






## Main chance

Shane Byrne has a healthy advantage, in all respects, going into the second half of the 'Main Season' of the MCE Insurance British Superbike Championship here at Thruxton, but he cannot take anything for granted as the challenges around him are growing

yuichi Kiyonari is coming on strong, looking revitalised and back to his old confident self, following his decision to switch to the Buildbase BMW team. He has claimed a win apiece in the last two race weekends, to re-ignite thoughts of the 'War for Four' as he and Byrne chase what would be an unprecedented fourth British crown.


In this sixth round, both remain focussed on the charge for points towards securing a place in the all-important top six who qualify for the 'Showdown' sequence of races that decides the outcome of the country's premier crown. The cut-off point for that is after Donington Park next month, and that will be concentrating the minds of everyone.

Rapid Solicitors Kawasaki rider Byrne is looking good to

It is all about consistency and Byrne, who missed out on taking that fourth title last season in a dramatic final round at his home circuit of Brands Hatch, is fully focussed on the job in hand, with the fulsome support of the Paul Bird Motorsport team in his efforts. He has

rewarded them with a string of top results . . . in fact his only non-podium finish came last time out in an incident-packed affair at the Kent circuit.

The race was stopped twice, once by the spectacular crash of James Ellison, who took a battering after his Lloyds British GBmoto Kawasaki ran off track, onto the grass, and

then cart-wheeled, actually bashing into Byrne and narrowly missing several other riders. Byrne momentarily had his fingers trapped against a lever, but held on. Then thunder, lightning and rain halted the re-start, which prompted a third attempt to settle the race, by now declared wet; it produced a first win for

the top of his right femur, requiring surgery the day after the incident. A team statement said: "Currently, we have no confirmation on how long he will be out of action for and we'll not be pushing for him to return until he is fully fit and ready to do so."

Ellison's absence is a big loss for this weekend's Thruxton crowd, as the Cumbrian has been involved in some terrific front-running duels, and everyone wishes

him a speedy recovery. You can certainly expect Brookes to come out fighting here, however. Riding for Milwaukee Yamaha, he is having an uncharacteristically difficult time. His season began on a downer, literally, with several crashes in the opener on the Brands Hatch Indy circuit, but the Aussie bounced back strongly in the second race of the meeting to run second to Byrne and show the form that has

taken him to the edge of title success in earlier seasons.

Next time out at Oulton Park, he ran Byrne close in the opener, and then turned the tables on him to win the second race. He finished second in the first race at Snetterton, then had more problems in the second, followed by two fourth places at Knockhill, before an unhappy outing at Brands Hatch two weeks ago.

After two crashes in qualifying, then sixth and eighth places in the two races, Brookes was left bemused by his form: "I am not sure why it was difficult. The thing that troubles me the most is that I went faster on Friday than I have done the rest of the weekend. In second practice I did a lot of good times, consistently. The rest of the weekend I was not able to get close to those times and I even crashed in

qualifying trying. We had an off weekend, of course you would like to be perfect at every event, but for some reason I didn't have a good feeling for the bike after the crash."

The problems for Ellison and Brookes have enabled Kiyonari to catch up. The Japanese rider had surprised

everyone during the close season with his decision to switch to BMW, the first time in his career that he had ridden anything other than a Honda. And he promised his British fans that his return would be to set the record straight after his tough final year in the series with the Honda team.

Kiyonari has settled in well with Stuart Hicken's team and, although he started the campaign steadily, he hit the top spot at Knockhill, a circuit that had been good to him in his previous glory years. That was the case again this time round, as he ended a three-year spell without a victory by hunting down ~ and beating ~ Byrne. And he came close to an action replay next time out. That form continued onto the Brands

Hatch Grand Prix circuit, where Kiyonari again headed off Byrne to make it two wins in three races... but this time there was no repeat, as the weather intervened and he pulled off.

He still has some way to go to seal a place in the

'Showdown', however, and that is also the case for Yeovil's Tommy Bridewell aboard the second Milwaukee Yamaha; he has been consistently in the points, though with only one podium credit so far, for third place at Snetterton.

Chris Walker, four times the runner-up in the chase for the



crown, continues to have the speed, plus the all-important experience, to challenge at the sharp end of the pack. He cannot be ruled out of the equation for what would be a long overdue victory aboard his Lloyds British GBmoto Kawasaki, having gone close a couple of times so far, including a fine second place at the Brands Hatch opener. That keeps him just

ahead of Dan Linfoot in the points table, though the Quattro Plant Kawasaki rider has the distinction of being the only rider apart from Byrne to have scored in every race so far.

Illustrating that nothing is totally predictable, Aussie rider Waters, like Brookes returning to Thruxton after riding in the Suzuki Eight Hours, enjoyed his first-ever victory in the series in the wet of Brands Hatch a couple of weeks ago. Waters took charge off the race and won with ease, much to his



delight: "I'm absolutely over the moon to have got my first BSB win and to have done it with Tyco Suzuki is just amazing. The team have shown great faith in me and, although it was unexpected, I felt great on the bike in that race. I did think to myself, 'they are going to catch me' but I rode a pretty solid race and the GSX-R1000 was faultless."

Can Waters repeat that here? And what about former Superstock Champions Richard Cooper and Keith Farmer, who finished second and third behind Waters at Brands Hatch, each claiming his best MCE BSB result, aboard Anvil Hire TAG Racing and PR Racing Kawasakis respectively. They showed the depth of talent that exists in the current championship field . . . and there are others yet to make their mark this term.




Among them is former MotoGP rider John Hopkins, who lost out by the narrowest of margins to Tommy Hill in the title scrap three years ago, but who is yet to re-kindle that form aboard his Tyco Suzuki. Peter Hickman, the fastest newcomer at the Isle of Man TT, is settling well into the RAF Reserves Honda team and should be pushing on here, as should Jon Kirkham on the Halsall Bike Gear Kawasaki.

There are intriguing battles to be fought and won throughout the pack at the fastest circuit that the championship visits . . . but it

would be a brave man to bet against Byrne having a big say in their outcome.

## The class of 2014

he build-up to the 2014 season witnessed the biggest shake-up of teams and rider combinations in years, yet the strength in depth is as impressive as ever ~ triple champions Shane Byrne and Ryuichi Kiyonari, with a total of more than 100 race wins between them, are both eager to claim that elusive record-breaking fourth title and 'Shakey' has already made an excellent start.


But they are not the whole story. Seven more former race-winners were in the line-up at the start of the season, including California's John Hopkins, who lost out to Tommy Hill by just 6/1000ths of a second in the final race of 2011, the closest MCE BSB title race in history, and Aussie Josh Brookes, twice the runner-up in the last four years.

Former winners Stuart Easton, James Ellison and a resurgent Chris Walker have already visited the podium this

year, while double Aussie Champion Josh Waters claimed his first MCE BSB win at Brands Hatch two weeks ago, with former Superstock Champions Richard Cooper and Keith Farmer joining him in their first podium finishes.

In an encouraging contrast that bodes well for the future of MCE BSB, Michael Rutter, the most experienced racer in the Championship's history, with 426 races to his credit, is in action again, while 17-year-old Harry Hartley became the youngest rider ever to score Championship points in the season-opener at Brands Hatch.

## Eleven-point turn

xpect some of the most intense action of the weekend to come in the two Motorpoint British Supersport Championship races, as a keen three-rider scrap for supremacy is unfolding. Billy McConnell, former title winner Alastair Seeley and Graeme Gowland are all set to continue their closely-fought, at times frantic, dice for the crown.

Just 11 points cover them as they prepare for this

weekend's pair of races ~ the Saturday afternoon Sprint and the longer Feature race on Sunday ~ and, spicing it up even more, McConnell and Gowland are Smiths Triumph team-mates and both are gunning for glory. Seeley rides a Yamaha prepared by last year's title-winning MarTrain team.

While they head the standings, however, it is by no means a foregone conclusion that they will be the only riders running at the sharp end of the action. Glenn Irwin won the seasonal opener for Gearlink Kawasaki at Brands Hatch, then Luke Mossey stole the glory at Knockhill on the Techcare Profile Triumph. While neither Luke Stapleford, riding the Profile Triumph, nor Luke Jones on the Acumen Industrial Services Triumph have made the top step of the podium so far, they have been at the heart of the action and well placed to challenge.

McConnell lost ground in the last round, taking a costly tumble at Brands Hatch two weeks ago, which saw his rivals slash his advantage in the standings. Up until that problem, at Druids, the Aussie, so close to the title in previous seasons had been a model of consistency, with the highlight of his

term so far being a winning double at Oulton Park followed by a hat-trick of seconds, starting at Snetterton and continuing into Knockhill.

He blamed himself for his demise at Brands Hatch, "I went into Druids 1kph slower than the previous lap but trailed the front brake for a bit longer and down I went. Then, for the second race, I didn't feel good with the front end and while I could run a decent pace on my own, when I was in among







other riders, I couldn't. I got a finish and I kept my championship lead," added McConnell, as he put a brave face on his weekend activities in Kent.

Seeley pounced on that error to make up for a couple of tumbles of his own earlier in the season that had

produced a mixed bag of results with a race win, podiums and DNFs; a winning double on the Kent Grand Prix circuit, however, put him back on course to regain the crown. The Ulsterman put his successes there down to the team, which

had tested extensively ahead of the meeting.

"The bike was faultless all weekend, so thanks to the team for taking me testing to iron out a few little problems, which has really given me great confidence in the package again," said Seeley. "A double win is always pretty special, but to have pulled 40 points back on Billy and moved up to second in the championship means I'm now really looking forward to getting out at Thruxton for more."

Like Seeley, Gowland is having something of a roller-coaster campaign, but has been on the podium in each of the races that he has finished. A




Others to keep an eye on include Jake Dixon, putting together some good performances on the



n essence this is a case of two for one, as the Motul British Motostar Championship continues with two categories and two titles at stake, as riders compete aboard either four-stroke 250cc Moto3 or two-stroke 125GP machines. Jordan Weaving and Edward Rendell are the respective leaders at the moment, both models of consistency.

South African Weaving has not finished outside the top two so far, with a pair of victories and three second-place finishes aboard his Jordan/Burkert KTM. Nothing, however, has been easy for him, as Joe Irving (Redline KTM) has been



at Oulton Park with a stylish victory over Taz Taylor (FPW/Hookless Holidays Honda). Second at Snetterton, Rendell was back out front at Knockhill at the expense of Arnie Shelton (e3Motorsport Honda) to take his second victory of the season.

In between his two victories, it was Bradley Ray who took the glory in

a constant problem, winning twice, and rueing a costly no-pointer at Oulton Park, which leaves him second in the standings.




youngster Olly Simpson (KTM) did last time out at Brands Hatch, as he enjoyed his maiden race win in the series . . . and that could be just the start of things to come.

James Hobson has run consistently on the Two4 Motorsport/RS Honda to stay ahead of Chris Taylor and Sam Burman in the standings, while Ernst Dubbink has fleetingly shown the potential of his Honda. Charlie Nesbitt, racing for Repli-Cast, Mike Brouwers, Chris Taylor and Joe Thompson should also be in the reckoning.

In the 125GP category, Rendell (Banks Racing Honda) is the form rider. Like Weaving, he has not finished off the podium so far, though his third place last time out at Brands Hatch leaves him four points down on the South African in the combined standings.

Rendell's campaign began with a second place on the Kent Indy circuit as Ryan Saxelby took the maximum points haul, but the Banks rider took over at the front next time out







times finished runner-up to him and could turn the tables here by using the slip-streaming battles to good effect . . . although it could well be that BMW power will be the telling factor.

Lee Jackson, winner of the Superstock 600 crown, is coming on strong aboard the Buildbase BMW, gaining experience and using it to good effect; he is third in the standings, with his last two race results, second and then third, boosting his confidence. He is a battler, which was underlined at Brands Hatch where he took the fight to Buchan, briefly nosing ahead . . . and that is a sign of things to come from the Lincolnshire lad, who enjoyed his Superbike debut at the Kent circuit.

## Target practice

anny Buchan powers into this sixth round of the Pirelli National Superstock 1000 Championship with a target on his back. The Tsingtao WK Kawasaki rider is the man to beat but, as his rivals will tell you, that is easier said that done.

Buchan has won four of the five races so far and, in the one in which he did not triumph, at Snetterton, he finished second as defending champion Hudson Kennaugh got the better of him. That showed that Buchan can be beaten . . . and he was given a real run for his money last time out at Brands Hatch. too, when Honda's Jason O'Halloran chased him down, to cross the line just a 10th of a second down.

It was close, but Buchan was delighted, as he had at last conquered the Kent circuit, as he explained: "I've never really got on with the GP track, even though it's my favourite circuit. The goal was to go there and take away as many points as I could, so to take the win is immense for me.

"The ZX10R was superb throughout the race, even though I thought we might struggle in the heat and, ves, I got it a bit sideways on the final turn, but I held on for the win."

That was almost understatement ~ the bike snaked wildly and looked all set to pitch Buchan over the top, but he held on

> to take the win and is now focussing on more of the same here. Aussie O'Halloran has three

He will be at the sharp end here, which is also key to Kennaugh's plan as he lines up on his Linxcel Trik Moto BMW. having run a close fourth last time out, which boosted him after his demise at Knockhill. The former South African Superbike Champion has a fight on his hands to retain the 'Number 1' plate, but you can be assured he will be giving it everything.

Nothing will come easy, however. Filip Backlund (SMT Kawasaki), the only rider other than young Jackson to rack up points in every round, will be on the mark, while others to have visited the podium include Josh Elliott (GA/Homer Racing Kawasaki) and PR Racing's David Johnson. Watch out, too, for
















# Leadership wins in the last three races, Kyle Ryde is taking the challenge for the Pirelli National Superstock

for the Pirelli National Superstock 600 Championship to series leader Andy Reid, whose impressive form so far this term has won him a two-year deal to race on with Shaun Muir's team, which was confirmed at Brands Hatch two weeks ago.

Riding in FFX Yamaha colours, Reid had made a steady start to the campaign, running fourth on the Brands Hatch Indy circuit back in April, as James Lodge (Moto-Breakers Kawasaki)

took the opening round glory ahead of Mason Law, with Joe Collier third.

Next time out, it was Reid who hogged the limelight with his first success in national action, as he headed off the determined Collier aboard the Be Wiser Kawasaki. The Newtownabbev rider then took centre stage at the World Superbike-supporting round on the Donington Park Grand Prix circuit, with Lodge second and young Joe Francis third.

Reid posted his third victory in the Scottish round at Knockhill, when Tarran Mackenzie enjoyed his best result to date. finishing second on the Team WD-40 Kawasaki at a circuit where his proud dad Niall, three-time BSB Champion and Grand Prix legend, had cut his racing teeth.

The man of the moment, Reid has had his immediate future secured by Muir's decision to sign him, the boss of the BSB Milwaukee Yamaha team explaining: "I have been very impressed with Andy since we started working with him and he has continued to prove that he is a very talented rider. I have been watching him closely and

he has the potential to be a star of the future ~ he is a young rider with lots of ambition and we are happy to confirm that we will continue working with him for the next two seasons.

While the future looks very bright for Reid, he first has to focus on the immediate job in hand and that is to seal this title . . . and that will not be particularly easy as Ryde (PacedayZ Trackdays Yamaha) means business, as he has proved with winning rides at Snetterton, then last time out on the Brands Hatch Grand Prix circuit. Like Lodge, Ryde is

> a former winner of the British 125GP crown, and more silverware on his pedigree will help boost his highly-promising career.

Collier is currently third in the standings, but well placed to challenge and, like the two riders above him, is having a consistent time, apart from a mid-pack struggle on his local Donington Park circuit. Otherwise, he has taken four podium finishes, two of them second places. His team-mate Nick Anderson is a gathering force, while Spain's Aleix Aulestia is getting to grips with the often frenetic action this championship can usually be counted on to provide ~ both are in the top 10, although have not yet made it on to the podium.

Andrew Irwin (Be Wiser Kawasaki) showed well last time out, finishing third, on the back of a fifth place in the previous Scottish round, to draw level on points with Law; since his second place in the opener, Law's only points finishes have been third at Snetterton, then just one point for 15th last time out. At the halfway

point of the season, he needs consistency . . . but then that is the key word for them all.

## None but the brave




t would be a brave man to bet against Sean Hegarty and James Neave taking the Eastern Airways British Sidecar crown. So far, they have taken just about everything before them, winning all but one of their nine races . . . but nothing is ever certain in racing, and that is what is driving Roger Lovelock and Aki Alto on in their quest to put one over the Suffolk outfit.

Lovelock, who took the crown a couple of years ago, is the only driver so far to have got the better of Suzuki-powered Hegarty and that lone success came in the middle race of three in the opening round on the Brands Hatch Indy circuit. Since then, Lovelock and his BMW-powered outfit have not been off the podium, five times second and once third. It is this



consistent run of form that keeps him and Alto in contention and ready to pounce should the rampant Hegarty hit problems.

While that gives a reflection of the current form book, Hegarty is relishing the opportunity to add to his score here on this high-speed Hampshire circuit, but he has great respect for Lovelock having raced him for a number of years and knows that, if anyone can do anything to beat him, then the former champion is the man.



Craig Chaplow, who has Isle of Man TT winner Patrick Farrance in the chair, has been a strong top six runner across the season and is aiming higher, while a little more consistency from Tony Brown and Ashley Hawes could have hoisted them up the standings ~ three of their



five points-scoring finishes have been third places.

Ben Holland and Lee Watson started their season well, with three good rides at Brands Hatch, including a third place, but have not been able to replicate those results subsequently. Even so, they have been among the top dozen runners in most races, as have Stephen Kershaw and Rob Wilson whose best result, fifth, came last time out on the Brands Hatch Grand Prix circuit.

That was also the case for Ricky Stevens and Ryan Charlwood, who finished third in the first race two weeks ago, their best of the season. They will be gunning for more of the same here, and in common with the rest of the grid will be giving everything to try to reel in the runaway series leaders Hegarty and Neave . . . tall order that it might be!


## Close encounters



nth Freddy Pett and Phil Atkinson have come close to winning this one-make title in the past . . . and are determined to go one better this year. Pett currently has the advantage over Atkinson as they battle to be crowned TriStar R & G Triple Challenge Champion.

It is proving to be an exciting series, with four different

winners in the opening four races. Pett set the benchmark with victory on the Brands Hatch Indy circuit in the first of 10 races so far run, but was held back in second place by Atkinson, then Sam Cox as they battled through to leave Kent with honours pretty well even after the opening triple-header weekend.



The World Superbike supporting round at Donington Park provided more challenges, as the action took to the Leicestershire Grand Prix circuit. Pett was soon at home. clocking up his third victory but Atkinson was not too far adrift, nor was the fast-emerging Scott Pitchers in third. Pett went from hero to zero in the second race, however, not troubling the scorers, while another second place meant it was Atkinson who gained most, although Cox was elated to take his second win of the season.

Snetterton hosted the fourth round of the series, and with it a second triple-header challenge to fully test the riders across the weekend. Top scorer was Pitchers, with third place followed by a winning double that moved him into third in

Adding to the action keep an eye on Jesse Jones and Sam Middlemas, both of whom have been





As regular visitors will know, the circuit is 2.356 miles long (3.793km) and you can elect to run, jog, walk, or even just toddle around it. Thruxton is known as the fastest circuit in the UK that features regularly in the calendars of the country's premier series on two and four wheels, MCE BSB and the Dunlop MSA British Touring Car Championship. It is a circuit that favours the brave and creates some superbly close action in both disciplines . . with Superbikes currently the faster of the two.

MCE BSB lap record-holder here is Gregorio Lavilla, who clocked a time of 1m 14.890s ~ average speed 113.25mph/182.26kmh ~ on his Airwaves Ducati in the second race back in April 2006. His team-mate Leon Haslam had gone more than a quarter-second quicker on his way to pole position, but lap records, of course, are set only under racing conditions.

The current BTCC lap record is just over three seconds slower, at 1:17.949 (108.81mph/175.11kmh); it was set in the very first race of the S2000 era of BTCC regulations by James Thompson in a Vauxhall Astra Coupe, although he went more than 1sec quicker in qualifying (1:16.747).

Unfortunately, a direct speed trap comparison for these two laps is not available for the fastest stretch out the back of the circuit, where Superbikes are regularly clocked exceeding 150mph, but the start-line speed trap shows more 130mph for Superbikes, compared with just over the ton for cars. That said, speeds approaching 170mph were claimed for the dominant Ford Sierra RS Cosworths of the 1980s!

The fastest BTCC lap of Thruxton was set towards the end of the Supertouring era by Jason Plato, still a front-runner in the series, with a record 82 wins to his credit since 1997. In 2000, he was driving a works Vauxhall Vectra, in which he lapped Thruxton, which had recently been resurfaced, in 1:13.272s (115.75mph/186.28kmh)



At 17 years of age, Harry Hartley became the youngest-ever points-scorer in MCE BSB earlier this year while, in the BTCC, the honour of being the youngest competitor is held by

Aiden Moffat, who turns 18 in September. And that small piece of research then produced the following useless statistic of the day: the average age of the MCE BSB grid is 31.1 years (the oldest being Michael Rutter at 42), compared with the BTCC grid at 34.2 (the oldest being double Champion Alain Menu at 50). Not a lot of people know that!


