COMMENTS ON THE VISITING TEAM.....Mike Bashford

Today, on the Sidcup Club's Canada Heights circuit, a four-man British Team meets a Swedish quartette in the first of this winter's BBC-TV Grandstand international matches. In a four-match series, in which later opposition will also probably include Czechoslovakia, Belgium and East Germany, today's clash promises to be Britain's toughest test.

To judge the extent of the challenge, two members of today's Swedish Team have, between them, won six 250 and 500cc World and European Championships since 1959. And the last three Trophée des Nations - the 250cc World Team Championship - have all been won by Sweden.

Their full team - equally mounted, like the home foursome, on 250 and 500cc machines - is Rolf Tibblin (360 C.Z.), Jan Johansson (360 Lindstrom), Torsten Hallman and Olle Pettersson (both on 250 Husqvarnas). At the time of writing, the British team is unannounced. Two races decide the final result, finishers scoring points according to position in each race and the winning team being the one with the lowest aggregate.

In world-ranking, Torsten Hallman is the Swedish team leader. The only man to win three World Championships - he won the 250cc title in 1962, 1963 and again this year, all on works Husqvarnas - he is 25 years old and comes from Uppsala. Only last month, at Brands Hatch, he led his country to a crushing victory in the Trophée des Nations.

His Husqvarna team-mate, Olle Pettersson, became this year's 250cc Swedish Champion last month and he scored his first GP victory in Finland earlier in the year. Sixth in the 1966 250cc World Championship, he is a 29 year-old office worker from Strangnas, outside Stockholm.

The most experienced of the quartette is 29 year-old Rolf Tibblin, from Stockholm. Rolf, who has just recovered from a knee operation, won the 250cc European Championship in 1959 and the 500cc World Title in 1962 and '63. Since 1965, he has been racing a works CZ and this year finished runner-up in the 500cc World Championship.

Jan Johansson, 24, is the youngest man of the team. Although he rides for Lindstrom, Sweden's newest motorcycle factory, he works as a mechanic in the truck division of Husqvarna. His successes this year include the 500cc Swedish Championship and victory in the Swedish 500 GP.

This is the first Swedish-Britain meeting in the two-year BBC TV international series. Last October, Britain trounced Russia at Canada Heights. But can our home men retain an unbeaten record here.?
