicap (including today's) throughout the year 1959.

The final decision in making the last two of these awards will rest with the Judging Committee of the B.M.C.R.C.

The "Hutch"

A SK any enthusiastic follower of motor cycle racing to name the most well-known and important motor cycle race to be held in England, and whether he be spectator or rider, he is certain to reply "The Hutch," a popular abbreviation of that very famous "Bemsee" event, The Hutchinson Hundred, which takes its name from the Club's oldest Challenge Trophy and, war years excepted, has been an annual event since 1925.

In recent years, the character of the race has changed completely. In 1925 "The Hutch" was a hundred miles track event run at Brooklands on a handicap basis and open to all who cared to enter. Since the war it has become a road race. Only the reward remains the same, the magnificent Mellano Trophy, a large silver cup originally valued at two hundred pounds and presented by Mr. A. V. Mellano, of the Hutchinson Tyre Company, in 1925.

The change in the character of "The Hutch" has been brought about by the different circumstances which now exist. Brooklands was the home of "Bemsee" from the time the Club was founded in 1909 until 1939. When the Club was reformed in 1947 it was homeless. For a time it organised racing at Dunholme, then Haddenham, then Silverstone, then Goodwood, then back to Silverstone.

Entries of forty riders for pre-war Hutchinson Hundred races were considered to be excellent. Post-war races attract five or six times this number and are an embarrassment to the organisers. With such large entries several difficulties arise which make the running of handicap races none too easy, and because of these difficulties. handicap races have been abandoned.

There are other changes. The machines are out-and-out road racing motor cycles. The race has had International status. There are fuel restrictions; alcohol is not permitted, nor is supercharging, for these are barred by the F.I.M. regulations under which the meeting is held.

Brooklands was the one place in the British Isles where a motor cycle could be ridden in full throttle for hours on end if the rider and the machine could stand the strain, and an average speed of the order of 90 m.p.h. for a distance of one hundred miles was a severe test of the man and machine. Consequently the winfing af "Bemsee's" annual classic. the Hutchinson Hundred, was an achievement of which the victor could be justifiably proud.

Apart from the yearly variations, the pattern of the fourteen races held at Brooklands (1925 to 1938 inclusive) remained unchanged. Any size of engine up to the top limit of 1000 c.c. was eligible; competitors were free to use any type of fuel—the majority chose alcohol—and. if they pleased, they could employ supercharging. Some did. Three-fifties were the most successful class of machine and they won the race seven times; the two-fifties won three, the five-hundreds two, and the remaining two races went to a big twin of 1000 c.c. and a tiddler of 175 c.c. Only once did a rider on the scratch mark win. the late Ben Bickell in 1932, and only once was the race won at 100 m.p.h., by L. J. Archer in 1933. An innovation introduced in 1931 was that for the first time sidecars were allowed to compete, but it was not until twenty years later that a "chair" won the Mellano Trophy.

A feature of post-1946 races has been the shockingly wet conditions in which several have taken place. In marked contrast the seven years 1925 to 1931 provided reasonably good weather, but the 1932 event was run off in the worst possible conditions and a downpour of rain. Only seven of the twenty-nine starters completed the distance. The winner was Ben Bickell from the scratch mark, riding a 498 c.c. Bickell-J.A.P. (tuned by his brother Joe) who averaged 99.61 m.p.h. and despite the atrocious weather lapped consistently at 103 m.p.h. It was in the following year, 1933, that the "Hutch" was won for the first and only time at 100 m.p.h. More remarkable was that the winner, Les Archer Senior, accomplished this on a three fifty, a 348 c.c. KTT Velocette, and

was the first occasion on which a threefifty had covered one hundred miles in the hour on a British track.

The last of the Brooklands races was the 1938 event, which took place in torrential rain.

After the war years (1939-45) conditions were greatly changed. "Bemsee' was re-formed in 1947 but the Club was homeless, for Brooklands was not available. The Hutchinson Hundred as a race pure and simple ceased, and the Mellano Trophy was awarded to the winner of a sealed handicap, the riders taking part in separate races. This was because entries had become so unwieldy. At the 1948 meeting the number received for the 100-mile race for 250 c.c., 350 c.c. and 1000 c.c. classes was overwhelming. There were 100 three-fifties, and they raced amongst themselves. With so many runners it was difficult for the time-keepers and lap-scorers to keep track of everybody and, as a consequence, some riders were missed. Eventually all the bothers were overcome, but the organisers realised that a different arrangement would have to be planned for future races.

The 1949 Hutchinson Hundred was held at Silverstone, the first motor cycle race meeting to be held on this circuit. Separate races with an overall sealed handicap for the Mellano Trophy was again used, but the difficulties previously experienced with lap-scoring were overcome.

The 1950 race was notable for two things; the shocking weather and, for the

first time in the history of the race, the Mellano Trophy was won by a three-wheeler, Cyril Smith and his Norton-Watsonian outfit. Curiously enough, a sidecar outfit won the Trophy in the following year, the Norton-Watsonian combination ridden by Eric Oliver, in weather conditions that could not have been bettered, a marked contrast to the previous year.

After 1951 sealed handicaps were abandoned. The present method, used for several years, is to award the Mellano Trophy to the rider whose average race speed exceeds the existing class lap record by the greatest margin, or, if no rider exceeds the class lap record, to the rider whose average speed is nearest to the class lap record. That this solution is ideal the Club does not pretend, for the ideal is the handicap race pure and simple, but, paradoxically, it is the enthusiasm for racing which has created the organisers' biggest obstacle.

Speeds have risen considerably and, as will be seen from the list of winners on page 9, all capacities of solos, as well as sidecars, have won the Mellano Trophy in late years. Who will this year? Well, you are about to find out. It is certain to be hard fought. Though no actual physical battle takes place today, a really close fight will ensue; decimals of miles per hour rather than complete miles per hour will determine the 27th name to appear on this coveted award. Indeed, in 1957 only 0.01 m.p.h. separated Cecil Sandford, the eventual winner, and John Surtees. It could well be as close again this year.

Of Men and Machines . . .

To some extent one of the banes of our present day age, that of standard-isation, has made itself felt in the sphere of motor cycle racing. For gone are the days when any one of half a dozen, or more, makes could provide a winner in races. Yet, even if the interest may to some extent have gone out of the machinery, the competition has become fiercer. Those here today who saw the tremendous fight between Bob Anderson, Mike Hailwood, Alistair King and Bob McIntyre in April will no doubt see the point. There can be little doubt, therefore, that we can expect similar racing today with, amongst many more, these four riders again entered.

Looking but briefly through the programme, race by race, we come first to the 125s. Eleven years ago these were laughed at, but they have now reached the stage where the fastest of them can exceed 120 m.p.h. In the entry list we have MIKE HAILWOOD, 20, and in his third year of racing. Among his many successes Mike was 3rd in the 1959 125 T.T. and led the 250 T.T., works M.V.s and all, until he retired. Since then he has had other places in 1959 World Championship events. His machine is very interesting, a factory twin camshaft Ducati with desmodromic valve operation. Other Ducatis, though these are the normal twin o.h.c. models are to be ridden by ARTHUR WHEELER, BILL MADDRICK. DAN SHOREY and TOMMY ROBB. the twin o.h.c. Paton ridden by DAVE MOORE is another Italian machine built by one of the engineers responsible for the Mondial to which it bears considerable resemblance. Moore used to ride a very fast M.V. in this class, but has been Paton mounted this season. DUDLEY EDLIN'S Mondial is an ex-factory machine too. These seven should make the pace in Event 1. The M.V.s which used to dominate this class are for the most part two or three years old and privately-owned single camshaft models. The two E.M.C.s of DEREK MINTER and JIM BAUGHN deserve watching and are very fast. Note too the Fruin Special, the twin cylinder Sulby and the L.C.H .three beautiful specials.

With the "fast" 350s the fun should really start. There is GEOFF DUKE. a master of the art of high speed motor cycling if ever there was one. Several times World Champion, winner of six T.T. races Geoff can be said to be the best known motor cyclist of all. Racing now his own machines for the most part he was 4th in the Junior T.T. this year and recently 3rd in the 250 class of the Swedish G.P., an event in which he scored a "double" the previous year. He rides two Nortons today. BOB McINTYRE, winner of both 350 and 500 races at this meeting last year and current holder of the Mellano Trophy. Double winner in the Golden Jubilee T.T. when he was the first man to lap the Island at the "ton". he won the 500 Formula 1 race there this year. He holds the Silverstone 'bike lan record. ALISTAIR KING, Bob's racing partner and winner of the 350 Formula 1 T.T. has had more than his share of bad luck. This year he was on better form than ever (for example his T.T. record included 2nd place in the Senior and 3rd in the Junior as well as the Formula I), but crashed in the German G.P. and has been out of racing until a few weeks ago. BOB ANDERSON, MIKE HAILWOOD. DEREK MINTER, ALAN TROW, ERIC HINTON and TERRY SHEPHERD are a few more of the "star" riders in this race. For a change too the all conquering Norton might well not be all conquering. McIntyre, King and Hailwood are all down to use 7R A.J.S. and each of them has proved elsewhere this season that, in expert hands, the 7R is quite capable of winning outright.

What might be termed, without any disrespect intended, all the "old faithfuls" are to appear in the sidecar class. "PIP" HARRIS, winner of countless races all over the country, many here at Silverstone, rides his B.M.W. to which he has taken a little time to get used. BILL BODDICE must have been at the game longer than anyone else here today, with the possible exception of LEN TAYLOR. Both raced regularly at Donington pre-war. Bill has had many wins up and down

the country and holds the Brand's Hatch sidecar lap record. BOB ROBINSON is a relative newcomer to this class, but probably quite the most promising sidecarrist to be seen recently. He rides a special Vincent and at the last Snetterton meeting he beat "the lot". He holds the "chair" lap record at Castle Combe. OWEN GREENWOOD rode the first British machine to finish in this year's Sidecar T.T. (6th), and must have one of the fastest Triumph powered outfits ever made. ERNIE WALKER has another. Also to be seen will be JACK BEETON, another "veteran" of the game, LES WELLS another very promising charioteer and FRED HANKS, who may ride the other B.M.W. entered.

The big Senior race has a very similar entry to the corresponding 350 event. All the same runners will appear again. This time Nortons really do rule the roost and, apart from a few of the new G50 Matchlesses and the special Taylor-Dow B.S.A., everyone in the race is using them. Nonetheless, with ALAN SHEP-HERD, 1958 Junior Manx G.P. winner, and BILL SMITH, on Tom Arter's entry, the G50 ought not to be out of the picture. Duke's Norton is a standard 1959 model which he has used in Formula 1 events in the World Championship races this year.

Today the 250 race provides one of the most interesting from the machine angle. The ingenuity of the special builder is seldom shown to better advantage than in this capacity class. Pride of place must surely go to Bob Geeson's two twin camshaft twin cylinder R.E.G.s. One will be ridden by DEREK MINTER and the other by "GINGER" PAYNE. After a deal of bother last year almost complete reliability seems to have been achieved this year and already the two machines are beginning to go very nicely. Payne won at Brand's recently and Minter has been a pretty consistent placeman at the British events this year. DAN SHOREY'S Norvel, while making use of largely Norton and Velocette bits, is another fine example of British special. This particular 'bike has won several races at Cadwell Park, here at Silverstone and at Biggin Hill. TOM THORP'S T.T.S. is based on a B.S.A. and has been in the running for a number of years. The phenomenally fast G.M.S. to be ridden by Belfast-man TOMMY ROBB is also superficially like a Beesa. However in this machine designer and builder Geoff Monty has one of the fastest British 250s ever. Robb scored a brilliant 4th place in the 250 T.T. this year and recently won the Temple 100 in Ireland with it. At Blandford on Whit Monday he won and on its most recent appearance in the 250 Ulster G.P. he was again 4th. The G.M.S. has quite a record at Silverstone and ought to be well up today. Opposed to these "home" mounts are the two ex-factory Mondials of the Ecurie Sportive, one being ridden by MIKE HAILWOOD. This machine is a 1957 model and is the bike on which Hailwood led the 250 T.T. this year for 8 laps. NSU Sportmax machines (this is the racing version of the ordinary 250 model) are being handled by, amongst others, ALISTAIR KING, DUDLEY EDLIN, BILL SMITH, JACK MURGATROYD. TOM RUTHERFORD and JOHN DIXON. ARTHUR WHEELER'S Guzzi, a make on which he has been very successful in past years (he won the 250 race at this meeting on one in 1955) has a special frame. Another interesting foreigner is J. C. BUXTON'S twin cylinder two stroke Adler.

And finally the two "iess expert" solo races for the big solos—well as far as machines go these are more or less standard Nortons, Gold Star B.S.A.s, A.J.S., a few Matchless and Velocette. Not all the Nortons are Manx models, one or two being Dominator twins suitably altered. The riders are not yet household names in the Sport, but some will be soon. It is as well to realise that without such men as these racing would be in a sorry state for they form the backbone of racing. To make things a little more equal for them Bemsee splits the two classes into two races, rather than into two heats. It is a fairly certain bet that there will be as close racing in these events as at any time during the afternoon. They will be well worth seeing. And watch in them these riders—STAN COOPER, REX AVERY, I. CLARKE, TONY HORTON, ERNIE WOODER, NORMAN PRICE, T. H. CHARNLEY and MAURICE GITTINS. They and the others will not disappoint.


