

# INTERNATIONAL 250cc MOTO-CROSS GRAND PRIX

The entry for today's British Grand Prix—the eighth meeting of 12 counting towards the 1967 world 250cc moto-cross championship—is, without doubt, the best of this year's series. Credit for getting together such a remarkable line-up is entirely due to the efforts of the organisers, the Halstead and District MC and LC Club. It is no mean achievement on their part to have signed so many of the world's leading 250cc championship contenders and by bringing the Russians to Britain they have notched yet another notable "first."

How will the Russians fare today against their traditional moto-cross "enemies" from Czechoslovakia, Sweden and, in particular, Belgium's fiery ex-world champion Joel Robert? The answer, I am sure, will provide us with some of the finest scrambling ever seen in Britain. Some of us have been fortunate in having seen Victor Arbekov, Russia's No. 1 rider, in action. Quite simply, he is one of the all-time "greats" of the sport. An Army man and a Soviet Master of Sport, he is—as you would expect—completely dedicated to scrambling. Equally enthusiastic are his colleagues Leo Shinkarenko—a much-improved rider beginning to figure more prominently in world events—and Andrei Dezhinov and Alex Yakovlev, both of whom have been around the circuits for several years and are highly experienced moto-cross men.

The main thing the Russians and Czechs have in common is their close links with the Czechoslovakian state-owned CZ factory. In fact, with Joel Robert topping the factory's long list of signed riders, today's CZ entry is the biggest turn-out not only in Britain, but anywhere outside the Iron Curtain bloc. It also sets the scene for a head-on clash between the CZ camp and world title-winning Swedish Husqvarna concern. The Swedes, led by reigning champion Torsten Hallman, all ride these beautifully prepared machines and, not unnaturally, they have the backing of both Finns and Danes.

Many British riders have been forced to go "foreign" in recent years to match the challenge of overseas entrants. Several have chosen Husqvarnas, notably Alan Clough, the Manchester engineer who for many years rode British Greeves, and the West Country's Badger Goss. Sadly, British machines are now a minority in world events, but it is some consolation that those who have stayed with the home factories, are still among the best riders in the world. Freddie Mayes, the dashing young East Anglian, is striving to bring the new Norton-Villiers to world pitch, and Greeves—today on home ground and only a short gallop away across the county—are strongly represented by some of the most promising youngsters in the country in Brian Wade, John Pease and Vic Allan. And the Dutchman, Fritz Selling, one of the family of importers from Amsterdam who worked for a while at the Thundersley workshops, has always been a popular performer here and will surely get a special welcome from the crowd.

Moving more and more into the Grand Prix scene are the Spanish Bultacos and Montesa machines. They are now very serious challengers for lightweight markets all over the world and although only two of each of these marques are on show today, it is a fair bet that they will do well. Just as certain is the fact that every other competitor in the big race has given some thought to the combination of one of Britain's greatest riders, Don Rickman, and the Bultaco he will take to the start line. This machine with a five-speed gearbox, has all the equipment of a winner. Don has ridden—and beaten—world contenders in every class on circuits all over the world. There is no more experienced rider on the line and the combination of Rickman and the Bultaco could well put the New Milton, Hampshire frame-builder, at the top of the leaderboard.

The situation in the world series after last month's Italian Grand Prix is that Sweden's Torsten Hallman, holds a slender points lead (36-32) over Joel Robert. Third placed is another Swede, Olle Pettersson (24) and the Russian Victor Arbekov is next on 19. British riders are a long way behind with Alan Clough joint tenth with only 3 points from the seven meetings held to date. A win by Clough could take him up to fifth place with an outside chance of winning the title.

But whatever the outcome of today's meeting, you can be sure of a detailed report and full results in tomorrow's Sun. And, as usual, there will be the results of all the important motor-cycle meetings in your area.

In all Grands Prix points are awarded in each of the two races—1 point for the first 2 points for the second, 3 points for the third, etc. The points gained in each race will be totalled and the winner of the Grand Prix will be the rider with the smallest number of points. In the event of two or more riders having the same total of points, then the rider who has completed the most laps will be adjudged the winner. Should there still be a tie the rider who had made the best time will be adjudged the winner. The winner on "overall classification" scores 8 Championship points, second - 6 points, third - 4 points, fourth - 3 points, fifth - 2 points and sixth - 1 point.






