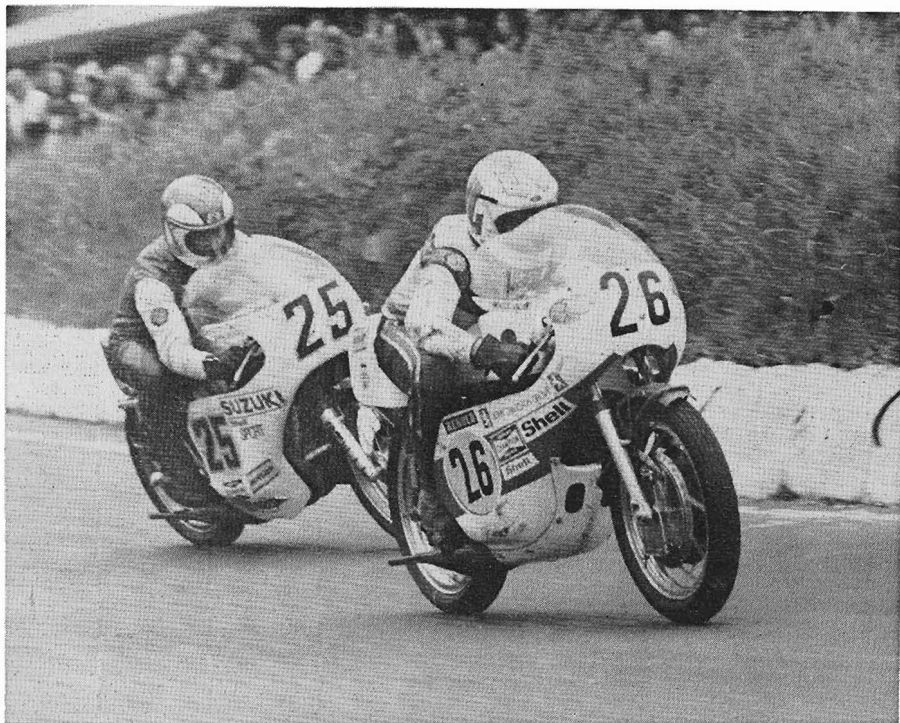

## **WILL PAUL SMART BE THE ACE OF ACES? Tough Competition for Rothmans Trophy**

While we have a full programme of motorcycle events during the season, this Rothmans meeting is our only international so no effort has been spared to arrange a programme worthy of its title.

Paul Smart, paying one of his now rare visits from the United States, must of course be the main interest, particularly after his brilliant double at Silverstone a couple of weeks ago. If he retains that form the question will be 'who is going to be second?', but then there are riders around who have been known to keep Paul in their wake. Who, then, will be the 'Ace of Aces'? Riders from France and Switzerland provide the international flavour, and few of our own short circuit stars are missing from the line-up. There is, indeed, no shortage of talent in any of the races, which include rounds of the British 750 cc and Sidecar Championships, the 1973 ShellSPORT Championship and the BP/Bill Ivy Championship which is incorporated in the 'Race of Aces'.

The supporting events also have their quota of star riders and at the end of the day will be selected the BP 'Man of the Meeting'. Not necessarily a race winner but the up-and-coming rider who, in the opinion of an independent panel, puts up an outstanding performance, bearing in mind the quality of the opposition and the capacity of his machine.

Mick Grant has been in superb form all season and had an outstanding day at the rain-lashed Hutchinson 100 meeting at Brands, when he won four races. Barry Sheene won the Hutchinson 100 and Peter Williams the Production Race, so here are three who could give Paul Smart something to think about.

Cliff Carr, another visitor from the U.S.A., must not be left out of the reckoning, while Paul Cott, Dave Croxford, Dave Potter and Swiss star Gyula Marsovszky will not be, very far adrift. Sheene heads the BP/Bill Ivy Championship by a mere two points from

Stan Woods, with Potter, Williams and Grant in striking distance. The table could alter considerably after this race.

Most of these riders get together again in the 750 cc Championship, which is sponsored by Revetts of Ipswich. In addition to the prize money, Geoff Revett is putting up £5 per lap for the race leader. A very sporting gesture. This may turn out to be a repeat of the 'Race of Aces'.

Barry Sheene also tops the 1973 ShellSPORT 500 cc Championship with Woods six points down in second place and the only rider who can take over the lead. Cott, Pat Mahoney and Williams who follow will be looking for points to improve their positions. Potter, Jim Harvey, Charles Mortimer and Ian Ratcliffe will be among those who will hot this race up.

Steve Machin and Neil Tuxworth should be the main contenders in the 125 cc race and will also be the busiest men of the day, both having rides in five of the six solo events.

The 250 cc race, an A.C.U. Star round and the 350 cc race as ever, bring out much the same riders. Grant must be one of the favourites but no doubt such riders as Tony Rutter, Mortimer, Cott, Alan Barnett, Rod Scivyer and Marsovszky will be well to the fore.

The opening sidecar race is another round of the British Championship and should prove quite a thriller with some 30 outfits on the grid. Machine trouble has decimated many a sidecar race during the season, so let us hope that the back-room boys have done their job well today. The favourite looks to be Pete Hardy, with George O'Dell as his number one challenger. Mick Boddice is listed to bring out his new Konig and if this is on song could be a danger. Les Langridge was among the fastest in practice at Silverstone but overheating put him out of the race—if he cures that he is another force to be reckoned with. Roger Aldous, Malcolm Attrill and Brian Rust should also be well up, but from this pack there may well be a big surprise. They all get a second chance later on, but only the first race is for championship points.

The talent is here and all that is needed now is for the weather man to be kind. Enjoy the racing and TAKE CARE ON THE WAY HOME.

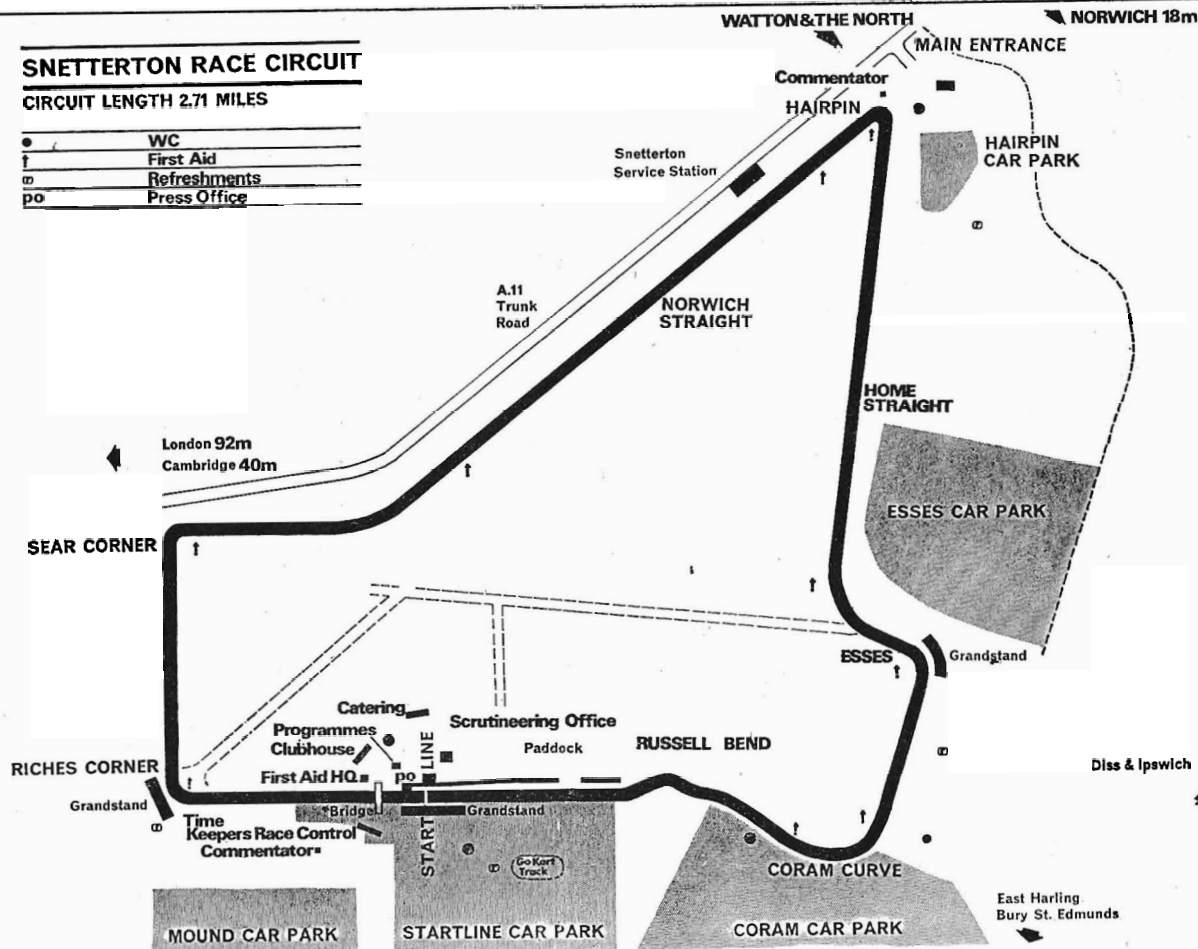
