Red: The Hace or Practice is being interrupted. Riders must return slowly to the Pits.

Yellow (waved): Great danger in section of track ahead, slow down, be prepared to stop, overtaking is forbidden.

Yellow (motionless): Danger in section of track ahead, slow down, overtaking is forbidden. Green: Course clear. Used on Marshals' posts to indicate their position to riders on first lap of all practice sessions. Also shown immediately after the post where a yellow flag has been shown to indicate circuit now clear ahead.

Black: Accompanied by rider's number on separate board. That rider to stop in pits next time round. Always shown at start/finish line on special instructions from the Clerk of the Course. Black with Orange Disk: Accompanied by rider's number on separate board. Mechanical problem. That rider to leave the course immediately.

Yellow with Red Stripes: Oif, Water or another substance is affecting adhesion on this section of the track

White: Ambulance or Course Car on Circuit Yellow with Black cross. Denotes start of last

Black & White chequered Thin It of the total Practice session.

Time to Endure.

The final KRC Endurance Championship series of the current millennium looks like being the most hotly contested yet. Looking down the list of entries there are some top names from British racing alongside riders who are very established when it comes to KRC Endurance Racing.

Last year saw a very closely fought championship that went down to the last round. In fact there could have been a couple of different winners going into the final hour of the last race.

A maximum of 48 teams will start the race today opposed to the same event in 1998 which had a mere 45. We have the luxury of having reserve teams today but unfortunately they will have to wait until just before the flag drops to see if they will compete for honours and points. One of the teams on the reserve list are Brookvex, this may not mean much to those new to KRC Endurance, but they are in fact the defending champions. Although they are desperate to defend their title, as soon as the rules and regulations for this event were published entries flooded into the race secretary. We hope that if Brookvex do not get to race today they will stick with us for the rest of the season.

For those of you who are joining us for the first time today, you are very welcome and we hope you enjoy the day and will follow the series throughout 1999. Let me just take this opportunity to give you a brief insight into what you will be seeing throughout the day and what endurance racing is all about. As the title suggests "Endurance Championship" it is all about making man and machine basically last the full six hours of each race without too many hitches. The team who complete the greatest number of laps is the winner, so going flat out for a few laps is not the best idea, having said that, these racers are not out for a Sunday afternoon ride and will not be cruising around, they will be racing the whole time. The leaders though may take it a little easy on the final lap if they have enough of a cushion, although it is not uncommon for the top three to be on the same number of completed laps at the end of the race. The day will start with free practise for all team members, then a timed session again for all team members, this will give the team an average time and determine their starting grid position. To watch the start of the race is well worth a walk around the circuit from wherever you have decided to spectate from. In the tradition of endurance racing the bikes will line up along one side of the track and the riders along the other. When the flag drops on the stroke of twelve o'clock the riders sprint across the track, jump onto their machines, hit the start button and if it fires up head for the first corner in the hope to get a few clear laps. With 48 starters it will definitely be a spectacle you should not miss before sitting back to watch the full race unfold. Throughout the race the teams will have to stop for fuel, plus rider and tyre changes so there will always be something to see from the spectator bank opposite the pit lane, a commentator will keep you posted on all the latest incidents and developments throughout the day

I think I am right in saying that history was made in the KRC Endurance series last season, Suzi Machen became the first female to lift an endurance title by winning the up to 400cc A class. Suzi is racing today on Dynotech 1's Kawasaki 400 aptly with number 1 on.

Class B up to 600cc champions Team Exchange Direct 1, are also racing here today and will be hoping to better their overall position of last season where they finished third behind Brookvex from class C, and Team Dynotech II who were also class B competitors but have elected to move up to class C for this season. There was a class D last year for Twins and Triples and the win was shared by four riders. We have just 2 rejoining us this season, Pat Keenan and Jeff King who rode for different teams and will be in class C this year, again in opposing teams. There is no class D this season.

So to quickly re-cap on the 1998 championship, it ended like this: P^n Brookvex, 2^{nd} Team Dynotech II and 3^{nd} Team Exchange Direct 1.

I would like to take this opportunity on behalf of KRC Endurance, to welcome all spectators to this the first round of the 1999 series, and to also extend a huge thank you to all the officials, marshals, first aid and fire personnel for all their help in making this meeting possible. KRC would also like to thank Micron for their support of the 1999 series.

A final message to the riders and team members, KRC hope you all have a safe, successful and enjoyable days racing.

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

ANDY MORRIS

Andys 1st track day was in the good old days of Major Players Trackdays at Pembrey in 1992. This wasn't exactly his introduction to riding bikes fast - he already had an illustrious history of scaring the shit out of the population of West Sussex over many years. Race tracks were a natural place for him to be.

Once he started racing, achievements came very quickly. In his first year of club racing he won the very first race he entered --- 600 cc Novice Race at Mallory Park. Over the next couple of seasons he won more than his fair share of races including KRC honours, culminating last season when he finished 3rd in the Manx GP 750cc Newcomers.

Following his achievement in the newcomers he then travelled all night to compete in the KCR 8hr at Snetterton the next day. As some of you will know he was spectacularly taken out at The Esses by some stupid prick - we know he was a stupid prick because a spectator got it on video. The bike was totalled but as usual Andy was OK albeit his skeleton got another good kicking - the fifth of the season.

Other biking pastimes involved off-roading around the Southdowns to the abhorrence of the local horse riding gentle folk, trips to the wonderful Nurburgring where he once spent 2 weeks in the local Krankenhausen to an annual pharmaceutical trip with 20 or so of his friends from Frontiers to Le Mans 24hr bike race.

Prior to his venture into the Bike business with his good friend and fellow maniac Dave Black Andy spent his time when not racing, felling trees. Thus it is ironic that he should die following an innocuous crash into some saplings on his way to work — running-in the R6 he was to race in this years KRC series.

It is only natural that Andy is remembered in some way by everyone taking part in the first race of the season Andy intended competing in. It has thus been decided to award the **Andy Morris Trophy** to a team that Andy would have laughed most with in attempting to finish the whole 6 hours at Snetterton today. Along with the Trophy there is a £500 cheque to be spent at Andys business - FWR Racing - the business he recently started with Dave Black supplying bikes and bits mainly to Racers.






