World Champions, National Champions and T.T. winners are all here today


Motor Cycle Racing, from International down to Club level has been having a great season and today's Carreras meeting should see the high standard that has been set at other circuits maintained. We have a first class line-up even if some of your favourites may be missing. It is appreciated that most people have a number one choice of rider and many rush letters off to the correspondence columns of the motorcycling press expounding their views on who is the greatest and why. Heated arguments take place and after the dust has settled the basic fact emerges that all racing motorcyclists are fine sportsmen and men of courage but some have that extra ability to use their talents just that bit better than the next chap. From the winner to the tail end charlie they all provide fine entertainment for which you must be thankful.

On the grid today will be World Champions, National Champions and T.T. Winners who will ensure you a great day's sport and outstanding in the solo events may well be Australian Kel Carruthers the current 250 c.c. World Champion and Rod Gould who is putting up a great fight to take the title away from him. At present he is in the lead and you can be assured that the rivalry here today will be as keen as on any Grand Prix circuit. The interest in the sidecar events should come from the efforts of our own National Champion Chris Vincent trying to prove that even the World Champion Table leader is not invincible. Chris takes on the

popular West German Georg Auerbacher who has already announced his intention to retire at the end of the current season. Auerbacher would certainly like to leave here with a victory and challenging with Vincent will be Peter Brown, Pip Harris, Tony Wakefield and Mick Boddice. This half dozen could produce quite a race.

The 500 c.c. race will be the sixth round of the Shell Championship and the leader board at the moment reads – Bob Heath, Peter Williams and Paul Smart – 14 points, Pat Mahoney and John Cooper – 13. With Smart and Cooper absentees there is bound to be a great battle for points as only two more rounds remain. Pat Mahoney has another job in hand when he takes on Alan Barnett in a further race for the B.P.—Bill Ivy Silver Helmet Match Race Series. Alan was the holder earlier in the season but due to injuries received in his T.T. spill had to miss the Mallory Park meeting where Pat beat the substituting John Cooper. Both will be striving hard for the £20 prize money and the £10 a week that goes with it until the next Mallory meeting on 20th September. Picking the winners is always an interesting pastime, so what of today's racing. The new 125 c.c. National Champion, 19 year old Barry Sheene has had such a great season that he looks a sure first in the Ultra-lightweight race but both Derek Chatterton and Steve Murray are capable of pushing him a bit. For this event we welcome overseas riders Alan Leonard from the U.S.A., Roland Olsen from Sweden and Jon Kosterwinder from Holland who provide an added interest.

Carruthers and Gould should be the pacemakers in the 250 c.c. race, but doubtless Phil Read, Sheene, Chatterton and Tony Rutter will have other ideas. 1, 2 for the World rated stars but in which order is anybody's guess. The same goes for the 350 c.c. race but

with a much stronger challenge for Alan Barnett, Rex Butcher, Peter Williams, Tony Rutter, Pat Mahoney and Martin Carney are all capable of springing a surprise. It was proved at the recent Brands Hatch meeting that these World class riders can be beaten by our short circuit stars.

The leaders at the top of the Shell Championship table will be made to fight hard for any additional points for Ray Pickrell, Martyn Ashwood, Steve Spencer, Butcher and Barnett still have a chance of coming into the reckoning in the final rounds with the latter being the likely winner of today's race. Add Carruthers, Read and Gould to this bunch and you have the main contenders for the Race of Aces and with the capacity going up to 1000 c.c. the Yamahas will need all of their fantastic speed to hold the larger machines on the long straights. With this in mind the winner could well come from the trio of Tait, Pickrell and Ashwood – we shall see.

With trouble-free racing the results of the sidecar racing could be close with the German having the edge but then these predictions could be well wide of the mark but the enjoyment of motor cycle racing is always the element of surprise, particularly when an up-and-coming rider stakes his claim for higher status. It is the aim of every youngster to beat the established stars and when he does there is always the chance of a sponsorship to assist with the high cost of this very expensive sport. Which brings a point of great interest at the present time, the riders desperately want more money, the organisers would be only too happy to pay them more but they cannot do this without the support of the spectators. To help all round come again and encourage your friends to follow our sport, and always that final plea, take care on the way home. Racing is for the race tracks.






