



Today you will see 40 riders from between 16 and 21 years old, riding Supersports 400 machines, attempting to make it into the big time. The Motor Cycle News Superteen Championship is designed to find the best young talent Britain can offer, and enable that talent to be developed into big and better things.

But it may not be the overall winner from where the future world champion will come from. Superteen in its first year, combines riders who have never raced before, to novice licence holders, restricted licence holders, and some national licence holders too. But whereas the likes of Jason Vincent and James Haydon may outclass the rest of the field with their National racing experience at Supercup level, it may be that one of the 11 novice riders racing today is the rider who will eventually reap the benefits of what Superteen is all about.

You will easily identify the Novice riders. They will be wearing the ACU red novice jacket. Keep a watch out for the 1st ever winner of the Novice Trophy today and make a note of his name for the future.

Superteen is so designed that every one of riders out there today deserves to be watched.

To encourage a smart turn out of Superteen competitors, Two Four Sports will present an Award of £50 to the Best Turned Out Team at each round. The Award will be judged by the representative of the promoter nominated by the Motorcycle Race Pro-

moters Committee at each round, and is designed to ensure each team is encouraged to maintain a smart promotable image and good standard.

Special training and advice is given to the Superteen riders. The novice riders here today were given a special training session at the Cadwell Park Bike School on June 13 under the expert guidance of Ron Haslam. All the Superteen riders were invited to Thruxton yesterday afternoon (Saturday) when Ron Haslam and Trevor Nation were due to walk them round the whole of Thruxton, pointing out the features and characteristics of the circuit. It is intended to repeat the same exercise at forthcoming rounds.

Brian Kreisky's MVP television company will be filming each of the rounds for broadcasting on satellite television.

There is extensive prize money on offer in each round: 1st £500, 2nd £300, 3rd £250, 4th £200, 5th £150, 6th £100, 7th £75, 8th £50, 9th £25, 10th £15.

In addition, the Novice riders will have their own incentive of £30, £20 and £10 to the first three novice finishers in each round. The race winner and the Novice winner receive nice crystal trophies and Moet champagne.

ACU Technical scrutineer Alan Verity has been appointed to oversee the technical side of the championship.

Motor Cycle News and the Motorcycle Race Promoters Committee will make the Superteen Championship an overwhelming success. It is not a one year wonder. It is a long term plan, encouraging novice young riders to start in motorcycle racing with proper training and expert guidance and being able to take the most talented youngsters into European and World Championship motorcycle racing.
