# THE STARS COME TO HALSTEAD by LESLIE NICHOL

## Motor Cycling Reporter of the DAILY EXPRESS

"He is a brilliant rider, dedicated to moto-cross, and a worthy successor to my title." The speaker is 32 year-old Jeff Smith, Britain's former 500 c.c. World Moto-Cross champion, summing up the many attributes of the man who, this season, captured his crown, 26 year-old Paul Friedrichs of East Germany.

Today, over the Halstead Club's extended Little Loveney course. these two perfectionists hope to be leading an array of riders in the Daily Express International Moto-Cross meeting.

Charing a world title through a season of moto-cross in 14 countries is an exacting sporting exercise.

Soch Smith and Friedrichs are recovering from injuries. Both are detoctomed to renew their friendly rivalry against more than 50 of the finest makeys in the sport.

Their opponents take in such cheer-raisers as local hero Dave Blokers of Ipswich, riding 250 e.c. and 360 c.c. Czech C.Z. machines.

Bickers' target this season is to win both British titles. He is currently leading the "500" struggle and second to Freddie Mayes, of Greeves, in the "250" chase.

Note, too, the renowned scrambling brothers Don and Derek Rickman astride their highly successful "500" Metisses, designed, developed and built at their progressive little headquarters in Hampshire.

Younger brother Don provided one of the feature wins of the world championship series when he powered his home-built, Triumph-powered Metisse to victory in the British round at Farleigh Castle.

We aimed at luring the best scrambling skill available to this international meeting, which meant the home-based brothers, A. R. "Sid" and Arthur Lampkin of B.S.A. were a "must."

Arthur hammered the stars with his brilliant success in the Belgium "500" Grand Prix at Namur, It was his first continental classic of the year, his first "500" grand prix win-and he shattered a line-up that included Friedrichs.

From overseas comes the Belgium 500 c.c. champion Roger De Coster and his fellow countryman Sylvain Gebors; Sweden's Olle Pettersson and Frits Selling of Holland.

But, back to the victor and the vanquished, Smith and Friedrichs. Jeff has scrapped his plans of retiring next season and aims to recapture the crown he has held for the past two years.

Today he will be riding the newly developed 490 c.c. ultra-lightweight B.S.A. Friedrichs mounts a 360 c.c. two-stroke C.Z.

This will be the first time they have clashed since Friedrichs became the new champion. It could be a pointer to the next season's struggle

Each overseas rider will be presented with a bronze trophy to mark his appearance in the first Daily Express International Moto-Cross meeting held at Halstead


