"SAINTS" versus POOLE

Good Evening Ladies & Gentlemen

What a story lay behind the arrival of Bjorn Knutsson before last week's match with Wimbledon.

As soon as we knew that Geoff Mardon was going to be out of action for a time, we realised that unless Southampton could get an immediate replacement of the top class, our chances in the match would be virtually nil-but more important we needed the strength for the next round of the National Trophy.

Knutsson was the first name which sprang to mind, especially as he has been granted permission to sign for Bristol next season, and would be wanting all the racing he could get on English tracks. Having made up our minds to seek him out, the next question was-where in Sweden do we find him? A telephone call was put in to Gothenburg Stadium, where Bjorn had ridden in the World Championship, and the good folk at that track went to a lot of trouble to find out just where we could get in touch with him.

More telephone calls to Sweden (at 16/- a time) and finally, being unable to get him on the line, a telegram achieved the desired result.

While all this was going on, we had to be in constant touch with both the Speedway Riders Association and the Speedway Control Board, who were both most helpful and agreed that Bjorn could sign for the Saints during the absence of Geoff Mardon. Finally on the Monday morning came a telegram from Bjorn which read "Arriving London Airport 21/7, Flight 511, 13.15." As the telegram did not reach us until almost ten o'clock, we had about three hours to get organised and get to London. In the meantime, Bjorn's Work Permit had failed to arrive at the Stadium, and without this he would be unable to pass the Immigration Authorities. I had to pay a rush visit to the G. P. O. (Southampton) where they were all most helpful in sorting through all the morning's mail-but without success. This meant another call to Major Fearnley, who arranged for a duplicate copy to be sent direct to the Airport. At twenty minutes to eleven, Chum Taylor and Jack Knott set out in a hurry for London, arriving at the airport at ten minutes to one. There they had to check up that the duplicate papers were in the hands of the right authorities (which they were) and a few minutes later Bjorn's plane came gliding in. Customs formalities were simple. Bjorn had two little bags only, one containing his boots and leathers and the other his pyjamas. Bert Croucher had guessed that he would not have had time to get his bike transported and had been hard at it building up another machine. Arriving at Southampton at four o'clock, Bjorn got straight into his leathers for a few practice laps—and that's the story.

Or nearly all of it, for Bjorn was under an obligation to ride in Stockholm last Sunday, and on Friday he was off by plane to Sweden, returning again yesterday.

The total cost of this little venture will be in the region of £150, and whilst present "gates" at speedway hardly justify this kind of spending, I am as determined as ever to keep speedway in Southampton, and to keep giving you all the best that effort and money can produce.

Given any sort of break this season, we should have had a winning team now, but to use a golfing term; we cannot seem to get the "rub of the greens". We have had Brian Crutcher out for a time, Brian Hanham injured for about six weeks, and now Geoff Mardon whors de combat". The fact still remains, however, that we have enjoyed some wonderful racing on our Tuesday nights-and dont forget that we are still very interested in the National Trophy and the World Championship, and we have plenty of excitement ahead of us.

The most recent piece of great news was, of course, that Southampton is to get an official Test Match. This is scheduled for September 8th, and will be the first in the series of three England v Australasia matches. The Saints will have every chance of getting representative honours for two or three riders, on one side or the other. We shall be getting full details of the Tests within a short time, when all details will be given in this programme.

The immediate concern, however, is the National Trophy, and the general feeling in the camp is that we have a very good chance of getting through to the semi-finals. That is not to suggest that we think Norwich is an easy task. Far from it, for any side with a rider of the class of Fundin in it immediately becomes a big obstacle. There will be some hard riding, and no doubt some equally high excitement, but we have a sneaking feeling that we may just be able to edge them out on aggregate. Anyway, we shall see but you can take it from me that all the boys will be trying

their hearts out to get through.

After the Trophy it's back in the thick of the World Championship. The semi-finals will be upon us and there will be some hectic racing as the thirty-two boys left in go for those last ten places. Each rider will ride at two meetings (there are four semi-finals) but as the draw for tracks did not take place until this morning we will have to give you the information over the P/A tonight. We will naturally be hoping that the Saints qualifiers will be in action at home with a very special wish that Geoff will recover in time to take the place that he so well deserves.

Anyway, back to the matter of the moment, and tonight it's another battle with our local rivals from Poole. This team, unspectacular at the start of the season has slowly and unobtrusively run into great form. They are now lying third in the League, and in the last few weeks have been "scalping" all and sundry-including a great win over Wimbledon. Their Reserve team, too, is going great guns, and is so far unbeaten. We extend them a really warm Southampton welcome-and look forward to another grand evening's

racing.

By the way, after that Wimbledon defeat last Tuesday, we are going to challenge them to a return later in the season, when the Saints are at full strength. So that's one more great fixture to add to the season.

Geoff is now home again, and, apart from the fact that he is still wired up, is as lively as ever. The swelling and bruising on his face has almost


disappeared, and the broken jaw appears to be knitting well.
