





## Phil Read takes on the 'Superbikes'

## Rounds of the MCN and Shell Super Oil Championships add spice to todays meeting

Motor cycle racing is as enthralling, exciting and entertaining to-day as ever it was and while patterns have changed and famous marques departed from the scene the enthusiasm amongst spec-


tators and riders alike continues on the up-grade.

The season's racing in the World Championship Series and here at home on the short circuits has provided great pleasure for thousands of spectators and first class copy for the pressmen—so good and competitive has the racing been. To-day should be no exception for there is enough talent listed in the following pages to provide some really great racing with former World Champion Phil Read out to repeat his 1970 victory in the Race of Aces. In support of this feature event at this Rothmans International meeting is the third round of the Motor Cycle News 1971 Superbike Championship and the fifth round of the Shell Super Oil 500 c.c. Championship. These two events could also provide races long to remember while competition in the other races is bound to be keen. Phil Read, chasing his first World Championship as a Privateer has not met with the best of good fortune in recent weeks for having pushed to

the top of the table he proceeded to fall off in practice for the Czechoslovakian Grand Prix at Brno. He suffered an arm injury which put him out of action for a couple of week-ends and then collected a solitary point at the Finnish G.P. While this kept his slender lead at the top fate stepped in again at the Ulster, where after a fine race long dice with that brilliant local man Ray McCullough he retired on the final lap when in second place. Rod Gould, back in sixth place collected enough points to put him back at the top of the table so with only two rounds to go Read has his work cut out. Let us then, wish him luck for the remainder of the season and against the 'superbikes' that will be lined up against him in the 'Race of Aces'.


On the grid against his '350' will be the 750s of Percy Tait, Paul Smart, Barry Ditchburn, Charlie Sanby, Dave Croxford, John Cooper, Ray Pickrell, Dave Nixon, Peter Butler, Canadian experts Bert Clark and Peter Williams who followed up two fine Brands Hatch victories when taking the 350 c.c. class in the Ulster and what a great race that was. Such opposition will also make other 350 c.c. riders think, Tony Rutter and Derek Chatterton, to name a couple.

Percy Tait dominated the opening rounds of the M.C.N. Superbike Championship at both Brands Hatch and Mallory Park going into the lead on the opening lap and staying there until the end, thus assuring himself of a fair slice of the prize money and bonus awards. He has amassed 35 points for his efforts while second place man Bob Heath trails with 14 points. Next come Charlie Sanby and Ray Pickrell with 12, Tony Jeffries 11, Martyn Ashwood and Peter

Williams 10. With the exception of Ashwood they are all in to-days line-up and joining them will be Paul Smart, Barry Ditchburn, Peter Butler and Dave Nixon any of whom could spring a surprise on the early point scorers. With bonus awards for the fastest lap and individual lap leaders it should be a great race. Interest will also be centered on the Shell Super Oil 500 c.c. Championship and with four rounds gone the table is headed by Brian Kemp with 14 points. Unfortunately Brian is sidelined with injury but his nearest challengers are all here. Charlie Sanby and Jim Harvey have 12 points, Percy May and John Cooper 11, so any of these riders could be in the lead by the end of the day. Also having a say and chasing points will be Dave Croxford, Barry Ditchburn and Bob Heath and with only one more round to come—Mallory Park on 19th September—points gained here will be invaluable.

The 250 c.c. and 350 c.c. events bring together much the same riders and on current form it would be difficult to pick the winner while in the 125 c.c. race Grant Gibson, Steve Machin, Derek Chatterton and Spencer Crabbe should be scrapping it out in front.


Paul Smart, whilst an Ace on big machines, as he proved when winning the Evening News Trophy at the recent Hutchinson 100 Meeting at Brands Hatch, is not beyond showing up the smaller capacity machine riders. In the 250 race he comes up against Read, Cooper, Rutter and Chatterton. Moving up a class Bob Heath, Tony Jeffries, Barry Ditchburn, Steve Machin and Mick Grant add their

weight to the battle. All of these would be on short prices if we had bookmakers around.

Three-wheeler races always provide the thrills and to-days event should be no exception. Champions have been known to be beaten although Chris Vincent never gets to the line with that thought in mind.

Pip Harris often saves his best rides for this circuit and will be pushing Chris to the limit as will Peter Brown, Pat Sheridan and Mick Boddice. Tony Wakefield and Graham Milton have been going well this season and not out of the reckoning are Bryan Rust, Alan Sansum and Gerry Boret on his monster 1000 c.c. R.G.M. Whatever the outcome this too should be a thriller from the fall of the flag.

Not only do we wish you an excellent day's entertainment but good fortune to the riders for many of them will be moving on to Oulton Park where they are competing in the International A.C.U. Championships and Rothmans Trophy Meeting which is sponsored by the Daily Express. They will be taking on a host of stars not here to-day. Racing starts there at 2.0 p.m. and if you intend going, take care on the roads you may come across people who are not as capable as yourself.



## Motor Cycle News Superbike Series



PERCY TAIT, the popular Triumph rider from Meriden, Warwicks, starts today's third round in the international £2,000 Motor Cycle News Superbike road race championship with a comfortable lead, having won the opening round and collected fastest lap points at Brands Hatch and again won the next round at Mallory.

After the Mallory Park and Brands Hatch rounds, his 35 points total was 21 more than the runner-up Bob Heath on the BSA Rocket.

The series continues at the Race of the Year at Mallory Park on September 19, and climaxes at the final round at the Race of the South at Brands Hatch on October 3.

Poin's will be scored, as in the world championships, 15-12-10-8-6-5-4-3-2-1, with double points in the last round. There are a bonus five points for the fastest lap, and if more than one rider shares the fastest lap, each will receive five pts.

Overall winner receives £500, with £250 second and £100 third.

The fastest lap at each of the six MCN Superbike rounds will be backed by Norton-Villiers. They award £25 for the fastest lap, with the prize being split if the fastest lap is shared.

There are no lap bonus awards at this meeting.




