If the racing matches the Finals of the past we are going to see an excellent day's sport. I wish every competitor the best of luck.


Should any of them be aiming for the top, may this be the start of an outstanding career in the 'Eighties.

THEY come here today from numerous walks of life, from a railway signal-man to a bacon salesman. They are the country-wide competitors at the foot of the motorsport ladder. Call them the "shoe-string" brigade, the "struggling hopes" or just plain "Clubbies". But, for me, having watched them battle it out in each of the preceding eight qualifying rounds, they are the outstanding example of devoted sportsmanship, racing, mostly, for the sheer fun of it.

And, once again, I remind the powers that be that never was there a greater need for stronger representation by the "Brits" on the grand prix grid. For the fourth successive season this country has failed to win a title in any solo class. In fact, this year, every crown went overseas.



# NORTHAMPTON real town-real value

In the heart of England, half way between London and Birmingham, is the thriving, progressive town of Northampton.

It is large enough to offer something to everyone, but not so large as to be impersonal — or present the problems experienced in commuting to or simply moving about in the large cities. It has a fully developed industrial and commercial life, yet is surrounded by beautiful countryside only a few minutes away.

As a 'real town' Northampton offers the range of cultural and leisure opportunities you would expect and need — be it county cricket, motor racing at nearby Silverstone or live theatre.

Yet again the 500 Marlboro British Grand Prix, Silverstone's two-wheeled classic of the year, was won (and splendidly so) by an invader, Dutch privateer Jack Middleburg. The Americans claimed it through Pat Hennen (1977), Kenny Roberts (1978-79) and Randy Mamola last year.

Now, there is nothing a British crowd yearns more for than to see a home-based competitor up on the winner's rostrum in a world-class event. In motorsport it's a bit of an overdue tonic.

But this circuit was electrified by the Formula One success of John Watson in the Marlboro MP4 at the Marlboro British Car Grand Prix this July.

It's the flag-waving stuff the paying British public expects to see. Surely, the best place to start injecting the medicine on two wheels is among the lads striving at the base of the sport—Clubman racing.

That's where Marlboro stepped in with the Daily Express, Mitsui-Yamaha, the Auto-Cycle Union and Silverstone three years ago. The idea was, not only to go talent-seeking, but to give the so-called "shoe-string" lads more recognition and a chance to up-stage them with their own grand prix.

We did not expect to wave a magic chequered flag and start pulling classics out of every Silverstone Grand Final. No sport is that easy. Certainly not Clubman racing. It's the real grass-roots stuff. And grass takes time to grow.

Keeping any racing machine competitive today is a very costly business (ask any of the lads in the pits). Most of the entries you will see in action have struggled on without financial support. Every bit of cash goes into the racing kitty.

A crash can put a rider back for months. The vital win can raise enough "ready" to help pay for the petrol home. Sponsorship is a dream word, the back-up that's always, hopefully, around the next corner. Sit back and expect some senior competitions rep to pop up with a contract—and you can forget any ideas about reaching that "works" ride.

You can get half way through this Marlboro-Yamaha-Express series, send "it" down the road, come home with a few busted joints . . . and that's that for the season.

Well, we've put the Clubmans Wembley on the road, tried to give a bit back, like the overall winner in each class getting a Marlboro trophy and £120, plus the A.C.U. Clubman trophy. The sidecar champion receives the Daily Express Trophy and £350.

The solo driver with the "most meritorious performance throughout the competition" is awarded a £4,000-plus TZ 250 H Yamaha from Yamaha-Mitsui, and also the Marlboro Clubman Trophy.

For the solo driver adjudged to have made the second most meritorious performance in the competition, Mitsui stay in again with a spares voucher worth £1,500.

The bike, the voucher and a cheque for £150 for the Man of the Meeting (at Silverstone) are awards which are decided by a panel of judges made up of journalists, riders and members of the A.C.U.

Euro Helmets have given headgear, plus an anorak for a Man of the Day (or Men in the sidecars) selected by club committee men at each round. Today they are also awarding a helmet and anorak to each class winner.

It's the richest-ever Clubman series, with a prize fund of around £19,250, more than double that available in the competition's inaugural year.

There have been eight preliminary meetings at Snetterton, Croft, Brands Hatch (twice), Lydden, Cadwell Park, Mallory Park and Carnaby. Everyone has been a cracker.

We have not yet come up with some whiz kid capable of blowing off Sheene or Marco Lucchinelli. As those who take part know—it's not that easy.

The first year we discovered Wigan's David Dean, who swept the board by winning the 350 and 500 championships and went home with his arms full of trophies and a nice bit of cash.

Backed by Mitsui-Yamaha team, six-footer David went on to finish tenth in his first T.T. This season he set about leading the British 500 Champion-ship for Yamaha.

Last year we had top fighters like Chesterfield's Tom Drury and Batley's 19-year-old Gary Padgett, who slashed the lap record when he won the Newcomers' 250 race at the Manx Grand Prix.

There were others like the 1000 cc class winner, Martin Taylor of Coventry, who found himself flat broke after Silverstone—but later earned £10,000 worth of local sponsorship.

Another success man is Ron Storey, spotted by the men of Motor Cycle Weekly, after finishing sixth in last year's 350 Clubman Final and twelfth in the 250. They all linked with Honda and set Ron up with a 998cc Honda.

Ron, with about £16,000 of equipment around him, slowly progressed and this season finished seventh behind Ron Haslam in the Daily Express T.T. Formula One Race at the Marlboro British Grand Prix. Storey has also topped the Yamaha 350 championship table.

Double points will be allocated to the riders in today's Grand Final. So there should be some slide-rule finishes.

Watch Wayne Mills, the 22-year-old railwayman from Lincoln. Four wins have helped him retain his place at the top of the competitive 125 table. He has also taken his Webbs Yamaha to a joint fifth place in the 350 category

Good going for a rider who has suffered 17 crashes this season, been knocked unconscious twice and earned the Euro Helmets Man of the Day prize at Carnaby.
